ranged from rules to Wismer.

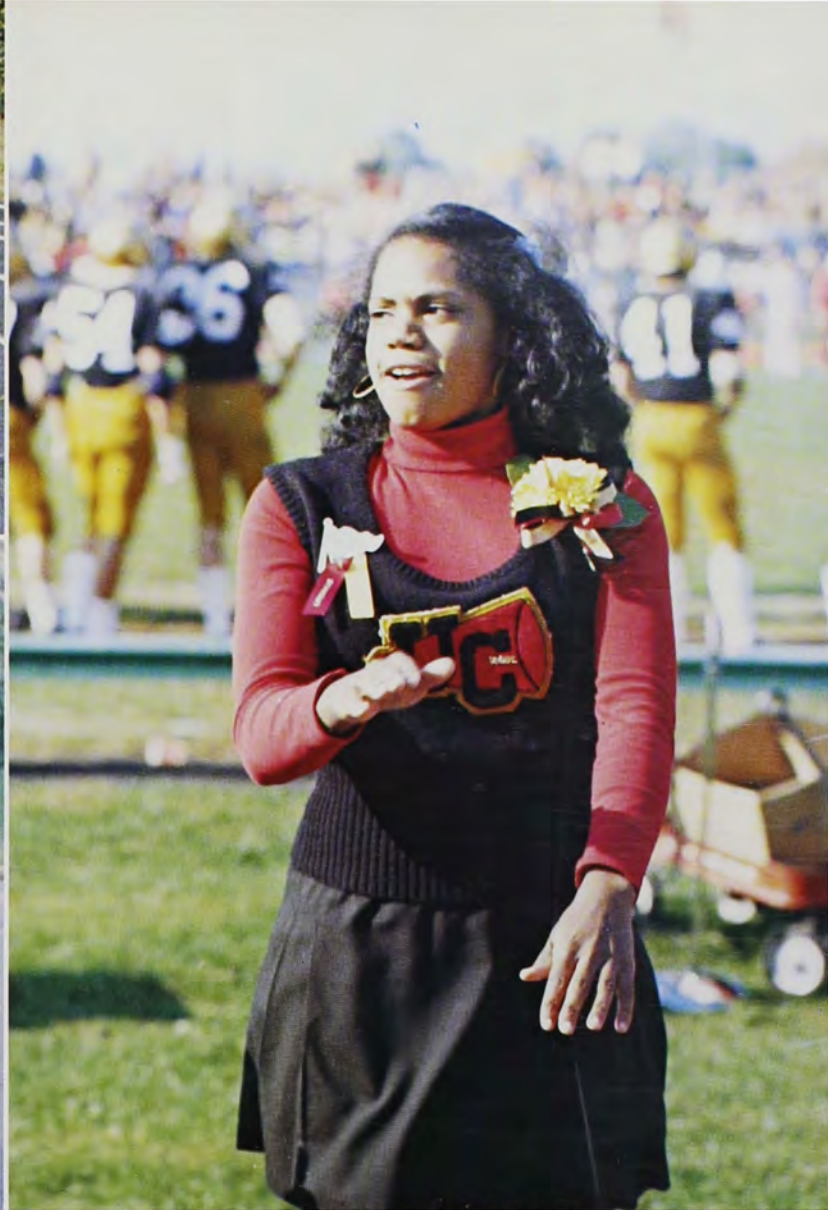


The middle years

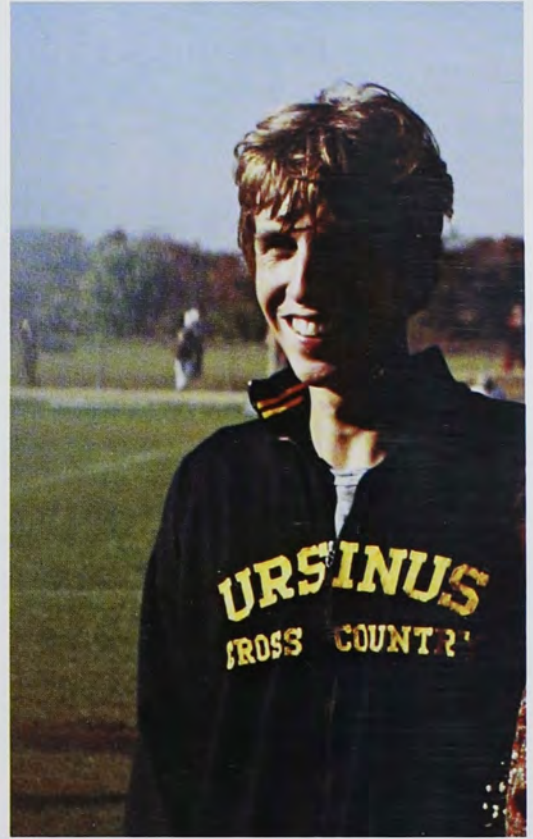

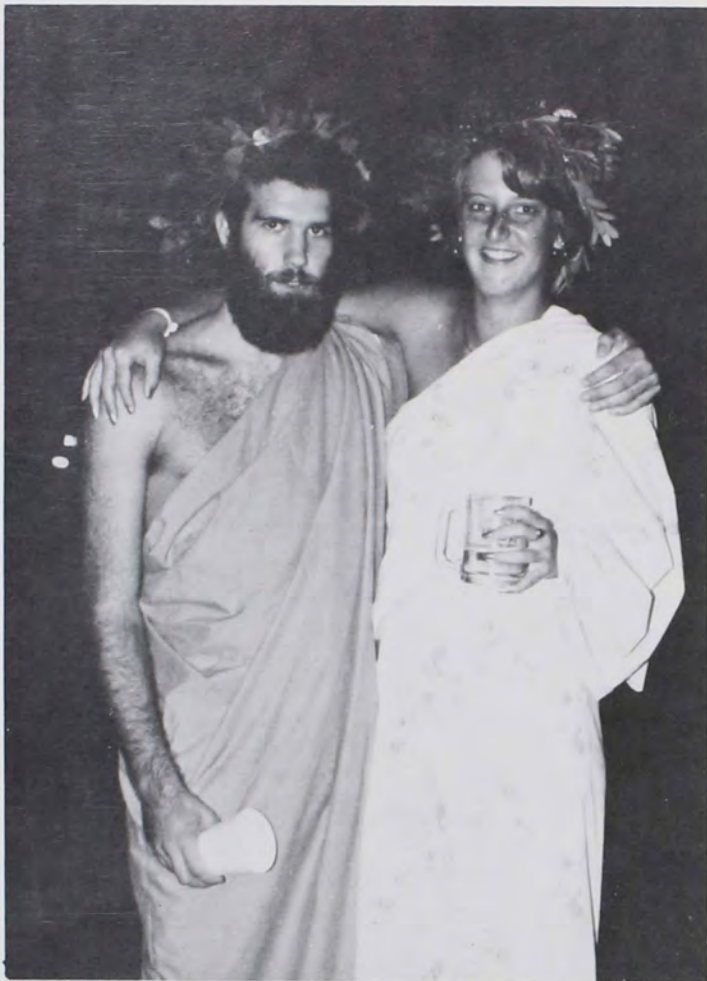

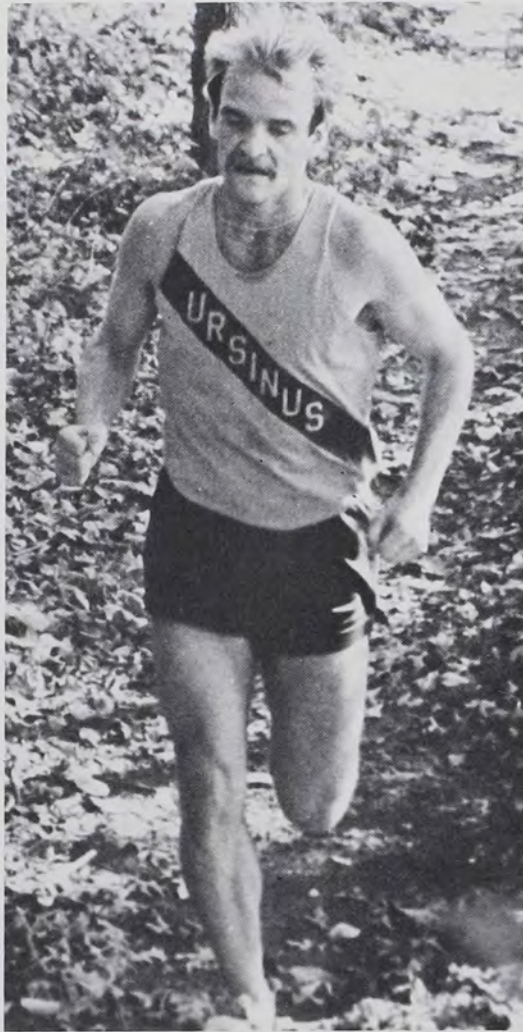

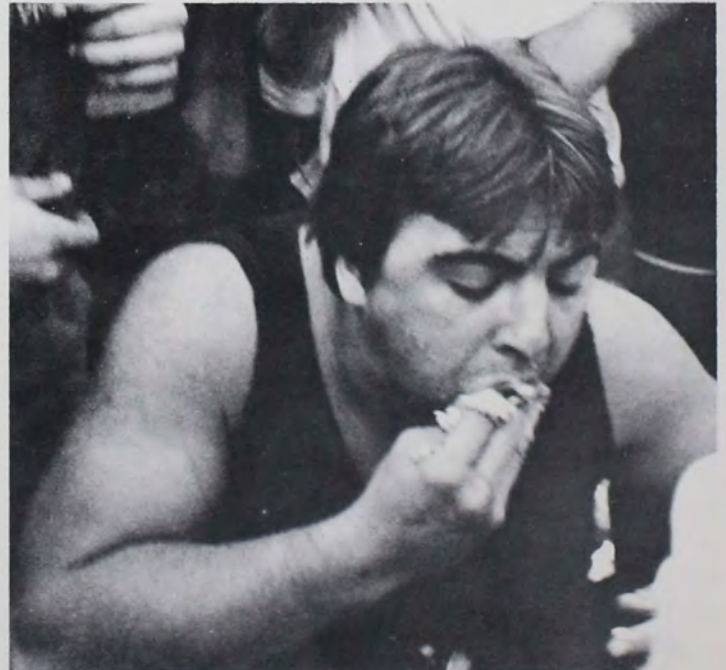

Rains Fail to Dampen Graduation

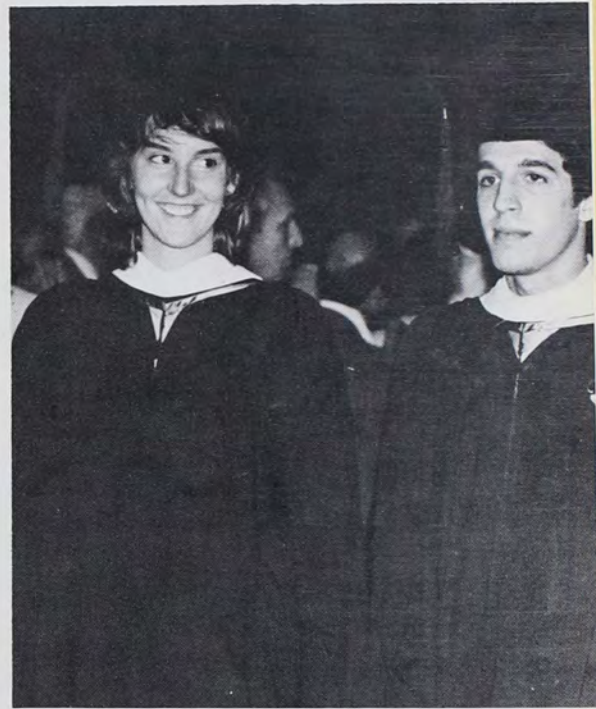

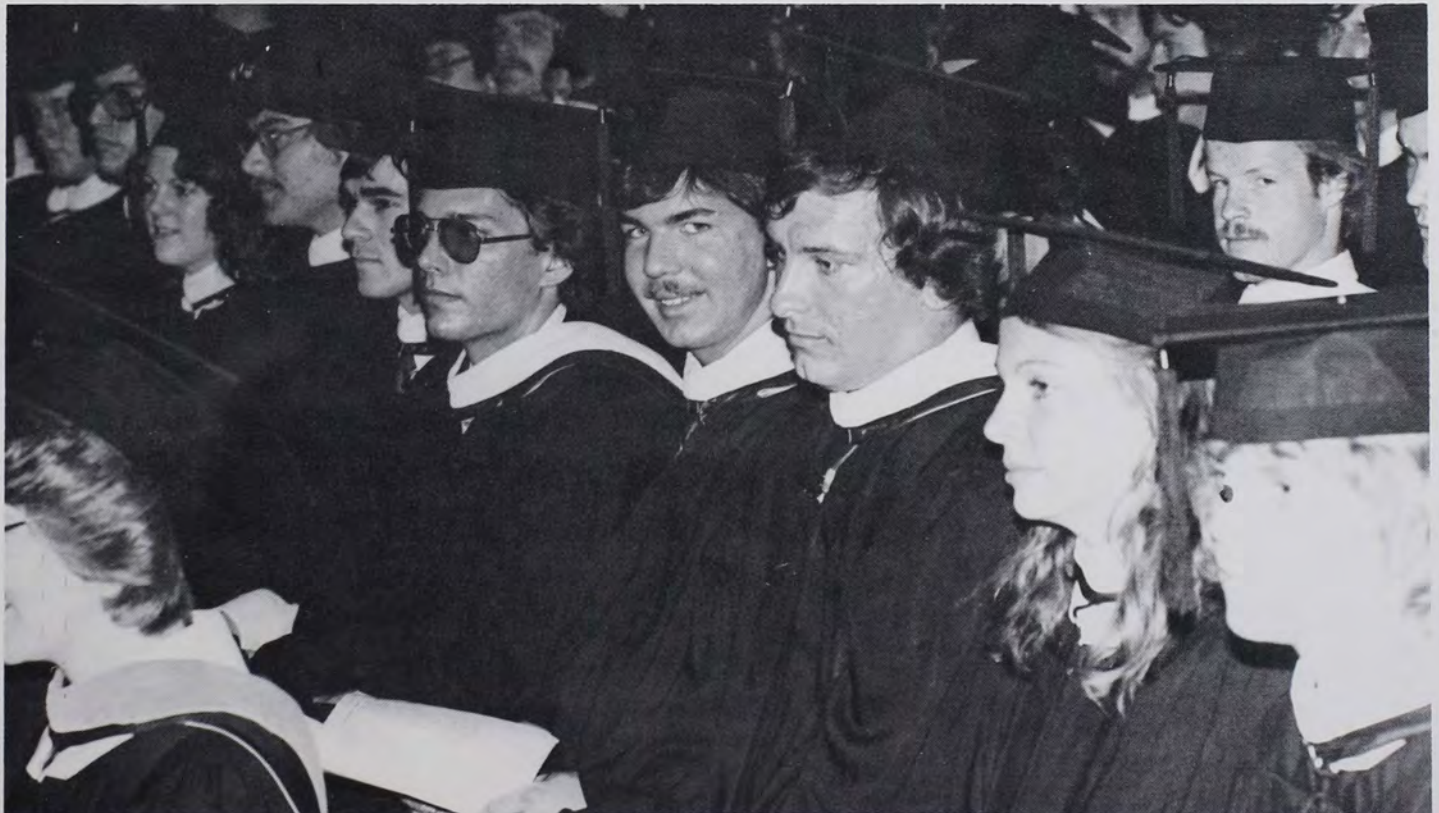

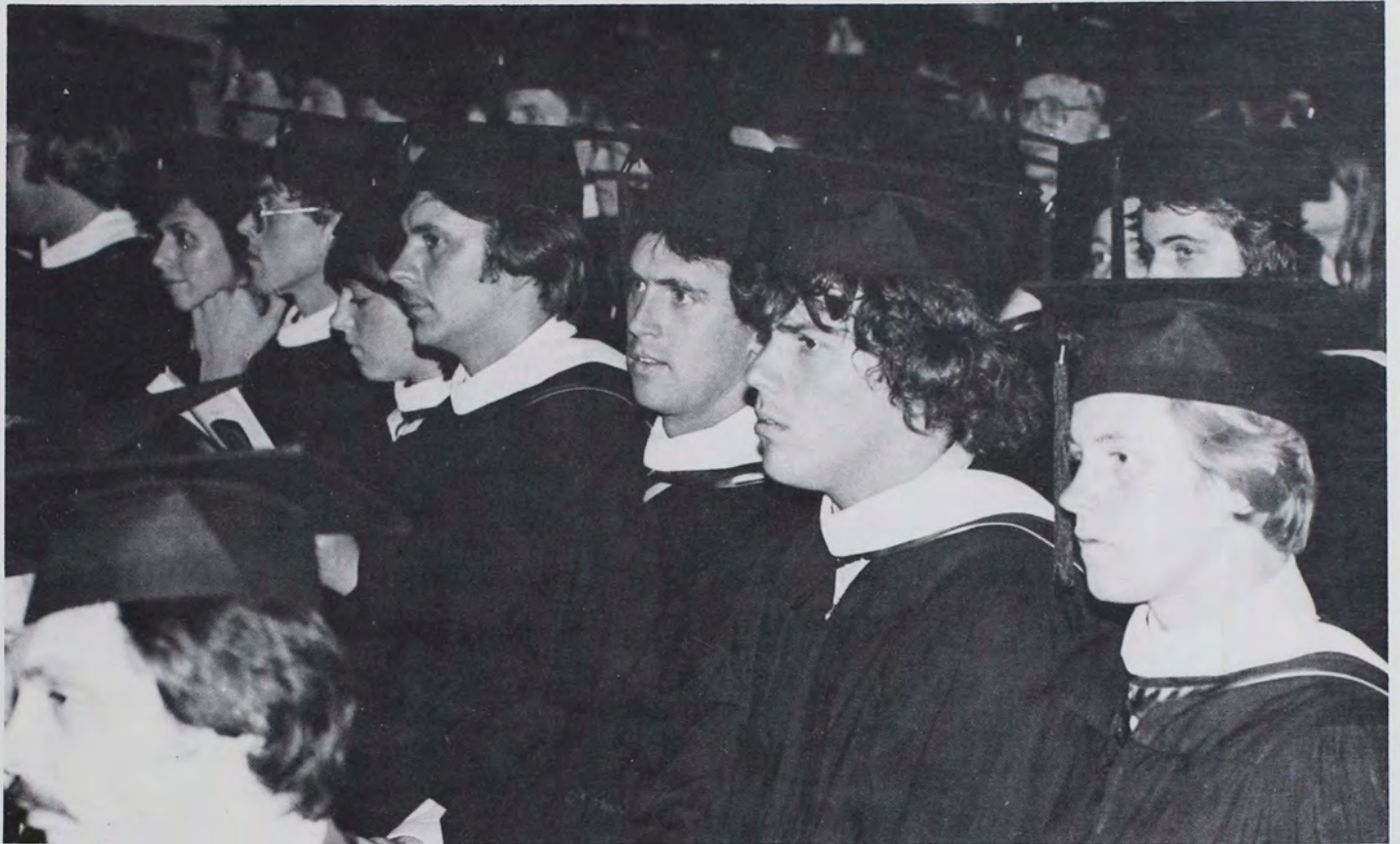
