Debriefing

1. Microlabs Protocol
 - a. Group norms and protocol adjustments
 - b. Divide into equal groups
 - c. Three questions-each question is read, a period of silent reflection is given, then each person has 2 minutes to share their thoughts on the question. The person who is sharing their thoughts is the only one speaking. When the time is up, the next person speaks, and so on.
2. Whole Group Debrief
 - a. Two behaviors
 - b. Instructional changes
