IC EXTENSION...The Chicago South Suburban Mass Transit District is now holding hearings on a grant application which would among other things extend the IC to the GSU permanent campus site. Keith Smith has been sitting in for GSU.

PROJECT ONC...At the request of the underground GSU anti-litter league, Project ONC (old notice clean-up) has been instituted. The Office of Communications will attempt to take down old notices and neatly arrange current ones in the entryways on a weekly basis. Also to be judiciously taken down, are notices plastered to impromptu bulletin boards that used to be called "walls". It is requested that collegial and other office bulletin boards be regularly attended by the units involved.

AT THE BOG...The Board of Governors at its December 8 meeting tentatively approved fiscal year 1973 operating budgets totaling \$75.7 million for its five member institutions with \$7.6 million designated for GSU. BOG Executive Officer Ben Morton noted the "unique situations" at all five campuses including Chicago State's move to its new campus and the special problems at GSU of curriculum building, start-up demands for new equipment, books and administrative components, and the need to prepare for moving to a permanent campus.

...The BOG is expected to give final budget approvals at its January or February meeting. The budget will then be subject to the review and approval of the Board of Higher Education which has already been trying to prepare institutions for possible substantial budget cuts. Did you know that GSU submitted 11 budgets before finally getting approval for the current fiscal year.

GSUings...Jim Gallagher asked to serve on the Chicago Central YMCA College Liberal Arts and Sciences Advisory Board. Other members of the Board are from Northwestern, Loyola, the Adult Education Commission, and the Central YMCA Board of Directors.

Paul Hill conducted a workshop for counseling personnel at Evergreen Park Community High School November 15 relating to coordination and balancing a student personnel services program and peer counseling.

Ed Stormer the conference speaker for the guidance convocation at West Virginia State College. His subject: "Life Style and You"...Ed also presented demonstrations of both family counseling and life style analysis.
