- As a group, please read the excerpt from Kevin Howard's article on moral panic and fishing penalties for ethnic minorities in Ireland. Then, look up the definition for **nation building** in Chapter 14 of your text and, in a few sentences, describe how the Irish construct a feeling of national belonging and social identity through the label of "coarse fish." Use examples from the article to support your answer.
- 2. What about moral panic, in the Irish case, do you think creates feelings of **ethnocentrism** and social inequality? Discuss in your group how you think you could change the Irish discourses on the "East European folk devils" to reduce unjust fishing practices.
- 3. Look up the definition of **naturalizing discourses** in Chapter 14 of your text. How does the clip we saw on the Tajikistan community in Saint Petersburg illustrate this concept?
- 4. The clip's presenters make some interesting connections between the immigration situation in Russia and that in the US, and mention that the situation in Russia violates human rights. As a group think of an example from our nation's history where our society violated the human rights of an immigrant population. Be ready to share this example with the class.
- 5. Lastly, please discuss: How could we use the concept of **cultural relativism** in anthropology to help explain and find a compromise or solution for these two situations? (ethnocentrism and national building in Ireland, and violation of immigrant human rights in Russia).
