NH FAVORS ONE CASINO AT ROCKINGHAM PARK, LITTLE CONCERN THAT NH IMAGE WOULD SUFFER

DURHAM, NH – There is modest support for opening a gambling casino in New Hampshire. A single casino at Rockingham Park is the preferred location. And although few New Hampshire adults regularly visit casinos outside of the state, nearly half state residents say they would visit a casino on the Massachusetts border at least once a year.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and seven (507) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between April 4 and April 9, 2013. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent.

Support for a NH Casino

As reported Friday, there is modest support for legalizing casino gambling in New Hampshire. Almost two-thirds (63%) favor a casino similar to the bill passed by the Senate (44% strongly favor and 19% favor it somewhat), 30% oppose (23% strongly and 7% somewhat), and 7% are neutral or unsure.

No N.I.M.B.Y.

If a casino is opened in New Hampshire, it will have to have the support of local residents, and concerns have been raised that local residents might not want a casino built in their town. However, most New Hampshire residents favor having a casino in their town if they received a percentage of the revenues – 53% favor (33% strongly and 20% somewhat), 42% oppose (32% strongly and 10% somewhat), and 5% are neutral or unsure. Only 17% of casino supporters say they would oppose a casino if it were in their town.

Union households and young adults are most likely to favor a casino in their town while Republicans, conservatives, regular church goers, people with post graduate educations, and Seacoast residents are most likely to oppose a casino in their town.

When asked where they would like a casino to be built, 57% say they would like it to be built at Rockingham Park in Salem, 22% prefer somewhere else and 21% are unsure. Residents of the North Country and the Connecticut River valley are most likely to want a casino built somewhere other than Rockingham Park. Among casino supporters, 65% say they want the casino to be built at Rockingham Park.

While the legislation being considered in Concord describes only one casino, there have been people who have supported more than one casino being built. There is some support for more than one casino in New Hampshire – 47% prefer only one casino but 32% would like more than one, 18% don't want any casinos, and 4% are unsure. Among casino supporters, 44% prefer more than one casino, 51% want only one casino, and 4% are unsure.

Impact of Massachusetts Casino

In 2011, Massachusetts passed legislation to open three casinos in that state and is in the process of licensing construction. When asked if imminent casinos in Massachusetts impact their support for a casino, 22% of New Hampshire residents say it makes them more likely to favor a casino in New Hampshire, 11% say this makes them less likely to favor a New Hampshire casino, 67% say it makes no difference to their position and 1% are unsure. One-third of casino supporters (33%) say that Massachusetts casinos make them more likely to favor opening a casino in New Hampshire.

Impact on NH Image

Two-thirds of New Hampshire adults (66%) think that opening a casino in New Hampshire will have little impact on New Hampshire's image, 21% think it will harm New Hampshire's image (11% say "a lot" and 10% say "somewhat"), 12% think it will improve New Hampshire's image (6% say "a lot" and 6% say "somewhat") and 2% are unsure.

Majorities of all groups say that a casino would have little impact on New Hampshire's image. However, 58% of casino opponents think a New Hampshire casino will hurt the state's image.

Casino Usage

Most New Hampshire adults are not regular casino goers, 75% say they have never been to a casino in the last year, 13% say they have gone once, 4% twice, and 8% say they have gone three or more times. Seventy-one percent of casino supporters and 80% of casino opponents say they have not gone to a casino in the past year.

But when asked if they would visit a casino in New Hampshire along the Massachusetts border, only 52% say they would never go, 18% said they would go once a year, 11% say they would go twice a year, 10% say they would go three to five times a year, 7% say they would go six or more times a year, and 2% are unsure. One third of casino supporters (34%) and 81% of casino opponents say they would never visit a New Hampshire casino.

NHPR listeners, people with post-graduate educations, regular church goers, and residents of the North country and the Seacoast are most likely to say they would never go to a New Hampshire casino.

Young adults and people without college degrees are most likely to say they would go to a New Hampshire casino.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and seven (507) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between April 4 and April 9, 2013. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
