Scope and Content Note: **The Esther Surasky Pinck Papers consist of correspondence and newspaper clippings, relating to the Pinck, Surasky, and Polier families, together with concert, literary, and drama programs, newsletters, photographs, citations, poems, and memorabilia. The papers contain information on Mrs. Pinck's years at Winthrop and her extensive work for Jewish causes, such as the United Jewish Appeal, the Jewish National Fund, Technion, Hadassah, and the Hebrew Home for the Aged. There is also a biographical file on Mrs. Pinck's husband, Dr. Louis A. Pinck, who was a chemist for the U.S. Department of Agriculture.**

Dr. Pinck was employed as a chemist by the U.S. Department of Agriculture from 1919 until his retirement in 1964. He was a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.
