Perfect Storm

- •Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 2008- August 1st, 2009
- •It is estimated that over **2 million veterans** from Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) and Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) will enroll in postsecondary education in the coming years (Madaus, 2009).
- •18% Private University
- USC Veteran Enrollment:
 - •111-130 (2008 Pre Post 9/11 Bill)
 - •255 (Fall 2009)
 - 248 (spring 2010)
 - 325 (Fall 2010)
 - •400 approx. (Spring 2011)

Health & Disability

- Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)10-30%
- Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) 11-20%
- Veterans with multiple deployments: risk of mental health problems increases 60% with each consecutive deployment (Coleman, 2008)
- "Returning veterans will have a wide range of medical diagnoses and related health problems that will have a temporary or chronic impact on their living, working, learning, and relationship functions." (Church, 2009)





Health & Disability

- Depression
- Attempted suicide/ suicide (risk of suicide nearly twice the nonveteran population, a rate so high it has been labeled an "epidemic")
- Learning disability
- Sensory impairments (hearing, vision, etc)
- Burns
- Physical Impairments

USC Student Veteran Interviews -Summer 2009

Participant Demographics

USC:

- 4 undergraduate transfer students1 graduate student
- Marine corps
- Latin American
- Engineering, Economics (2), Public Policy & Planning, Social Work

Vets Panel:

- 6 students in city colleges (Pasadena City College, Long Beach City College, Santa Monica City College, LA City College)
- 5 Marines, 1 Airforce
- 3 Latin American, 3 Caucasian





- Social Support and Networking with Vets
 - Student veteran organization
 - Speakers and events targeted to student vets
 - 1st year mentor at USC







- Visibility of Resources
 - Improved internet resources
 - Veteran website: sait.usc.edu/ca/tvsp
 - Veteran center- central location for resources
 - Orientation session for Veterans or information packet at orientation







- Workshops or classes for Veterans
 - "How to translate what you have learned in the military to everyday life"
 - Transition course- similar to "Boots to books"







- Increased Recruitment of Veterans
 - Leadership skills
 - Experience
 - Diversity –22 %African-American, 11 % Latino, 4% Asian, 3% other (NCD, 2009)
 - Veterans had more interactions with students of different races/ethnicities than non vets and more conversations with people of different religion/political beliefs/personality than non vets

 - More information on scholarships
 - Yellow Ribbon Program-
 - Participants: Occupational Therapy, Rossier, School of Social Work, Marshall
 - The VA will match the amount given
 - Work study positions for veteran students





- Mental Health Services
 - Resources identified at Orientation
 - Veteran counselor at Counseling Services
 - PTSD specialty/ experience with veteran needs





- Faculty Education & Support
 - Disability related issues
 - Hypervigilance (PTSD)
 - War topics may trigger PTSD / anger
 - Distraction free environment for learning
 - Support of Faculty Veterans- symbol to identify as veteran





- Lifestyle Needs
 - Exercise and Physical Fitness
 - Physical training class geared for veterans
 - Substance Use
 - Marriage/ family counseling
 - Job Skills





Lifestyle Needs

- Time Management
- Money Management
- Techniques to handle stress
- Cooking
- Reestablishing identity: hobbies, goals
