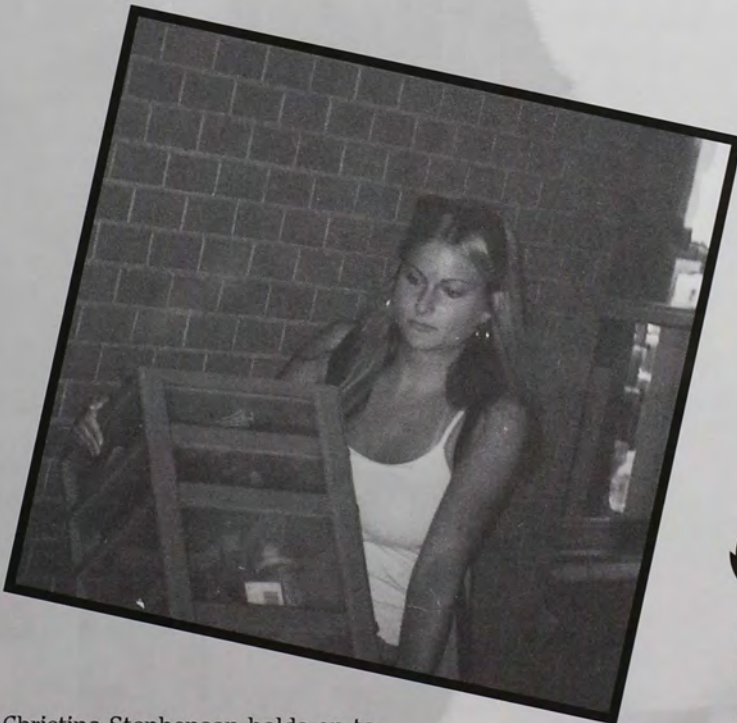

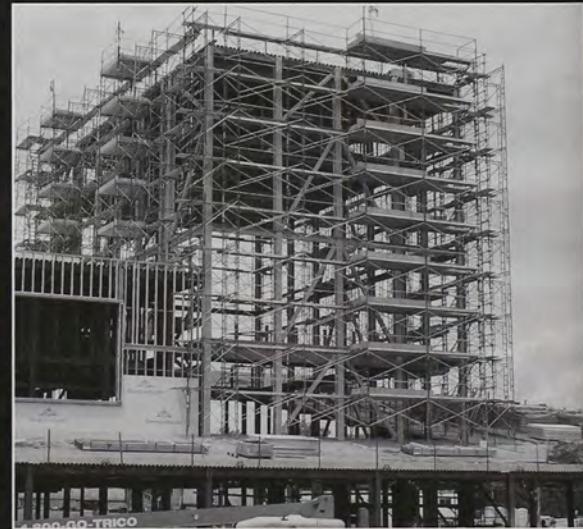

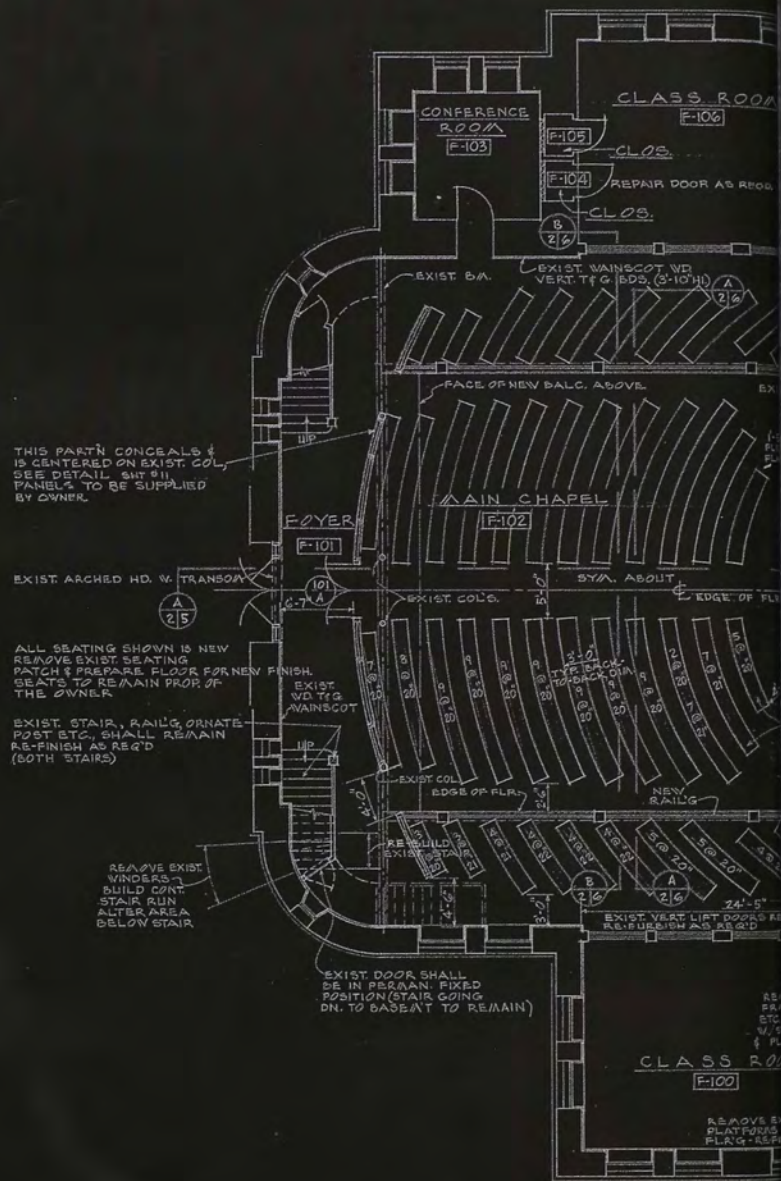

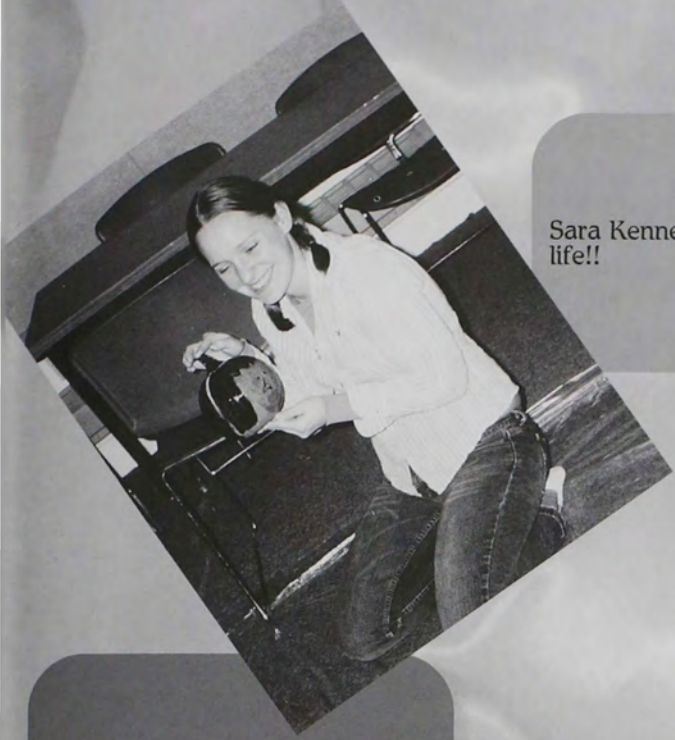

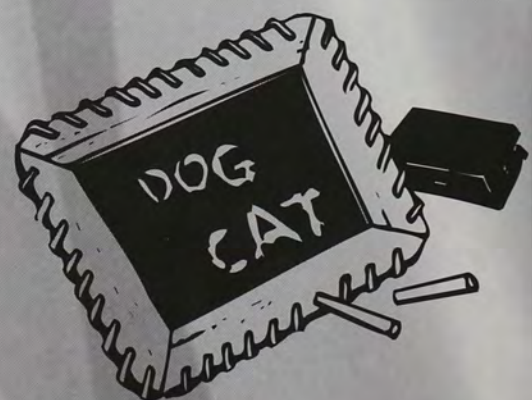

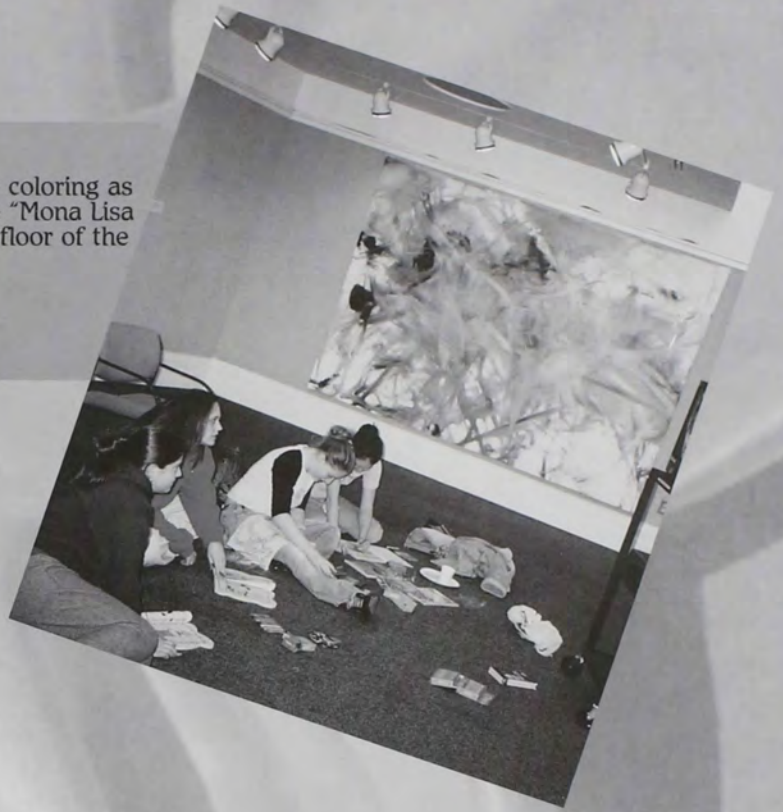

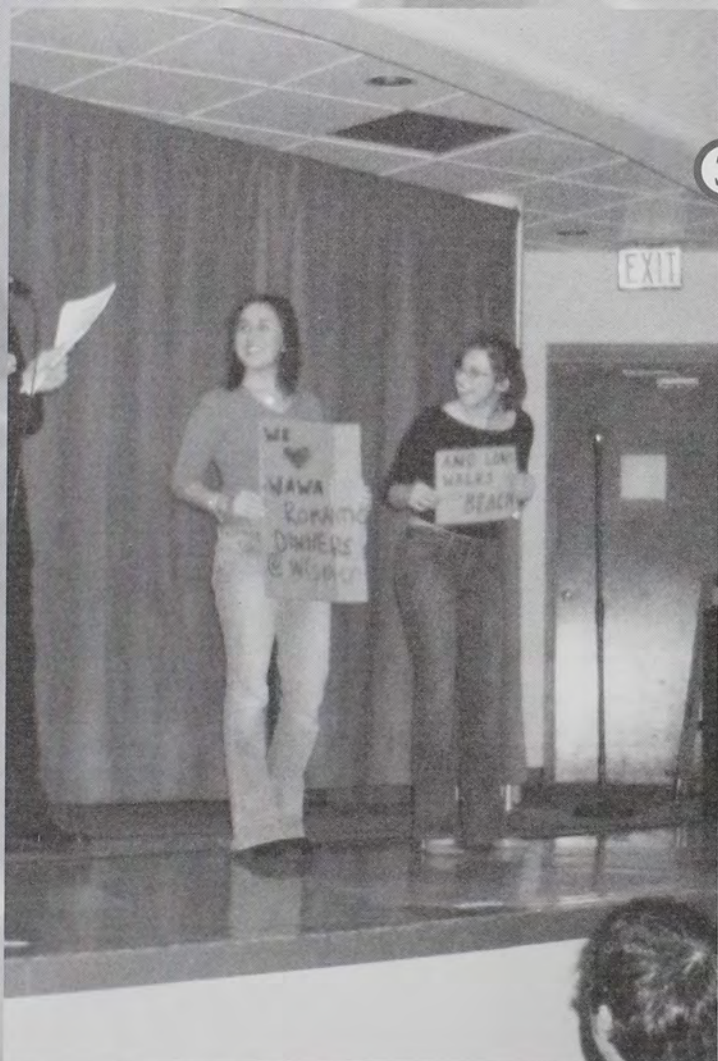

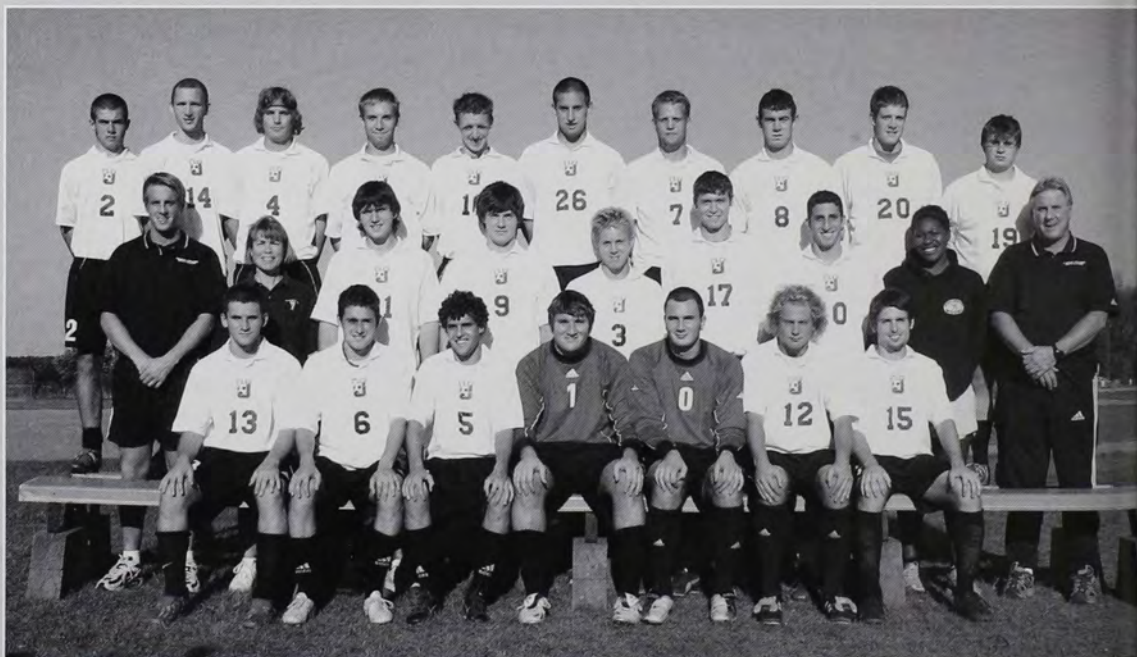

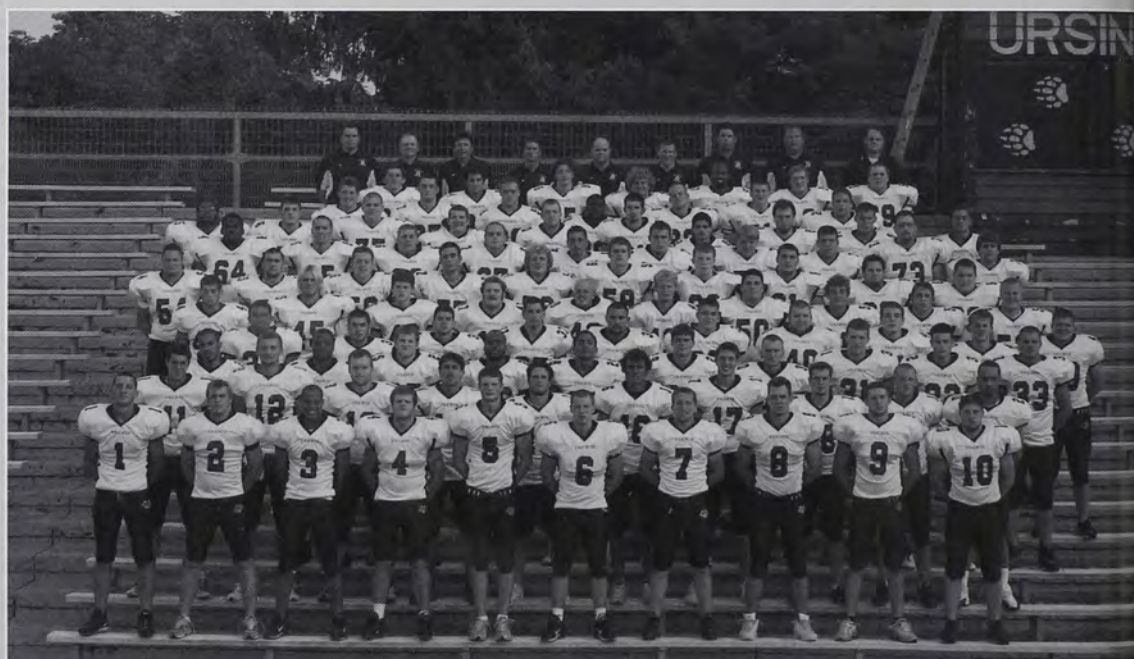

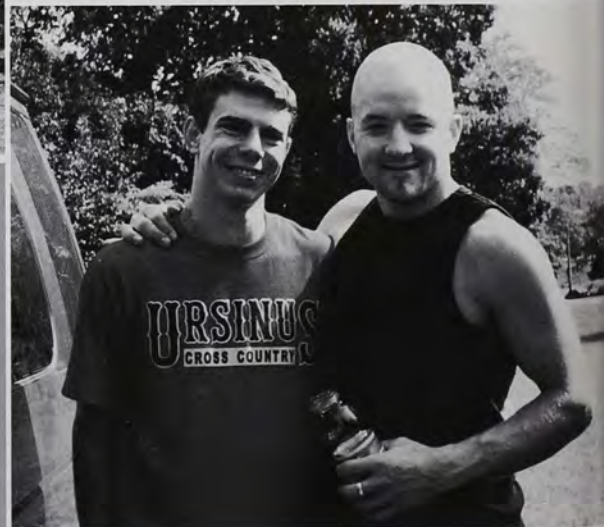

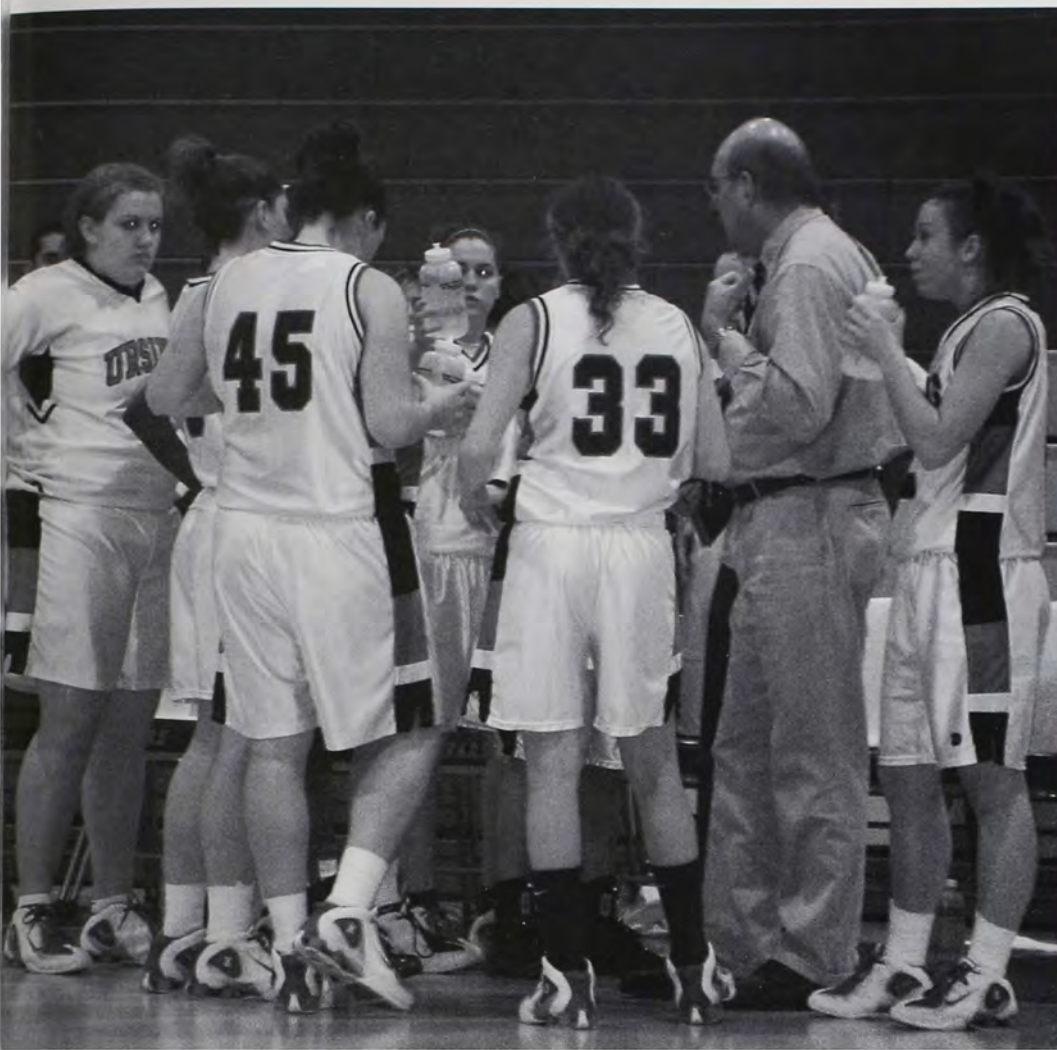

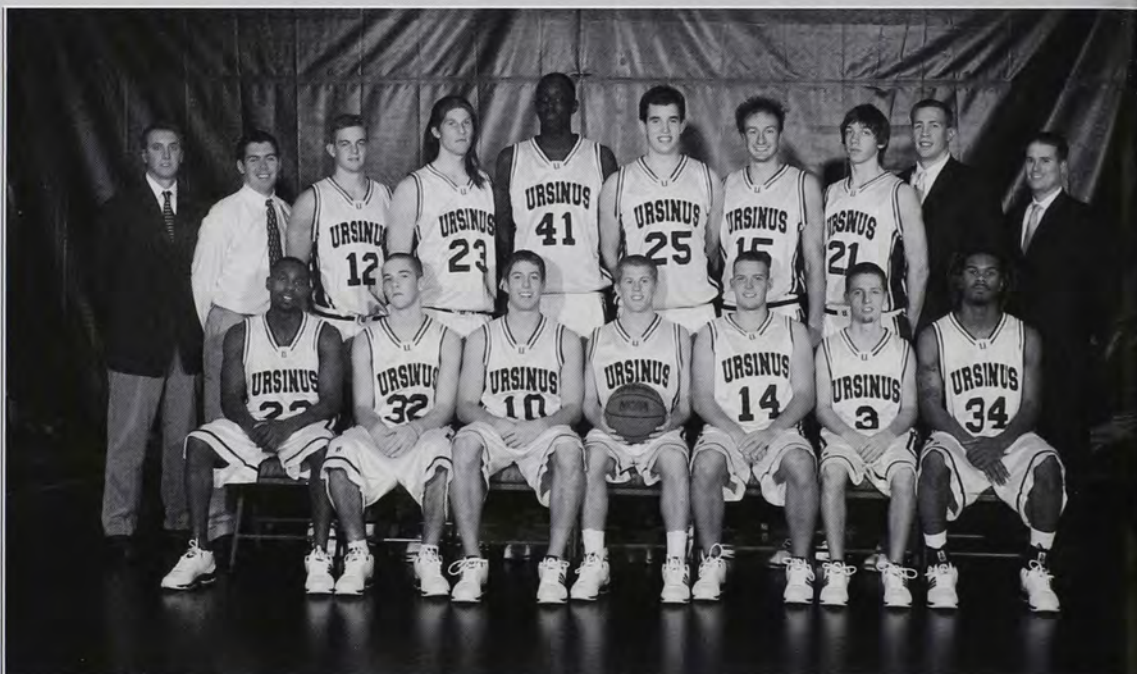

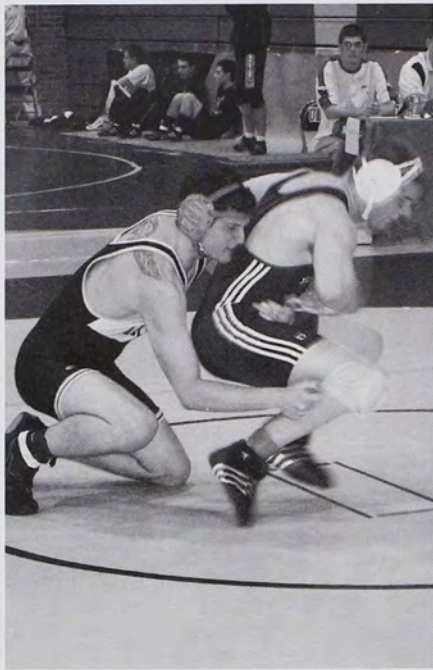

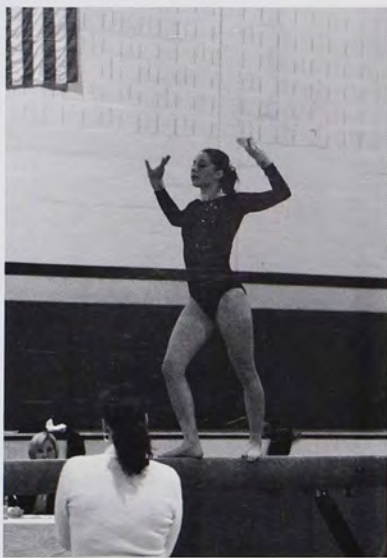

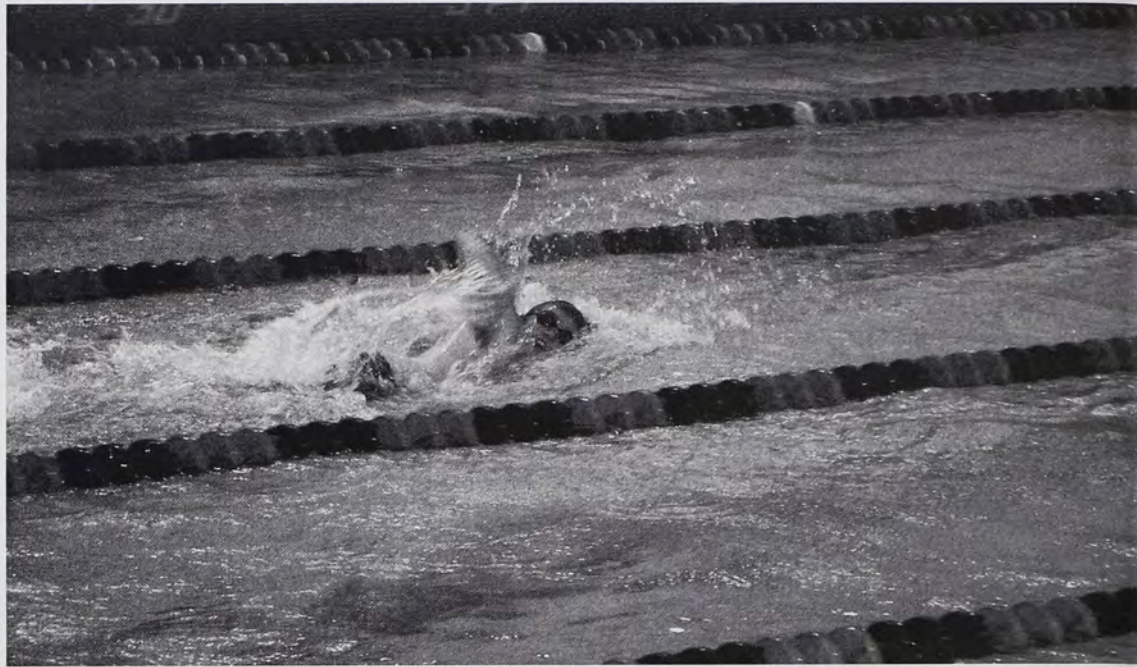

T.O. PARAPET Elev. +3'-4"



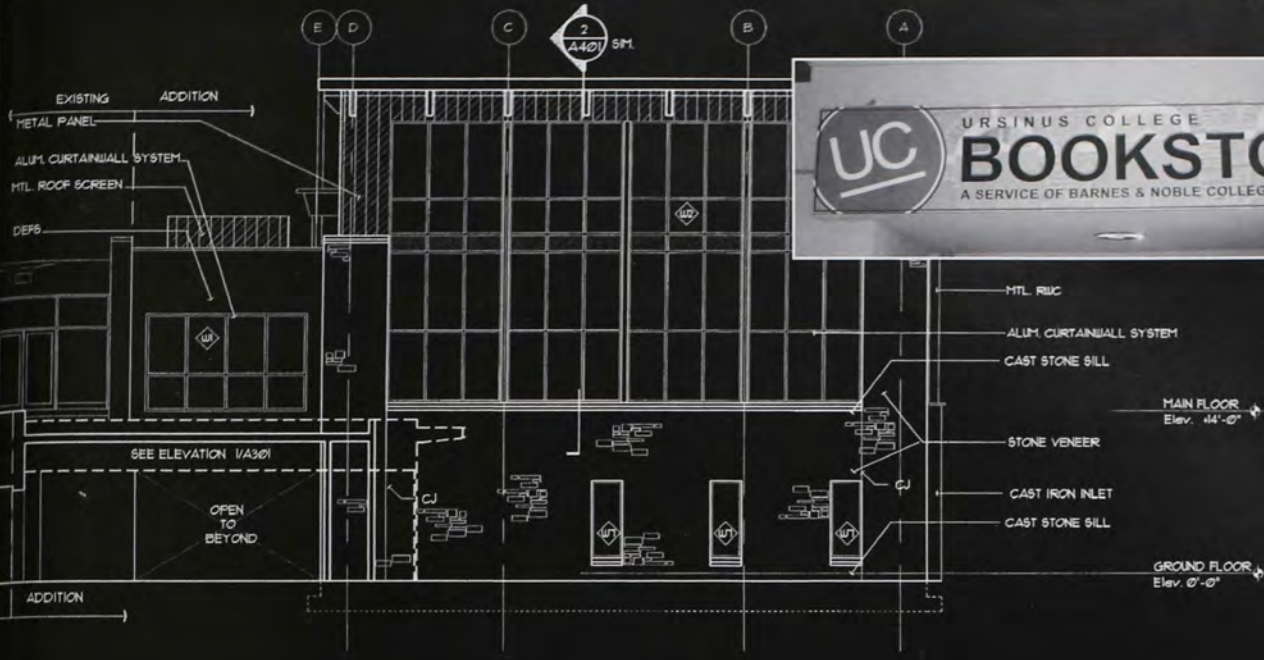
