Scope and Content Note: **The York County Multiethnic Heritage project, administered by Dr. Joyce Pettigrew Berman of Winthrop's English faculty, was made possible by a \$38,000 grant from the Department of Health, Education and Welfare of the U.S. government. The purpose of the project was to study the total contributions of ethnic groups to the total cultural heritage of York County School District No. 3, the York County Nature Museum and the city of Rock Hill Recreation Department. The project, which began in July, 1976, and ended June 30, 1977, focused on ethnic groups in the area: Southern Appalachian, Afro-American and American Indian. The collection includes a wide variety of material that could be used for research on York County and for instructional purposes by teachers. The collection consists of magazines, newspaper clippings, books, audio tapes, video cassettes, slide transparencies, and copies of historical documents such as letters and land records.**
