

Museum, how would you rate your experience?





would you rate your experience?




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



Comments and Suggestions for Future Excursions

My main reason for participating in this group is to maintain contact with other active academics, ideally to help keep up with constantly changing technologies, including library/research serach procedures and methods; to get ideas for how to stay intellectually active and engaged without necessarily going the traditional "publication" and "attend conference" route. I don't feel the need for a social group..I have that through other networks, including my chamber music network. But that does not provide sufficient intellectual stimulation nor engagement with others doing research, especially social science, research. I'd also like to explore how we, as mature educators and academics, can share what we've learned [about teaching, our own research data] with others, within and outside of academia. I feel my "fund of knowledge" is going to die with me! And SJSU is not utilizing an incredible resource called Emeritus Faculty [e.g. as MA thesis advisors etc]. I'm also feeling more and more "obsolete" and "out of data" academically, even basic library/search skills, partially because of the new technologies. I had hoped ERFA would provide such activities/opportunites...and I suppose it's up to us what kind of activities. living in San mateo [vs. San Jose area] doesn't make it easier, especially as traffic has increased.

Monterey-- The Dali Museum-- full day with films, galleries (150 works produced the last years), and a docent to make and encourage connections. Plus lunch on the wharf or at the hotels.

I think your choices of excursions have been excellent. The settings have been very interesting and places that I would not visit by myself.
