If you want to know the value of one hour, ask the lovers who are waiting to meet.


If you want to know the value of one minute, ask the person who has just missed the train, bus, or plane.

Virgina Albright came to Ursinus in 1907 and along with two friends orgainized the first sorority on campus. The colors blue and gold were chosen to represent supremacy. The white rose is the sorority's flower. The Greek motto stood for Truth, Friendship, and Sisterhood. From 1913 to 1929 Phi Psi disbanded. In 1929 Phi Alpha Lambda was organized. The word PALS was derived from the name of the sorority and it stands for Personality, Ambition, Loyalty, and Scholarship. In 1950 Phi Alpha Lambda combined with Phi Psi to from Phi Alpha Psi. The ideals of the sorority were the same; since that time the sisters of Phi Alpha Psi have continued to keep the origional goals set back in 1907.




