

Cast Biographies

Erin Eileen Rogers (Cinderella) is happy to be fulfilling every little girl's dream. A senior at the University of Illinois, Erin is a voice performance major studying with Ollie Watts-Davis and is planning to enter a master's voice program this fall. During college, Erin has portrayed Jenny in Company and Rosemary Pilkington in How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying for the Illini Union Board. A former member of the Women's Glee Club, and of the Girls Next Door, she is currently now singing with the Illinois Opera Theatre. Last summer, Erin performed in *La Fiesta* Italiana at Busch Gardens, The Old Country, in Williamsburg, Virginia, where she can be seen and *heard* again this summer. Erin would like to thank her family for encouraging her to follow her dreams, and her roommates for helping her get into character!

Curt Clark (Prince Charming), who marks his debut at Parkland College, is pleased to be associated with this fine and growing theatrical group. Curt is a senior in speech communications at the University of Illinois, where he has appeared in a number of performances ranging from Robert in Company, to John the Baptist/ Judas in Godspell. His latest Champaign-Urbana credit comes from the Station Theatre where he portrayed Bill Starbuck in 110 in the Shade. For the second straight summer season, Curt will be performing at Opryland USA in Nashville, Tennessee. He has also appeared at Six Flags over Great America, and at Busch Gardens, the Old Country in Virginia. Curt wishes to express his sincere thanks to all of those who helped make this a wonderful experience for him.

Bob Strauss (King), a native of Bethpage, New York, is making his acting debut in this production. He came to Champaign to attend the University of Illinois in 1976 and received an M.A. in labor and industrial relations. Bob is a human resources manager with Colwell Systems, Inc., Champaign, and is the father of Joanna (Little Princess) and Jacob (Gus) Strauss. His hobbies include reading, gardening, softball, and fishing.

Andrea Glick (Queen), a theatre major from Rock Island, is pursuing a professional career on stage. She has studied acting with Dr. James Coates and voice with Sandra Chabot. Andrea's recent roles include Mrs. Chumley in *Harvey*, and Leah in *Two by Two* at Parkland. Last summer, Andrea appeared in the Illinois Opera Theatre's production of *Guys and Dolls*.

Patti M. Good (Stepmother) is no newcomer to Parkland audiences, previously appearing in *Harvey* and *The Diviners*. Patti works at K-104 FM. Regarding her role as the stepmother, she says, "I've been typecast again, but at least they've dressed me better this time."

Erin M. Porter (Portia Prunella) makes her first appearance on the Parkland theater stage. Recently she appeared as O'Malley in the Illinois Repertory's production of *Present Laughter* at the Krannert Center for the Performing Arts. She also performed in the Station Theater's production of *Story Theatre* in 1986. Erin plans to pursue an M.F.A. in acting after she completes her undergraduate degree at the U of I in May 1989.

Jeanne E. Grap (Joy Esmerelda) is new to the Champaign-Urbana area, but she is no new-comer to the theatre. She has appeared in several musicals as a dancer in the central Illinois area. A teacher of general and vocal music at St. Matthew Catholic School, Champaign, Jeanne's hobbies include playing the piano, dancing, enjoying her dog, and going ice skating!

Stephanie Hepburn (Fairy Godmother) moved to the Champaign-Urbana area from Britain two years ago. Since then she has acted at the Krannert Center in The Club and in The Seagull; at the Sunshine Dinner Playhouse in Fidaler and in Two by Two; and at Parkland in Two by Two. Stephanie was drawn to Cinderella by the opportunity of working with her children, James and Jennifer (Royal Pages), in their stage debut. Stephanie's husband, Angus, also a thespian, is performing at the Krannert Center for Performing Arts in A Nightingale Sang. Stephanie holds a B.F.A. in acting and an M.F.A. in directing, as well as a certificate from the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art. A member of British Actors Equity and AFTRA, she has been performing on stage and television for 15 years. In April she will appear as Mrs. Peachum in The Threepenny Opera with the Illinois Opera Theatre.

Stacy D. VanDeveer (The Herald), from Chillicothe, Illinois, is a junior at the University of Illinois majoring in political science. Stacy's credits include vocal and dance choruses in U of I production of West side Story, How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying, Company, and The Wiz. Cinderella is Stacy's first Parkland production.

Forrest E. Staire, Jr. (the Attendant, the Chef) a Mahomet resident, is expecting to graduate from Parkland this spring with an associates degree in advertising. He served his first practicum at WDWS and is currently interning at Lierman and Associates. At Parkland, he currently hosts the PCTV program *In Focus* and had previously played the lead in the 1986 production of *Harvey*.

Ken Carpenter (the Steward, Dream Prince) is a second-year liberal arts major at Parkland. *Cinderella* is also his second Parkland production, having portrayed Hamlet in *Hamlet Revamped*. His favorite pastimes include performing in the Parkland Jazz Ensemble, playing the guitar, and being a member of the supergroup "T.S."

John Cummins (the Advisor) is a first-year liberal arts student majoring in theatre. Prior Parkland Theatre performance credits are *Hamlet Revamped* and *The Diviners*. A Champaign resident, John enjoys creative writing and improvisational comedy in his spare time.

























Carl Crawford (Young Prince), a 6th grader at Edison Middle School, Champaign, is pleased to be involved in another Parkland production. Carl has been involved in the Parkland's College for Kids program and last summer played the prince in *Princess Ida*, a Gilbert and Sullivan operetta. He has also appeared as Fredrick in the *Sound of Music* at Sullivan's Little Theatre and as Winthrop in the *Music Man* at the Sunshine Dinner Theatre. Besides his acting, Carl's piano playing is also showcased in *Cinderella*. He would like to thank his parents for their support for his love of theatre.

Jyana Sunshine Gregory (Young Princess), a sixth grader at Jefferson Middle School, studies piano, flute, and ballet and sings in the Central Illinois Children's Chorus. Jyana played Wendy in the Robeson School production of Peter Pan in 1986. She played Lillian in Cheaper by the Dozen at the Sunshine Dinner Playhouse last summer. She also made her debut at Parkland College in last summer's production of Gilbert and Sullivan's Princess Ida, in which she played Lady Psyche. Staff Biographies

Rodney G. Woodworth (Artistic Director), originally from Tolono and a graduate of Unity High School, attributes his intense love of musical theatre to the influences of Mom, Mimmi, and Polly (his music mentor). He has been performing in theatre productions for over 25 years, and Cinderella marks his Champaign-Urbana directing debut. A 10-year veteran in the Air Force, Rodney has traveled around the world and has performed and directed in theatres in Australia, England, Guam, and Labrador. After returning to the Champaign-Urbana area, Rodney studied vocal performance, opera, and musical theatre at the University of Illinois where he studied with William Warfield for two years. During the past six years, he has performed locally in more than 25 shows including Pirates of Penzance, and Hansel and Gretel at the Krannert Center for Performing Arts; Evita, Much Ado About Nothing, Guys and Dolls, She Loves Me at the Station Theatre; Closing Time, Berlin to Broadway, Two by Two at Parkland; and most recently Fiddler and Two by Two at the Sunshine Dinner Playhouse.

Rodney hopes to continue working professionally in this area both as an actor and director and eventually establish a career in New York. Rodney teaches voice, acting, and movement classes and presents master's classes in acting and musical theatre. He would like to thank Sandy and Marty for their constant love, support, and encouragement during this adventure and send his love to the "3 M's" (Marty, Mom & Mimmi) for their daily understanding.

Sandy Chabot, (Director of Choral Activities at Parkland College) has been associated with musical theatre for many years. Wearing the hat of singer/dancer/actress, she has performed Nettle in *Carousel*, Mame in *Mame*, and Magnolla in *Show Boat*. Wearing another hat, she has served as musical director of *Li'l Abner, The King and I, Berlin to Broadway, Two by Two*, and *Annie*. Jon Reeves (Scenic and Lighting Designer) is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin, Whitewater, with a B.A. in technical design and production. Jon has several hundred shows to his credit both as designer, builder, technician and actor. Jon is currently employed at the Sunshine Dinner Playhouse where he and his next design can be seen there on stage. Jon enjoys skateboarding, rock music, and a good steak. He is pleased to be the scenic and lighting designer for *Cinderella* and has enjoyed making magic for the Parkland audience. He hopes to work at Parkland again.

Jo Marie Dugan (Costume Designer) is Parkland's costume shop manager and a member of the Theatre Production Committee. Originally from Michigan, Ms. Dugan earned an associates degree at Parkland two years ago and is currently a full-time student working towards a B.F.A. in applied theatre at the University of Illinois. Her costuming credits are numerous, most recently including Hamlet Revamped . ., Futures, and The Diviners at Parkland and Kabuki Othello in which she assisted U of I's Shozo Sato at the Krannert Center for the Performing Arts. Her directing talents were utilized in EIU's production of Hedda Gabler and in a children's production of Paddington Bear. Ms. Dugan regards Cinderella as her greatest challenge, for it is the first Parkland production in which all costuming was completed in-house.

Kimberly Baum (Rehearsal Pianist, Chorus Member) is a sophomore majoring in English literature at the University of Illinois. Kimberly is serving as rehearsal accompanist for Cinderella as well as being active on stage. She has also been accompanist for several U of I presentations, most recently lending her talents to the Illini Union Board's production of *The Wiz.* This April Kimberly will be accompanist for I.U.B's production of *A Chorus Line*. Kimberly will be performing this summer at Busch Gardens in Virginia.

John Eby (Assistant Director) returns to Parkland after having stage managed *Futures* this past fall. He holds a B.F.A. in theatre from Illinois Wesleyan University and an M.F.A. in directing from the University of Illinois. John is currently employed at the Krannert Center for Performing Arts and also works as production manager for The Great American People Show, New Salem, Illinois.
