These set of works are an arrangement of forms. I am interested in making a simplified version of my subject by limiting the amount of information that is present while still suggesting a space. My subject matter began as a pile of dirty clothes that were lying on my bathroom floor. I first noticed the contrast between the organic clumps of fabric against the vertical lines of the white panel wall. I then realized that this subject matter was much deeper and said a lot about my domestic life as a mother, a daughter, a sister, a girlfriend and a student. These mundane objects turned into complex forms that could be used to describe an average person's life, my life. I have created in my work a catalog of forms that began as clothes that I am able to manipulate and arrange in a variety of ways to represent all of the parts of my life. A short list of some of the ideas that I see them representing are work, play, relationships, laziness, frustration, motherhood, change and love. I present them in an abstracted way because I don't want to show the pile of clothes but rather, use this subject matter as a way of creating art and reflect upon what it represents in life.

ARTIST STATEMENT

THESE SET OF WORKS ARE AN ARRANGEMENT OF FORMS, I AM INTERESTED IN MAKING A SIMPLIFIED VERSION OF MY SUBJECT BY LIMITING THE AMOUNT OF INFORMATION THAT IS PRESENT WHILE STILL SUGGESTING A SPACE. MY SUBJECT MATTER BEGAN AS A PILE OF DIRTY CLOTHES THAT WERE LYING ON MY BATHROOM FLOOR. I FIRST NOTICED THE CONTRAST BETWEEN THE ORGANIC CLUMPS OF FABRIC AGAINST THE VERTICAL LINES OF THE WHITE PANEL WALL. I THEN REALIZED THAT THIS SUBJECT MATTER WAS MUCH DEEPER AND SAID A LOT ABOUT MY DOMESTIC LIFE AS A MOTHER, A DAUGHTER, A SISTER, A A STUDENT. THESE GIRLFRIEND AND MUNDANE OBJECTS TURNED INTO COMPLEX FORMS THAT COULD BE USED TO DESCRIBE AN AVERAGE PERSON'S LIFE, MY LIFE. I HAVE CREATED IN MY WORK A CATALOG OF FORMS THAT BEGAN AS CLOTHES THAT I AM ABLE TO MANIPULATE AND ARRANGE IN A VARIETY OF WAYS TO REPRESENT ALL OF THE PARTS OF MY LIFE. A SHORT LIST OF SOME OF THE IDEAS THAT I SEE THEM REPRESENTING ARE WORK, PLAY, RELATIONSHIPS, LAZINESS, FRUSTRATION, MOTHERHOOD, CHANGE AND LOVE. I PRESENT THEM IN AN ABSTRACTED WAY BECAUSE I DON'T WANT TO SHOW THE PILE OF CLOTHES BUT RATHER, USE THIS SUBJECT MATTER AS A WAY OF CREATING ART AND REFLECT UPON WHAT IT REPRESENTS IN LIFE.
