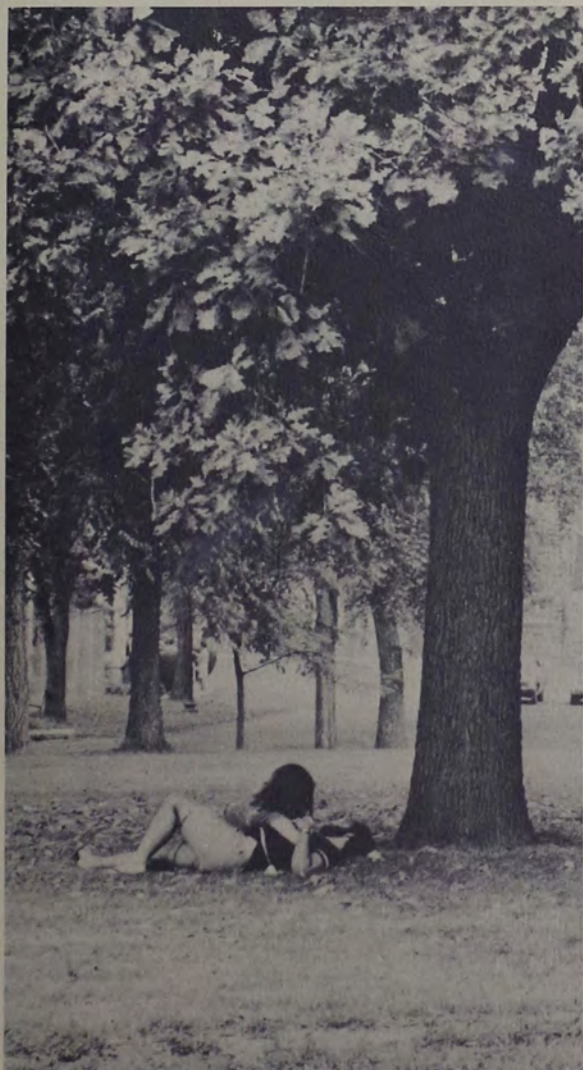
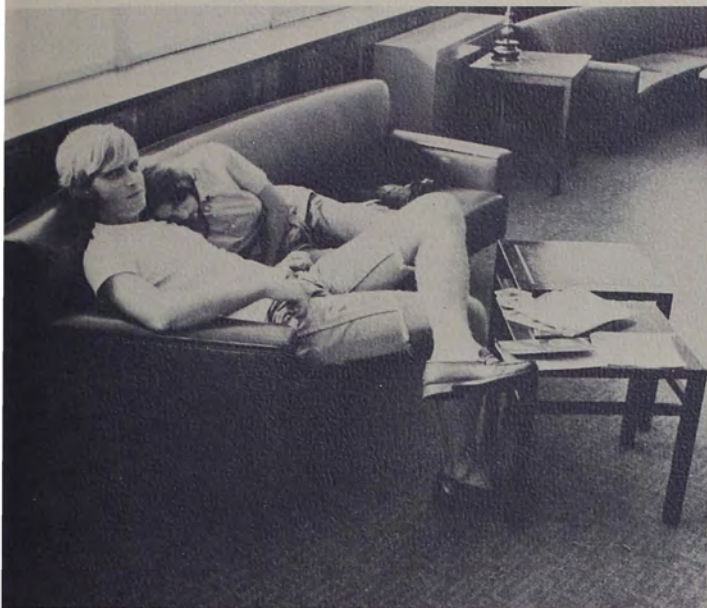


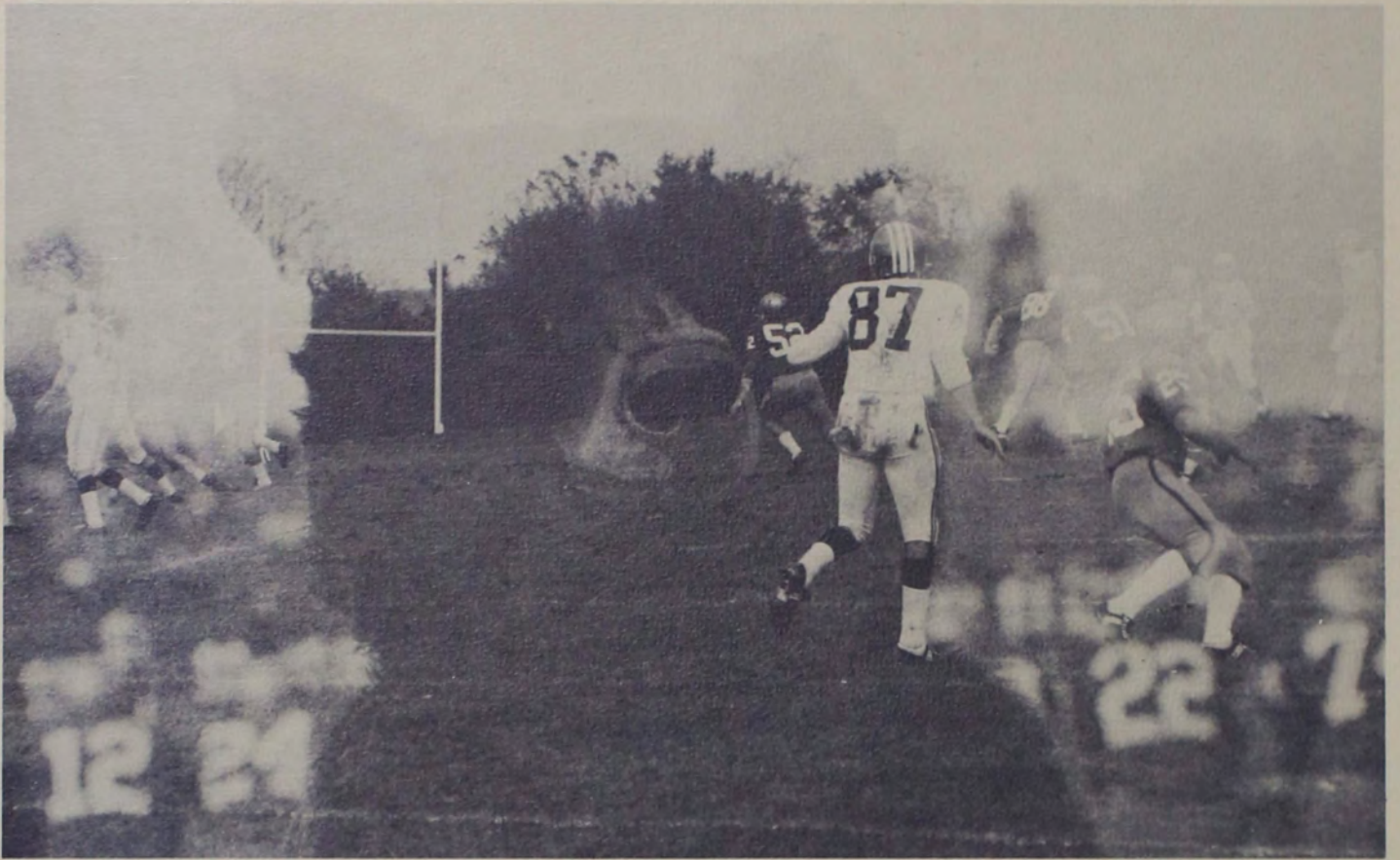
















Dedication
