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GOP RACE TIGHTENS

Durham, NH – In the waning days of the New Hampshire campaign, George W. Bush has narrowed John McCain's lead. Al Gore maintains a solid lead over Bill Bradley

These findings are based on the WMUR / FOX News New Hampshire Primary Tracking Poll,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Eight hundred, twenty-seven (827) likely New Hampshire primary voters were interviewed between January 26 and January 29, 2000; 487 likely Republican primary voters and 340 likely Democratic primary voters. The potential sampling error for the survey is $\pm 3.4\%$, the sampling error for the Republican sub-sample is $\pm 4\%$ and $\pm 5\%$ for the Democratic sub-sample.

Republican Primary

George W. Bush has managed to close the gap with John McCain in the final days of the New Hampshire primary campaign. In the most recent WMUR / FOX News tracking poll, 38% of likely Republican primary voters say they plan to vote for McCain, 35% say they will vote for Bush, 15% say they will vote for Steve Forbes, 9% say they will vote for Alan Keyes, less than 1% say they will vote for Gary Bauer, 1% favor other candidates, and 2% are undecided. The three percentage point gap between Bush and McCain stood at 8% in yesterday's WMUR / FOX News tracking poll.

Bush's increase has come largely from registered Republicans who are increasingly breaking for Bush. In the most recent poll, 44% of registered Republicans say they will vote for Bush, 29% say they will vote for McCain, 14% will vote for Forbes, and 10% will vote for Keyes. In earlier tracking polls, Bush has been averaging a slim 3% lead over McCain among registered Republicans.

McCain continues to lead Bush among "independents", those undeclared voters who plan to vote in the Republican primary. Currently, 54% of these independents say they will vote for McCain, 18% will vote for Bush, 16% will vote for Forbes, and 7% will vote for Keyes. McCain has consistently received more than 50% of the independent vote in tracking polls.

Turnout will be critical in the Republican primary and both Bush and McCain have been working very hard to make sure their supporters turn out and vote. Bush has somewhat of an edge in turnout because registered Republicans, among whom Bush is leading, historically have voted at a much higher rate than independents. Because of this historical trend, McCain will have to see very high turnout among independents to overcome Bush's turnout advantage.

Democratic Primary

In the Democratic race, Al Gore is maintaining his lead over Bill Bradley. Currently, 53% of likely Democratic primary voters say they will vote for Gore, 42% will vote for Bradley, and 4% remain undecided.

Gore leads Bradley 56% to 39% among registered Democrats. The two Democrats are tied among undeclared voters who plan to vote in the Democratic primary.

Gore has the advantage in turnout as well because registered Democrats, like registered Republicans, have historically voted at higher rates than independents.

Independents

Undeclared voters, or "independents" can vote in either primary, but a more plan to vote in the Republican primary than in the Democratic primary. Currently, 64% of the independent voters who will vote Tuesday say they will vote in the Republican primary and 38% will vote in the Democratic primary.
