Scope and Content Note: The Sadler Family Papers consist of photocopies of deeds, land grants and wills (1809, 1840-1841, and nd), correspondence and newspaper clippings (1929-1941) with the bulk of the collection consisting of correspondence between members of the Sadler Family of Rock Hill, South Carolina and their friends. Subjects include agriculture, the lives of women during and after the Civil War, the physical and mental condition of the Confederate troops during the War, freedman labor, living standards during Reconstruction, and life in early Rock Hill.

Notes: Box 1, Folders 1 to 5 contain photocopies of the originals, and Box 1, Folder 6 to 10 contain the originals. Under the agreement of the deposit, the photocopies must be used in lieu of the originals. See descriptions of the other collections pertaining to the Civil War for possible related information.
