Mr. DE LANO, from the Committee on Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 3584.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 3584) granting a pension to William J. Dunn, have considered the same and beg leave to submit the following report:

The claimant was a private in Capt. William T. Minter's Company of Alabama Militia in the Florida Indian war from February 29, 1836, to May 30, 1836. He prays a pension at the same rate as is allowed by law for service in the war of 1812.

Mr. McRae, Representative in Congress from the State of Arkansas, states that the claimant is seventy-eightyears old, quite feeble, unable to work, and very poor.

There are precedents for this legislation, and your committee, believing that the case is a meritorious one, recommend that the bill do pass with the following amendments: Correct the name of the claimant so as to read William J. Dunn, and strike out the words, "Jersey, Bradley County" in the fifth line of said bill and substitute in lieu thereof the words, "Hampton, Calhoun County."
