Catalog Description:

This course discusses applications of Management Science and analysis to the Production and Operations functions. It emphasizes Operations Management as it relates to product (including services) development, plant location and layout, production cost analysis, inventory management, scheduling, quality control, etc.

Prerequisite: An introductory course in Probability and Statistic (STAT 361).

Course Objectives: The objective of the course is to provide the student with an understanding of managerial concepts and quantitative tools required in the design, operation and control of the production process.

Expected Student Outcomes:

Upon completion of this course, the student should be able to:

- 1) Demonstrate an understanding of some of the basic tools of production management by solving problems.
- 2) Calculate break-even point and Return on Investment.
- 3) Create and interpret flow charts for material and information.
- 4) Make and use charts and network analysis for project scheduling.
- 5) Understand the concepts of POM planning and control, including forecasting, capacity, inventory and material requirement planning.
