MANY ARRESTS A WAR CONGRESS COME WITH WAR

Score of Austro-Hungarians in Detention

Justice Agents Have Not Confined So Many Since the Revolution

Washington, Dec. 1.—Congress ready to take up again its part in the prosecution of the war.

The second session of the sixty-fifth congress began today at noon with brief routine sessions marked by the receipt of appropriation estimates for next year's war and emergency expenses aggregating the total sum of \$13,000,000,000.

Tomorrow the senate and house will meet in joint session at 12:30 p. m. to hear President Wilson deliver his address. Guidance of the President in the work ahead is awaited for by both houses. Congressional leaders tonight admitted that his recommendations, amplified with profound force by the chief, virtually would outline the session program.

Declaration as to the nature of the President's address carries largely upon whether he repeats recommendations of a former war aim. General belief is that the President will announce a new policy which Congress will follow, his desires. Sentiment for this action is widespread. In the advance many members probably will introduce resolutions. One or two senators were prepared today for such resolutions but were prevailed upon to withhold them.

A spirit of confidence apparently pervades the chamber. Returning members exchanged views with their colleagues. The house is expected to meet tomorrow and a declaration of war against them is expected to be introduced.
