PARTISAN DIVIDE: FAVORABILITY OF NH CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION

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DURHAM, NH – Favorability of New Hampshire's Congressional delegation remains closely tied to partisanship. Jeanne Shaheen remains the most popular elected official in the state while Granite Staters' opinion of her newly-elected Senate colleague Maggie Hassan remains divided after her narrow victory last November.


These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and five (505) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 31 and February 8, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent.

Favorability Rating - Jeanne Shaheen

New Hampshire senior senator and former governor Jeanne Shaheen continues to be popular in the state. Currently, 50% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 32% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 8% are neutral, and 10% don't know enough about her to say. Shaheen's net favorability rating (the percentage with a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have a unfavorable opinion) is +18%, down from +26% in October 2016. She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +71%) and popular among Independents (+24%), but unpopular among Republicans (-32%).

Those who voted for Hillary Clinton for President (75% approve), frequently listen to NHPR (66%), Central/Lakes Region residents (65%), and those who have completed postgraduate work (60%), are most likely to view her favorably, while those who voted for Donald Trump for President (63% disapprove) and those who frequently listen to conservative radio (63%) are most likely to have an unfavorable opinion.


Favorability Ratings - Maggie Hassan

New Hampshire's newly-elected junior senator Maggie Hassan defeated former Senator Kelly Ayotte in the November 2016 election. Hassan was broadly popular among the New Hampshire public in the early periods of her governorship, even garnering a narrow plurality of favorability among New Hampshire Republicans from February 2013 to July 2014. But since that time, and particularly after announcing her intention to challenge Kelly Ayotte for Senate, the public has become more divided in its opinion of Hassan.

Currently, 47% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Hassan, 36% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 8% are neutral, and 10% don't know enough about her to say. Hassan's net favorability rating is +11%, slightly down from +14% in October 2016. Hassan is very popular among Democrats (+69%), somewhat popular among Independents (+10%), and very unpopular among Republicans (-42%).

Those who have completed postgraduate work (67% favorable), Central/Lakes Region residents (57%), and women (57%), are most likely to view Hassan favorably, while those who frequently listen to conservative radio (64% unfavorable) and those who attend religious services at least once a week (48%) are most likely to view her unfavorably.

Favorability Ratings - Carol Shea-Porter

First Congressional District residents are divided in their opinion of Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter following her defeat of incumbent Frank Guinta in their fourth consecutive contest. Currently, 36% of residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District have a favorable view of Shea-Porter, 29% have an unfavorable view of her, 14% are neutral, and 21% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is +7%, slightly lower than in October 2016 (+18%).


Shea-Porter is very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +61%), somewhat unpopular among Independents (-11%), and unpopular among Republicans (-38%).



Second Congressional District residents remain closely divided in their opinion of Second District Congresswoman Ann Kuster. Currently, 36% of residents of New Hampshire's Second Congressional District have a favorable view of Kuster, 28% have an unfavorable view of her, 13% are neutral, and 23% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is +8%, down from +23% in October 2016.

Kuster is very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +52%), Independents are neutral (-2%), and somewhat unpopular among Republicans (-15%).



Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and five (505) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between January 31 and Febuary 8, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
