#### APPROVAL OF TRUMP STABLE, INCREASES AMONG CORE CONSTITUENCIES

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DURHAM, NH – Four in ten New Hampshire residents approve of Donald Trump's performance as President, largely unchanged over the past year. Approval of Trump has increased over the past year among core groups of supporters such as conservative radio listeners and self-described conservatives. Granite Staters continue to give Trump higher marks for his handling of the economy than his handling of foreign affairs, approval of which is at its lowest point since February 2018.


These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll\***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred forty-nine (549) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between April 10 and April 18, 2019. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.2 percent.

#### **Presidential Approval**

Forty-one percent of New Hampshire residents approve of Donald Trump's performance as President, 54% disapprove, and 5% don't know or are unsure. Trump's net approval rating among Granite Staters (-13%) has slightly declined over the past six months, falling from -6% in October 2018.

"Support for Trump has remained remarkably consistent over the past year," said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center.
"There has been enough positive and negative news about Trump to provide arguments for both his supporters and his opponents."


### **Presidential Approval - Donald Trump**


Approval of President Trump remains closely tied to partisanship. Eighty-one percent of Republicans approve of Trump's job performance, 36% of Independents approve, while just 6% of Democrats approve. Support for Trump among these groups is largely unchanged since February and since Trump's inauguration. The proportion of self-described conservatives who approve of Trump's performance (88%) has reached an all-time high while only 7% of self-described liberals approve. Nearly all conservative radio listeners (99%) approve of Trump's performance.

Conservative radio listeners, those who voted for Trump in 2016, self-described conservatives, gun owners, those who attend religious services once a week or more, North Country residents, and men are most likely to approve of Trump's performance. Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-described liberals and moderates, Seacoast residents, NHPR listeners, those with a college degree or more education, and those aged 18 to 34 are least likely to approve of Trump's performance. Over the past year, approval of Trump's performance has increased most among conservative radio listeners and self-described conservatives, while approval has fallen most among *Boston Globe* readers, those who attend religious services once or twice a month, and Seacoast residents.



On a scale where "strongly approve" equals 7 and "strongly disapprove" equals 1, Trump's average approval rating (3.5) has slightly declined for the second consecutive quarter and is nearly the same as his predecessor, Barack Obama (3.6), in the tenth quarter of his presidency.

## Presidential Average Approval Score by Quarters Into Presidency - Donald Trump, Barack Obama & George W. Bush




#### **Favorability Ratings - President Donald Trump**

Trump's personal favorability rating among New Hampshire adults has remained stable since April 2018. Trump is currently viewed favorably by 41% of Granite Staters, 52% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 7% are neutral or don't know enough to say.

Conservative radio listeners, those who voted for Trump in 2016, self-described conservatives, gun owners, those who attend religious services once a week or more, North Country residents, and those with a high school education or less are most likely to have a favorable opinion of Trump. Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-described liberals, NHPR listeners, Seacoast residents, college graduates, those aged 18 to 34, and those who attend religious services once or twice a month are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Trump.


#### **Favorability - Donald Trump**



Trump's net favorability rating, the percentage of people who have a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion, is -11%. Trump's popularity among Republicans (+68%) and Democrats (-84%) has remained largely steady since he was elected, though his popularity among Independents (-14%) has slightly improved since February (-25%).


#### **Net Favorability Rating - Donald Trump**

Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)




Approval of President Trump's handling of the economy among New Hampshire residents is largely unchanged over the past year: 51% of respondents currently approve of his handling of the economy, 44% disapprove, and 5% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know.





The vast majority of Republicans (91%) approve of Trump's handling of the economy, while just over half of Independents (54%) agree. Very few Democrats (13%) approve of Trump's handling of the economy. Opinion among all three of these groups is largely unchanged since February.

## **Economic Approval - by Party ID**




#### **Foreign Affairs Approval**

Granite Staters' opinion of Trump's handling of foreign affairs is unchanged over the past year and continues to lag behind approval of his handling of the economy. Currently, 38% of New Hampshire adults approve of how Trump is handling foreign affairs, 56% disapprove, and 7% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. Approval of Trump's handling of foreign affairs (38%) is at its lowest point since February 2018 (34%).


Overall, 38% of New Hampshire residents approve of Trump's handling of the economy and his handling of foreign affairs, 9% approve of his handling of the economy but disapprove on foreign affairs, less than 1% approve of his handling of foreign affairs but disapprove on the economy, and 44% disapprove of his handling of both.

# **Trump Approval - Foreign Affairs**




Three-quarters of Republicans (76%) approve of Trump's performance on foreign affairs, but only 33% of Independents agree and approval among Democrats remains very low (5%). Approval of Trump's handling of foreign affairs among Republicans (76%) is at its lowest point since February 2017 (71%).

#### Foreign Affairs Approval - by Party ID




#### **US Heading in Right Direction or On Wrong Track**

Overall, New Hampshire residents continue to be largely pessimistic about the direction of the country. Thirty-eight percent of New Hampshire residents think things in the country are going in the right direction while 56% say things are seriously off on the wrong track and 5% don't know or are unsure. Feelings on this question are largely unchanged over the past year.

Just over two-thirds of Republicans (68%) believe the country is headed in the right direction but only 35% of Independents and 13% of Democrats agree. Optimism among Republicans has declined for the third consecutive quarter and is well below an all-time high of 83% in February 2018.



#### **Granite State Poll Methodology**

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred forty-nine (549) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between April 10 and April 18, 2019. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.2 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Scientific Telephone Samples (STS), Rancho Santo Margarita, CA. STS screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers. When a landline number is reached, the interviewer randomly selects a member of the household by asking to speak with the adult currently living in the household who has had the most recent birthday. This selection process ensures that every adult (18 years of age or older) in the household has an equal chance of being included in the survey.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
