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TRUMP TAKES NH LEAD

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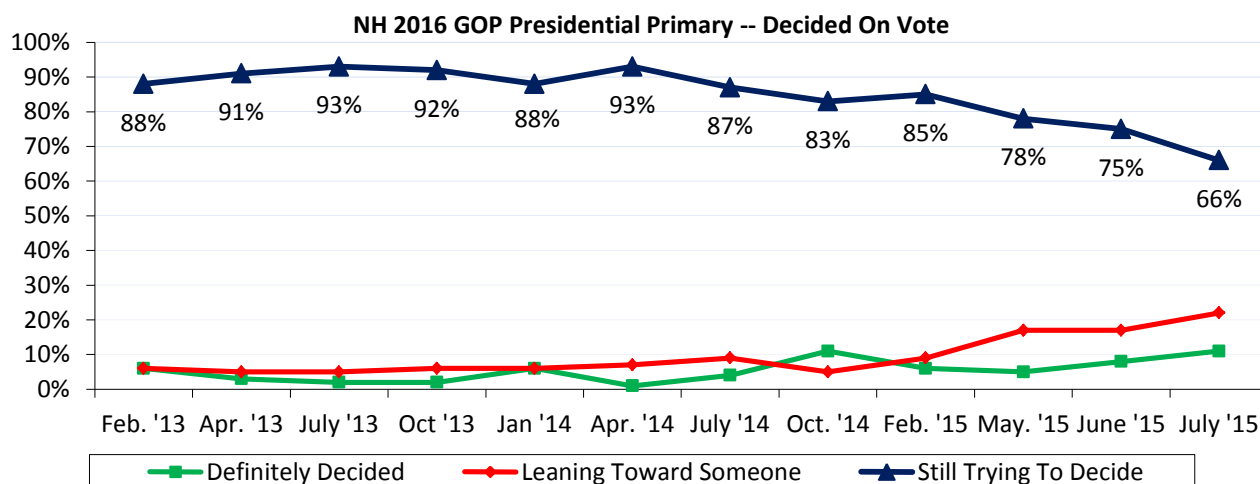
DURHAM, NH – Donald Trump has taken the lead in the New Hampshire Primary race. This marks the first time that any Republican candidate has held a statistically significant lead in the Granite State. Trump is an extremely divisive candidate within the party as he is the candidate that New Hampshire Republicans say they are least likely to vote for.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Seven hundred and twenty-two (722) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between July 22 and July 30, 2015. The margin of sampling error is +/- 3.6 percent. Included were three hundred nine (309) likely 2016 Republican Primary voters (MSE = +/-5.6), two hundred seventy-six (276) likely 2016 Democratic Primary voters (MSE = +/-5.9), and six hundred and fifty-two (652) likely 2016 presidential election voters (MSE = +/- 3.8).

NH Republicans Not Engaged

2016 marks the 100th anniversary of the New Hampshire Primary and has attracted a record number of major Republican candidates. New Hampshire Republicans are, as usual, taking their time deciding who to support. Candidates who have been identified as early frontrunners have typically won past New Hampshire primaries, yet no frontrunner truly exists in the current Republican field.

New Hampshire primary voters usually decide who they will vote for in the last weeks, or days of the campaign and it is no surprise that few likely Republican primary voters have made up their minds about who they will support in 2016. Currently, only 11% of likely Republican Primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will support, 22% are leaning toward a candidate, and 66% are still trying to decide.

The Republican electorate is more interested in the 2016 primary than it was at a similar point in 2007, the last time both parties had contested primaries. Currently, 48% of likely Republican primary voters say they are extremely interested in the election, 38% are very interested, and 13% are only somewhat interested or not very interested. By comparison, in July 2007, 38% of likely Republican primary voters said they were extremely interested in the 2008 primary, 37% were very interested, and 25% were only somewhat interested or not very interested. Another sign of higher interest in Republicans is that close to half (44%) of undeclared voters who can vote in either primary, are more likely to say they will vote in the Republican primary while only 33% say they will vote in the Democratic primary. In July 2007, 49% of undeclared voters said they would vote in the Democratic primary and only 24% said they would vote in the Republican primary.

GOP Favorability Ratings

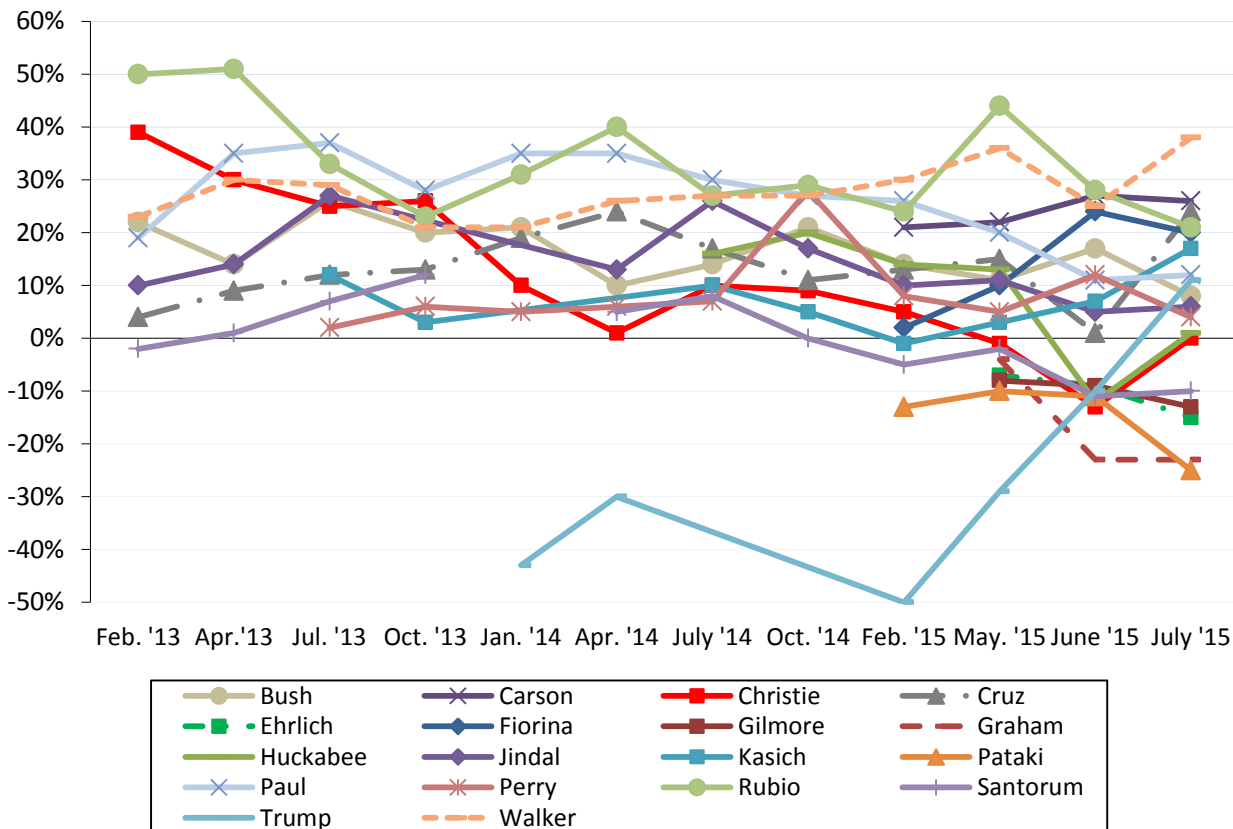
Wisconsin governor Scott Walker leads the GOP field in net favorability (the percentage who have a favorable opinion of him or her minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion) among Republican primary voters. Currently 52% have a favorable opinion of Walker, 14% have an unfavorable opinion and 33% are neutral or don't know enough about him to say. Walker's net favorability rating is +38%, which is up from +25% in June. Other GOP candidates with moderate net favorability ratings include neurosurgeon Ben Carson (+26%), Texas Senator Ted Cruz (+24%), Florida Senator Marco Rubio (+21%), businesswoman Carly Fiorina (+20%), and Ohio governor John Kasich (+17%).

Kentucky senator Rand Paul (+12%), Businessman Donald Trump (+11%), former Florida governor Jeb Bush (+8%), former Texas Governor Rick Perry (+4%), former Arkansas governor Mike Huckabee (+1%) and New Jersey governor Chris Christie (+0%) have low net favorability ratings, despite most Republican Primary voters knowing them. Former Pennsylvania Senator Rick Santorum (-10%), South Carolina Senator Lindsey Graham (-23%), former New York Governor George Pataki (-25%), have negative net favorability ratings, despite most Republican Primary voters knowing them.

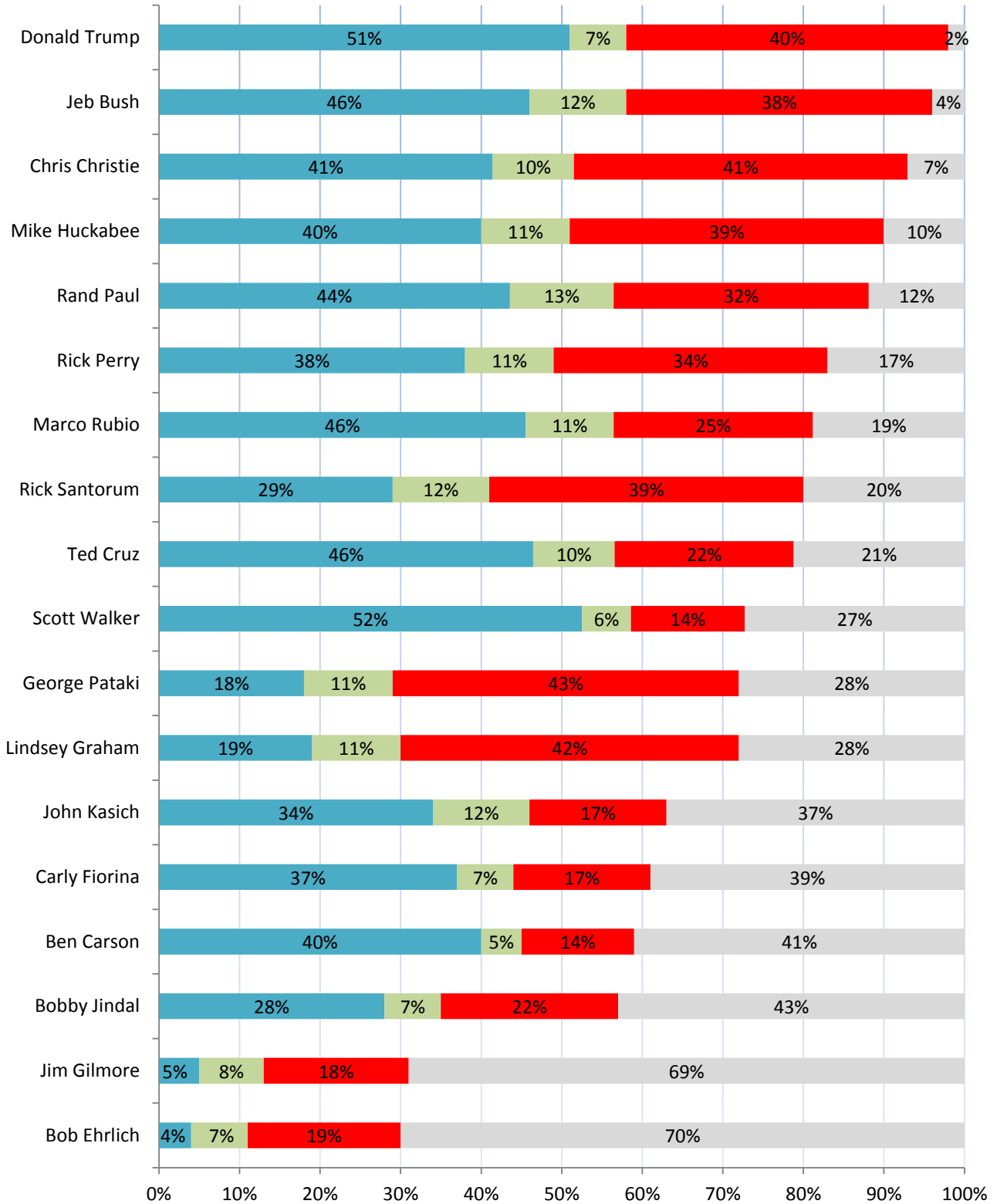
Louisiana governor Bobby Jindal (+6%), former Virginia governor Jim Gilmore (-13%), and former Maryland governor Bob Ehrlich (-15%), have low net favorability ratings, and are also are not well known to voters.

Trump, who has been the subject of extensive media coverage, has seen his approval ratings steadily increase among Republican Primary voters as he has moved from -50% in February to +11% in July.

NH 2016 GOP Presidential Primary -- Net Favorability Ratings



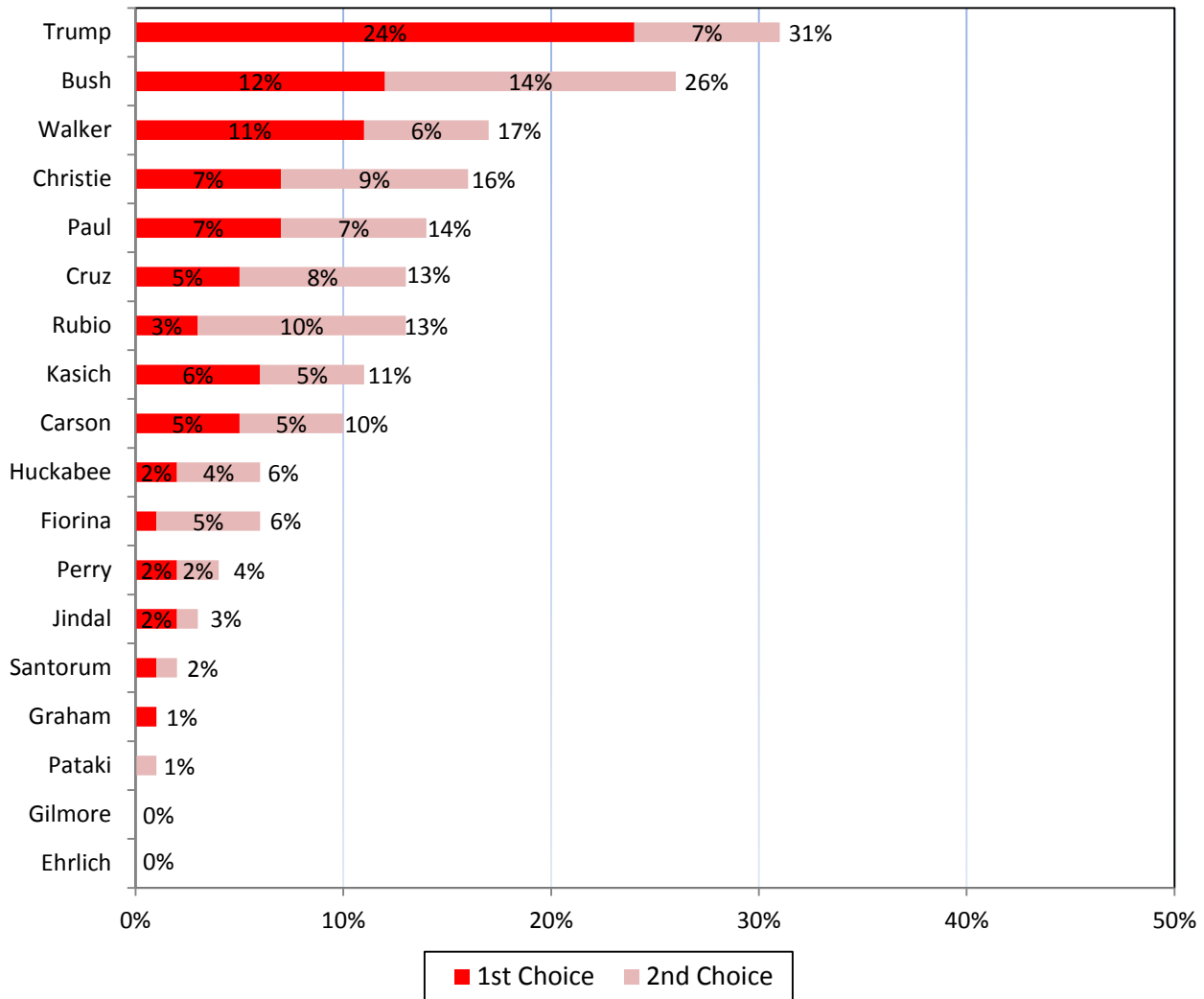
Favorability Ratings - Potential NH GOP Presidential Candidates - July 2015

 ■ DK

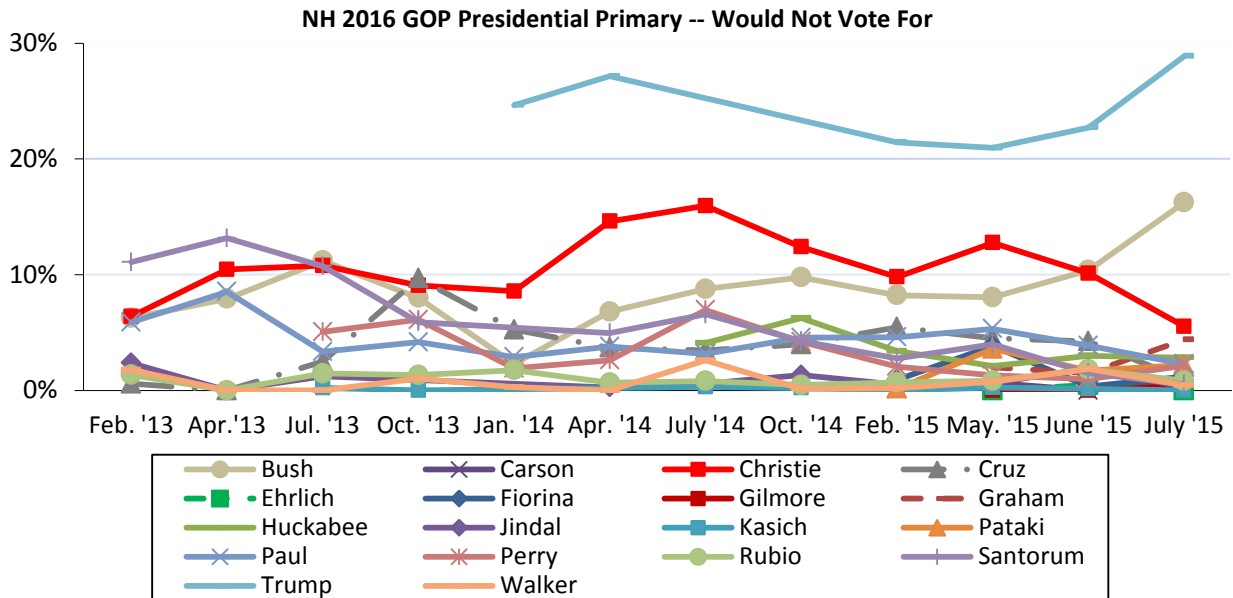
2016 NH Republican Primary with Second Choice

Asking likely Republican Primary voters who their second choice more clearly defines the field with Trump and Bush leading their rivals. When the top two choices are combined, 31% of likely primary voters favor Trump, 26% favor Bush, 17% favor Walker, 16% favor Christie, 14% favor Paul, 13% favor Cruz, 13% favor Rubio, 11% favor Kasich and 10% favor Carson.



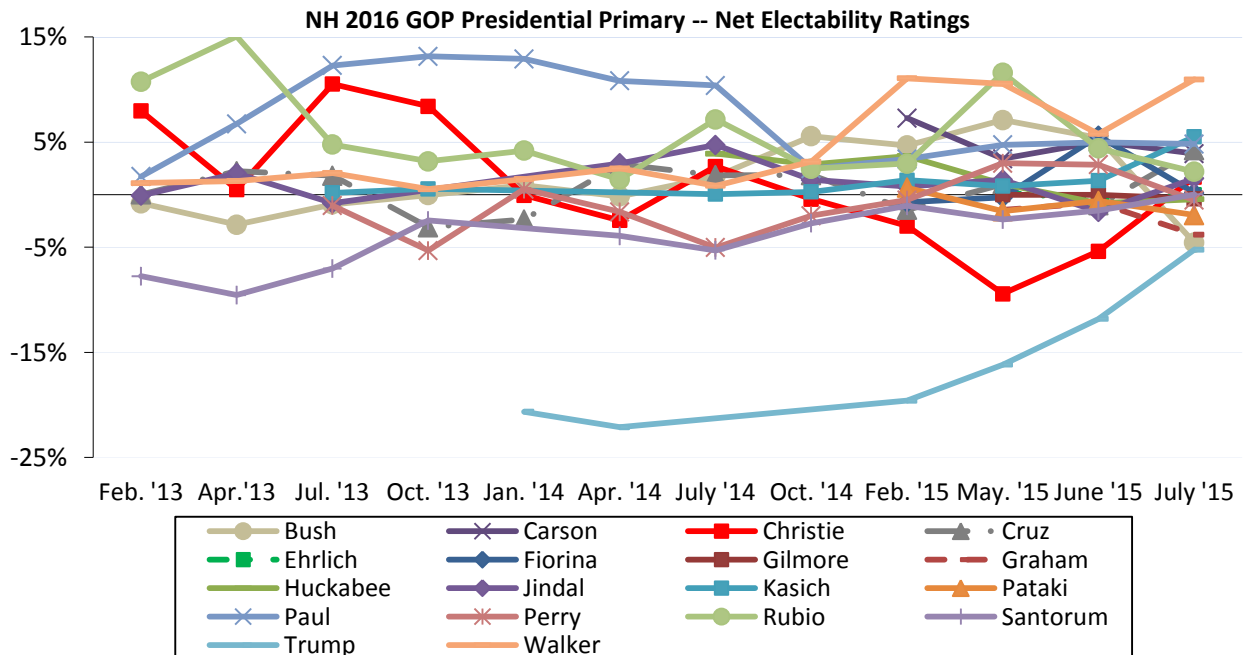
Most Unpopular Republican Candidate

Despite leading the Republican field, Trump remains the candidate New Hampshire Republicans are least likely to vote for. When asked which candidate they would NOT vote for under any circumstance, 29% of likely Republican Primary voters say they would not vote for Trump, 16% would not vote for Bush, 6% would not vote for Christie, 4% would not vote for Graham, 3% would not vote for Huckabee, 2% would not vote for Paul, 2% would not vote for Pataki, 2% would not vote for Perry, 1% would not vote for Fiorina, 1% would not vote for Cruz, 1% would not vote for Carson, 1% would not vote for Rubio, 1% would not vote for Santorum, 12% think all the prospective candidates are acceptable, and 17% are unsure.



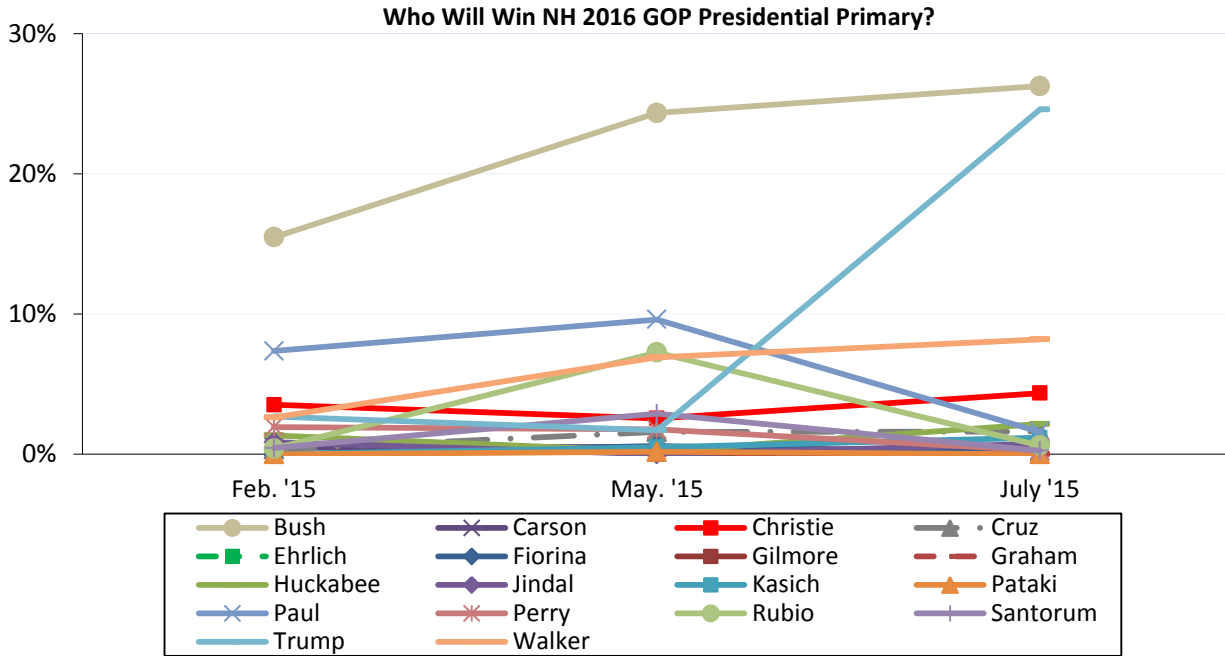
Republican Net Electability

Walker tops the field in net electability (the percentage who support a candidate minus the percent who would not vote for that candidate), with +11%. Kasich (+6%), Paul (+5%), Cruz (+4%), Carson (+4%), Rubio (+2%), Christie (+2%), and Jindal (+2%) all have positive net electability scores. Fiorina (+0%), Santorum (0%), Ehrlich (+0%), Gilmore (+0%), Huckabee (+0%), Perry (-1%), Pataki (-2%), Graham (-4%), Bush (-5%), and Trump (-5%) have neutral or negative net electability scores.



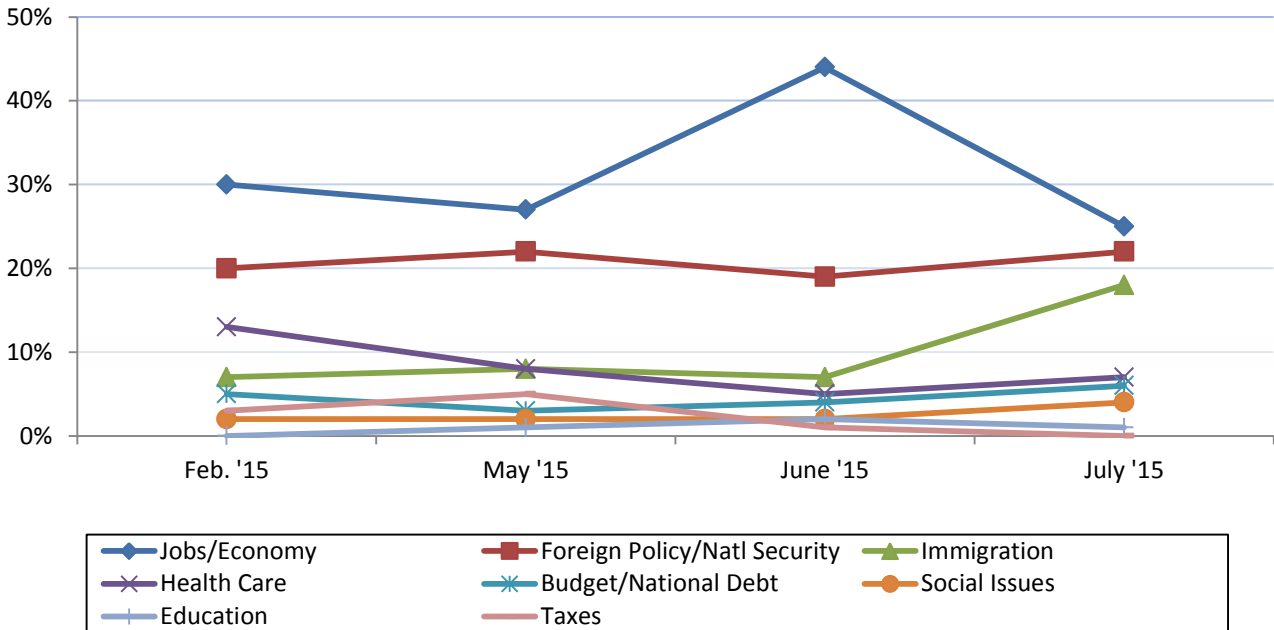
Who Will Win NH Primary?

When asked who they think will win the 2016 New Hampshire Republican Primary, 26% think Bush will win, 25% think Trump will win, 8% think Walker will win, and 4% think Christie will win.



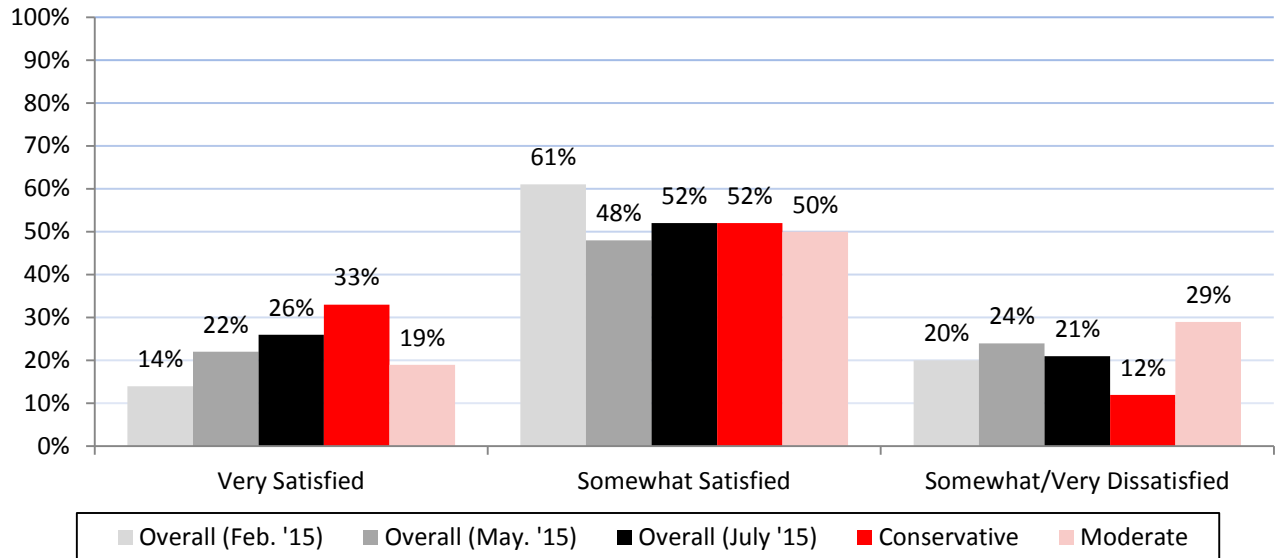
Most Important Issue To Primary Vote

When asked what issue is the most important in deciding to vote in the presidential primary, 25% of likely Republican Primary voters cite jobs or the economy, 22% cite foreign policy or national security, 18% cite immigration, 7% cite health care, 6% cite the budget or national debt, 4% cite social issues, and 1% cite education. The percentage citing immigration as the most important problem has doubled in the past month, likely due to Trump's comments about this issue. Thirty-four percent of Trump supporters cite immigration as the most important issue.



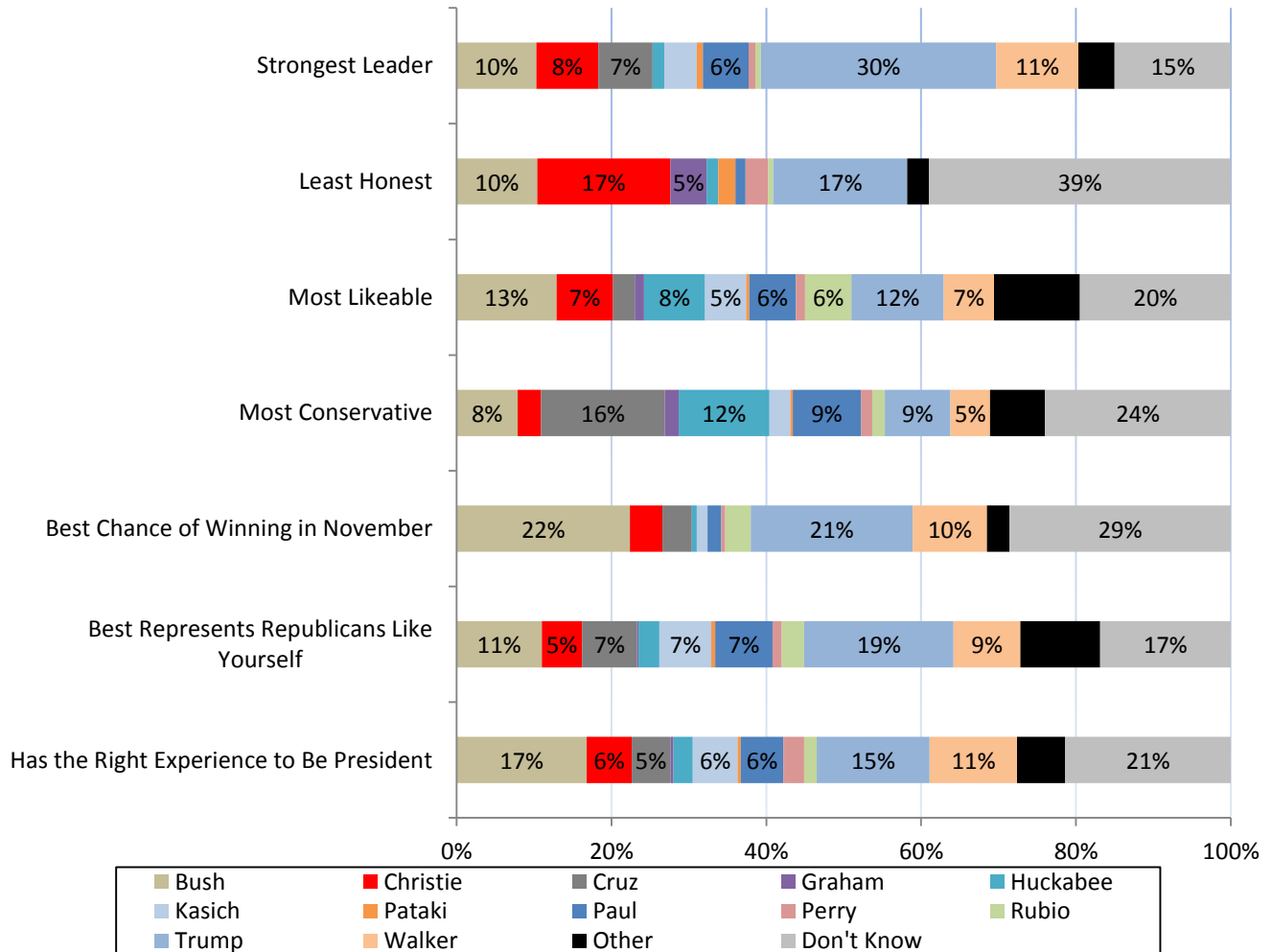
Satisfaction with the Current Primary Field?

Despite so many candidates running, only 26% of Republican primary voters say they are very satisfied with the current field of candidates, 52% are somewhat satisfied, and 21% are unsatisfied. Moderate to liberal Republicans, who make up just under half of the Republican primary electorate, are more likely to be dissatisfied with the current field than conservatives.

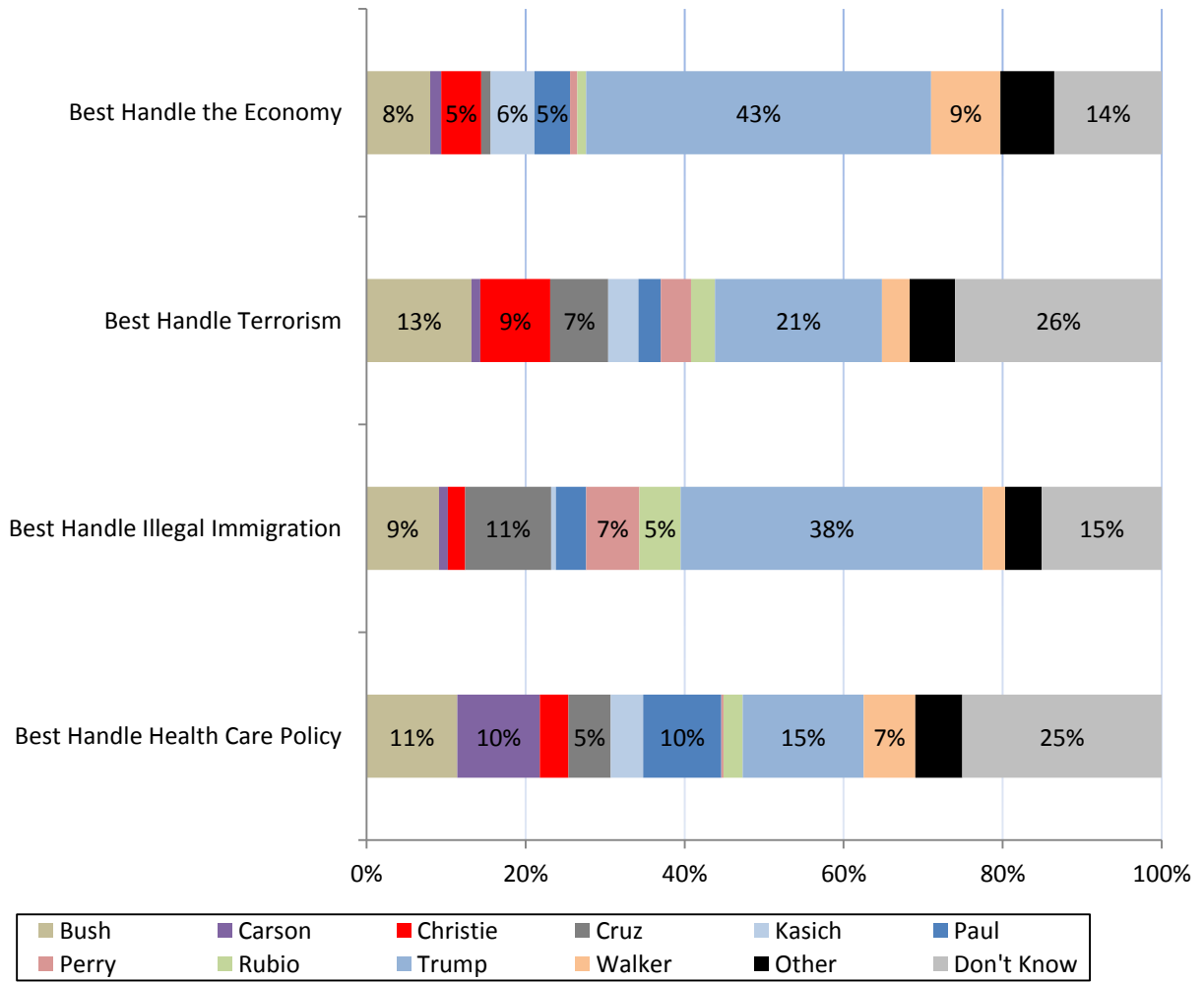


Candidate Qualities

Voters were asked to identify which candidate best exemplified a number of candidate qualities. Thirty percent (30%) of likely Republican Primary voters chose Trump as the strongest leader, 11% chose Walker, 10% chose Bush and 15% were unsure. Seventeen percent (17%) chose Trump as the least honest, 17% chose Christie, 10% chose Bush and 39% were unsure. Thirteen percent (13%) chose Bush as the most likeable, 12% chose Trump, 8% chose Huckabee and 20% were unsure. Sixteen percent (16%) chose Cruz as the most conservative, 12% chose Huckabee, 9% chose Paul, 9% chose Trump and 24% were unsure. Twenty-two percent (22%) chose Bush as having the best chance to win the general election in November, 21% chose Trump, 10% chose Walker and 29% unsure. Nineteen percent (19%) chose Trump as being the candidate who best represents Republicans like themselves, 11% chose Bush, 9% chose Walker and 17% were unsure. Seventeen percent (17%) chose Bush as having the right experience to be President, 15% chose Trump, 11% chose Walker and 21% were unsure.



Voters were also asked to name the candidate best able to handle several policy issues and Trump leads the field in each. Forty-three percent (43%) of likely Republican Primary voters chose Trump as the candidate to best handle the economy, 9% chose Walker and 8% chose Bush and 13% were unsure. Thirty-eight (38%) percent chose Trump as the candidate to best handle illegal immigration, 11% chose Cruz, 9% chose Bush and 15% are unsure. Twenty-one percent (21%) chose Trump as the candidate to best handle terrorism, 13% chose Bush, 9% chose Christie and 26% are unsure. Fifteen percent (15%) chose Trump as the candidate to best handle health care policy, 11% chose Bush, 10% chose Carson, 10% chose Paul and 25% are unsure.



Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center and funded by WMUR-TV, Manchester, NH. Seven hundred and twenty-two (722) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between July 22 and July 30, 2015. The margin of sampling error is +/- 3.6 percent for the entire sample. Included were three hundred nine (309) likely 2016 Republican Primary voters (MSE = +/-5.6), two hundred seventy-six (276) likely 2016 Democratic Primary voters (MSE = +/-5.9), and six hundred and fifty-two (652) likely 2016 presidential election voters (MSE = +/- 3.8). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.1% and 1.1% for the sample of likely 2016 general election voters.

The random sample used in the WMUR Granite State Poll was purchased from Scientific Telephone Samples (STS), Foothill Ranch, CA. STS screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
