About the Photographs: The photographs in Fact Book 2014 were taken in The Edna Lawrence Nature Lab by the staff of Institutional Research. RISD's web site describes the Nature Lab as "a unique resource for examining, exploring and understanding the patterns, structures and interactions of design in nature." Founded in 1937, its collections - along with specialized microscopes and other equipment for studying them - have continued to grow to include more than 80,000 specimens and other items of natural history. It also houses live animals and plants, a natural history reference library and clipping file, and archives of slides, tapes, videos and x-ray photographs.








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Student and Faculty Diversity Trends










