Scope and Content Note: **The Marshall Family Papers consist mostly of genealogical information related to the Marshall Family of Rock Hill, SC. The Marshall family is one of the most prominent Rock Hill families and are related to the Albrights, Barnes, and Friedheims. The genealogical records consist of lineage charts, family narratives, photographs, scrapbooks, correspondence, notes, newspaper articles, and published family histories. The genealogical records include information of the following families: Albright; Barnes; Foxworth; Friedhiem; Marshall; Tiner (Tyner); Watson (of Brittons Neck; SC); Also included in the collection is Winthrop Training School memorabilia collected by Edward "Ned" Marshall III (Class of 1955) and information related to the Marshall Family owned Marshall Oil Company.**

3	9	<p>GENEALOGICAL MATERIALS: MARSHALL</p> <p>This series consists of a commencement program and invitation for Zachary Tyner Marshall from Southside Christian High School (Simpsonville, SC) in 2006, a program for the funeral of James Edward Marshall, Jr. (1906-2001), a photocopy of <i>Rock Hill Herald</i> newspaper article written by Louise Pettus titled "Story from the battlefield: Civil War veteran told of strange encounter" which concerns Captain J.W. Marshall of Rock Hill, SC, and a copy of <i>The Marshalls of Edinburgh, Scotland, Charleston, South Carolina, Adams Run, South Carolina, and Rock Hill, South Carolina</i> by C.H. The <i>Frieheims' Of Rock Hill</i> contains photographs, narratives, and genealogical charts relating to this prominent Rock Hill family dating from 1822 in Germany through 1982. Included in this series are photocopies from an unknown publication containing family charts and lineage of the Tiner Family. The photocopies are pages 20-33 and are possibly from a book titled John Alexander Tiner, Sr. The photocopied portion covers the family of John De Alexander Tyner (1845-1921) and Martha Lee Young (1846-1914) and their descendants up to 1997, however the author of this collection, James Edawrd "Ned" Marshall III made numerous additions and edits dating up to 2003. Also included is a program from the funeral service for Daniel Wilson Tyner (1913-1997) and Priscilla Watson Tyner (1919-2001). This series also contains information related to Priscilla's application and involvement in the United Daughters of Confederacy including a copy of The Morning News "The History of Ellison Capers Chapter United Daughters of Confederacy" Florence, SC (1934). Within the scrapbook, there is also a letter to a "Mrs. [J] H. Wood dated "Sunday 27, 1951" perhaps indicating the date of arrival for the letter. Given the date stamp on the envelop, one can assume the month to be in June. The name on the back indicates that perhaps the letter came from a "[Mrs. ____ Silver]" from Jacksonville, Florida .
