

**Subject:** Request for increased CUEs for Shared Governance

As we discussed at our meeting on Thursday, November 4, the Provost's Office agrees to the Faculty Senate's request to increase annual CUEs from 12 to 18 units for shared governance with the assumption that standing committee chairs will be eligible to receive CUEs for their committee leadership. In addition, I earlier had initiated a discussion about providing administrative assistance to the Faculty Senate and its committees. I have the intention of providing, as soon as feasible, a .5 staff position to support the Faculty Senate. Given the likelihood of a mid-year budget cut and perhaps a further budget cut for 2011/12, I am waiting to see how deep the cuts will be in conjunction with how successful we are in growing enrollment before committing to a new .5 position.
