

Cover story update

The spring 2004 issue of *Furman* featured a cover article about Chad Hale '67 and his involvement with Georgia Avenue Community Ministries, which is working to revitalize the Atlanta areas of Grant Park and Summerhill.

The article, which detailed the triumphs and struggles of local residents as they tried to rebuild their lives and communities with the help of neighborhood food co-ops, included mention of GACM's plans to convert an old building into a restaurant that could provide employment opportunities and other services to the community. A nonprofit offshoot of GACM, called Georgia Avenue Coming Together, has since opened the restaurant.

Called Tummy and Soul, the restaurant, located on Fraser Street, is open daily from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., and has received a glowing review from *Creative Loafing* in Atlanta. The newspaper writes, "The notion that an eatery could enliven a neighborhood as well as provide livable salaries for members of that community isn't just a hopeful one, it's a promise put into action by Georgia Avenue Coming Together. This economic development organization's first business is Tummy and Soul, a cozy restaurant where scrumptious



Southern cooking comes with a side of healthy pride."
