t the age of 25, Frescobaldi was appointed organist of St. 's at Rome. He was so famous by this time that 30,000 e are said to have attended his first performance. First Essay for Orchestra, Op. 12

Samuel Barber

Samuel Barber, born in 1910, educated at the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia, won a Prix de Rome in 1935 and the Pulitzer Prize for Music in both 1935 and 1936. The First Essay, composed and first performed in 1938, was programmed by the Philadelphia Orchestra and the NBC Symphony under Arturo Toscanini.

The use of the word "essay" as a title conjures up the literary form in which ideas are developed concisely within an intimate framework. This work is the part of the link of contemporary Romanticism with that of the past century. Barber is among the musicians who have adhered to the principle of tonality although his approach is uniquely his own. As one of the very few composers trained as a singer, his music is essentially lyrical.
