THE PRINCIPALS

FRANK BROWN—This year Frank is Vice President of the Curtain Club and Secretary Treasurer of Alpha Psi Omega. Many have seen him on the stage before in such plays as All My Sons and Two Blind Mice. DOT PATTERSON—Although this is the first major acting part for Dot, she is well known for her work backstage.
