### BUSH HEADING OUT OF OFFICE WITH DISMAL APPROVAL RATINGS IN NH

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DURHAM, NH – Beset by economic problems at home and lingering wars abroad, President George W. Bush continues to be very unpopular in New Hampshire.

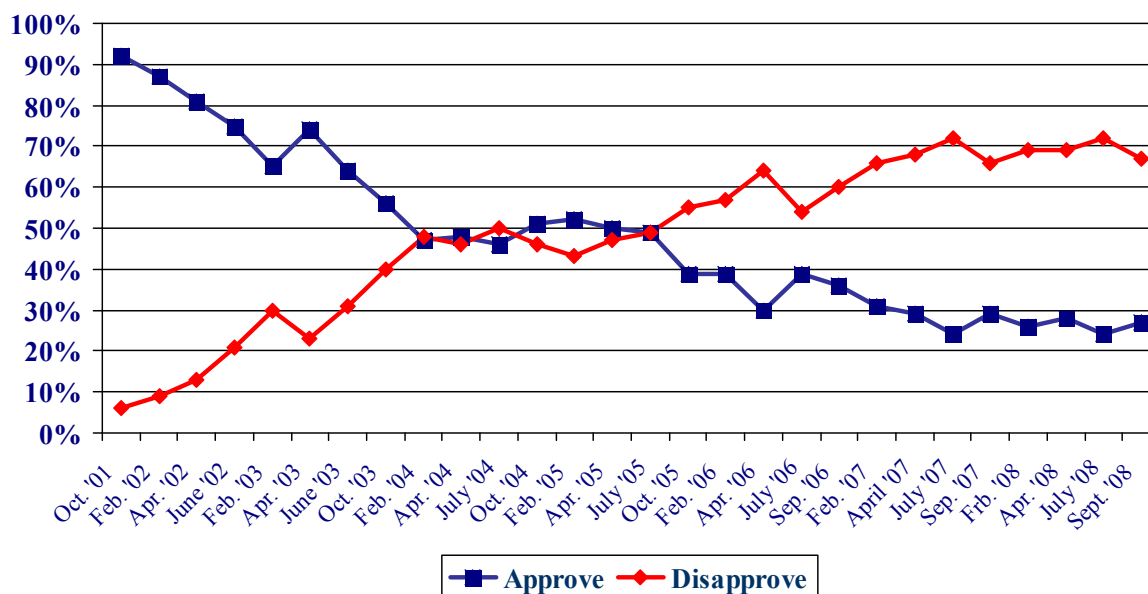
These findings are based on the latest **WMUR / Granite State Poll**,\* sponsored by WMUR-TV and conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred fifty (550) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by telephone between September 14 and September 21, 2008. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.2%.

#### Presidential Approval

There are only 3 months left in the presidency of George W. Bush and he continues to maintain abysmally low approval ratings in New Hampshire. In the most recent WMUR Granite State Poll, only 27% of New Hampshire adults say they approve of the job Bush is doing as president, 67% disapprove, and 6% are neutral. This represents a slight increase since July, but his approval rating remains below 30%. This is close to the average of national presidential polls reported this week on pollster.com which finds 28% nationwide approve of Bush.

Only 54% of Republicans now approve of Bush's performance as President while 92% of Democrats and 75% of political Independents disapprove.

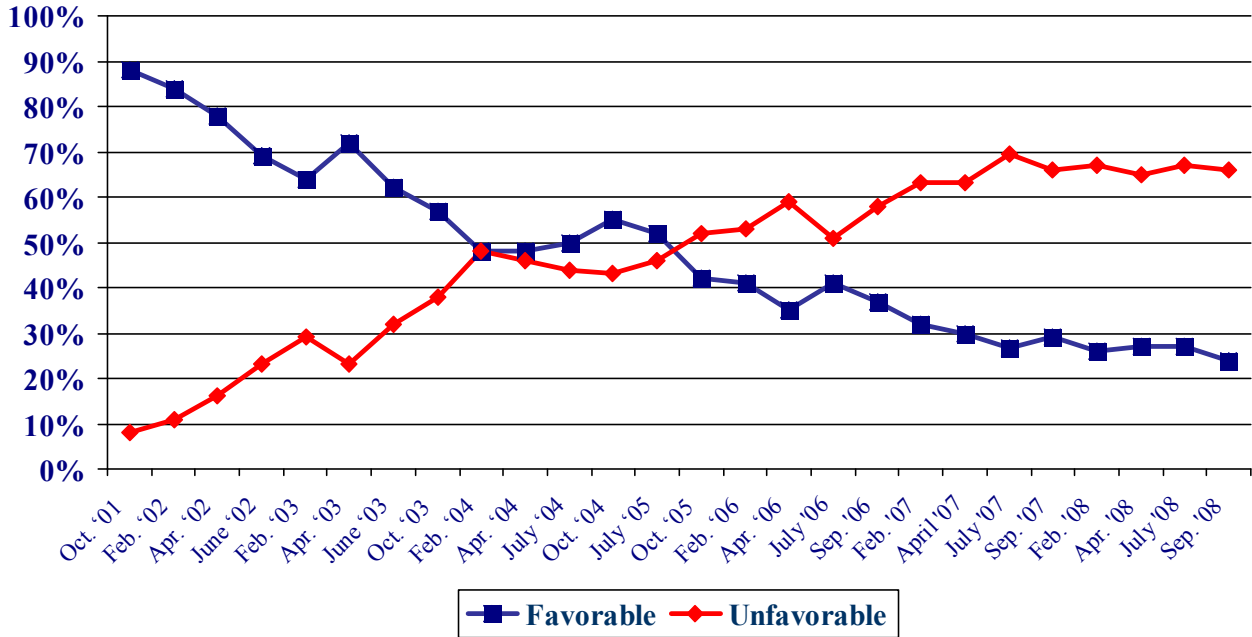
#### Presidential Approval – G.W. Bush

Bush's personal favorability rating is at a record low in New Hampshire. Only 24% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Bush, 66% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 10% are neutral or don't know. Bush's net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion minus the percentage having an unfavorable opinion, is an extremely low -42%. Bush's favorability rating has continued to decline due to a drop in support among Republicans – only 51% of Republicans now say they have a favorable opinion of Bush, down from 66% in a year ago.

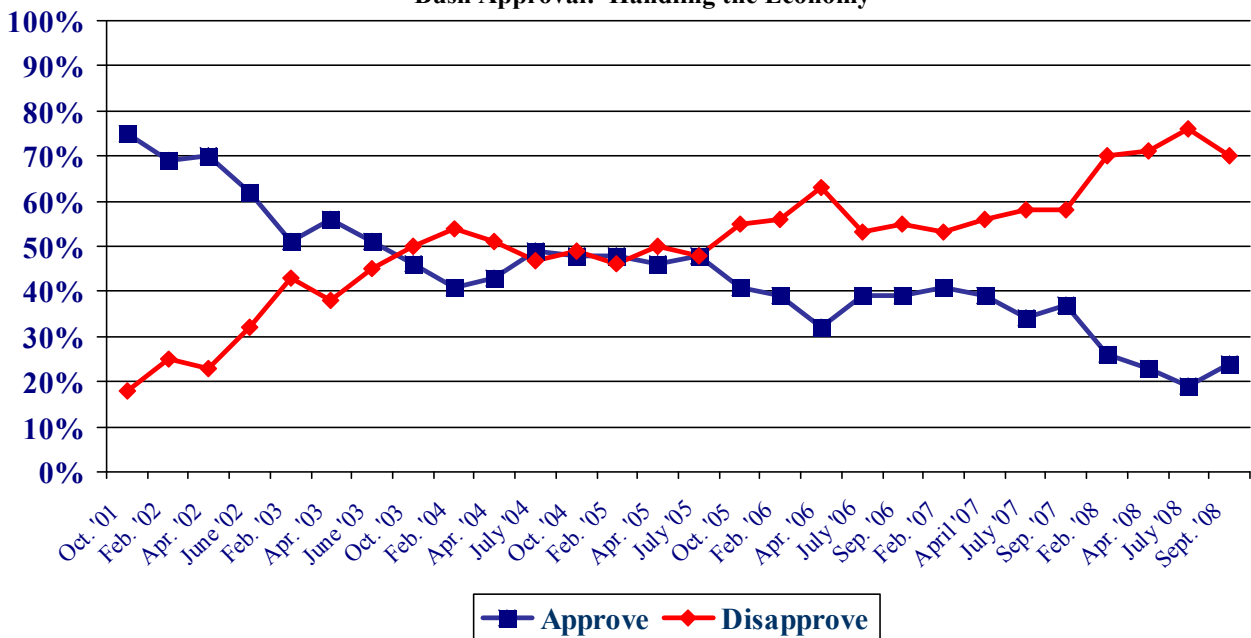
**Favorability Ratings – G.W. Bush**



**Economic Approval Rating**

Despite the market upheavals of recent weeks, there has been a slight uptick in approval for how Bush has handled the economy. Currently, 24% of New Hampshire residents, say they approve of the job President Bush is doing handling the economy, 70% disapprove, and 6% are neutral. The percentage of New Hampshire residents who approve of Bush's handling of the economy had been steadily declining for more than a year.

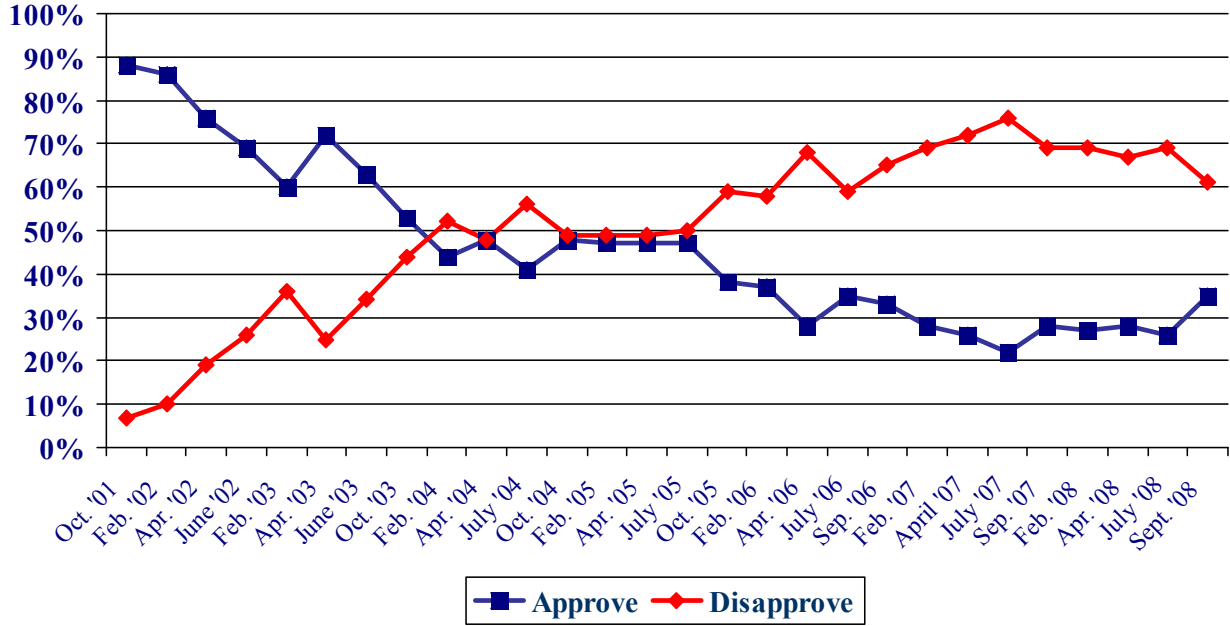
**Bush Approval: Handling the Economy**



## Foreign Affairs

Although approval of Bush's handling of foreign policy has improved slightly in recent months, it continues to be unpopular in New Hampshire. When asked about how the President is handling foreign affairs, only 35% of New Hampshire adults say they approve, 61% disapprove, and 3% are neutral. The percentage who approval of Bush's handling of foreign affairs has increased 9 percentage points since July

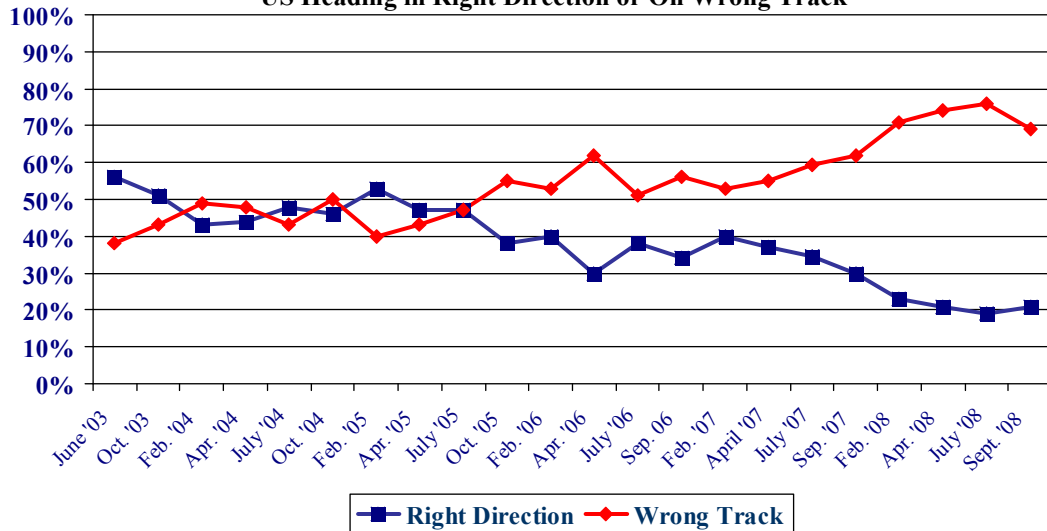
### Bush Approval: Foreign Affairs



## Right Track – Wrong Track

Overall, New Hampshire residents remain pessimistic about the direction the country is heading. Only 21% think things in this country are generally going in the right direction, 69% think things are seriously off on the wrong track, and 10% don't know. Even Republicans are deeply pessimistic with only 41% thinking things are headed in the right direction while only 6% of Democrats and 14% of Independents think things are headed in the right direction.

## Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR / Granite State Poll**, sponsored by WMUR-TV and conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred fifty (550) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by telephone between September 14 and September 21, 2008. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.2 percent.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
