- 17 Code, is reported shall make a written report to the law enforcement
- 18 agency that employs the peace officer that includes the following
- 19 information:
- 20 (1) the name of the victim;
- 21 (2) the name of the suspect, if known;
- 22 (3) the type of financial sight order or payment card
- 23 information obtained or transferred in violation of Section 31.17,
- 24 Penal Code; and
- 25 (4) the results of any investigation.
- (b) On the victim's request, the law enforcement agency
- 27 shall provide the report created under Subsection (a) to the

- 2 redact any otherwise confidential information that is included in
- 3 the report, other than the information described by Subsection (a).
- 4 SECTION 3. Chapter 13, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 5 amended by adding Article 13.295 to read as follows:
- 6 Art. 13.295. UNAUTHORIZED ACQUISITION OR TRANSFER OF
- 7 CERTAIN FINANCIAL INFORMATION. An offense under Section 31.17,
- 8 Penal Code, may be prosecuted in any county in which the offense was
- 9 committed or in the county of residence of the person whose
- 10 financial sight order or payment card information was unlawfully
- 11 obtained or transferred.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
