Housing

Informal Recruitment

- **University Policies:**
 - Students must be considered to have completed at least one semester in college before they are eligible
- **Council Level:**
 - Fraternities - 2.2 GPA requirement
 - Sororities - None; set by individual organizations
 - Both: Alcohol Free
- **Sorority Rules:**
 - No following on social media
 - No visiting places of residence
 - No providing alcohol to minors

 - Differences between NPC and IFC
 - Furman's history (ie. housing, traditions)
- Possible changes to be made
 - Informal recruitment rules
