The goal of the Scholarly and Creative Works Conference aligns with Dominican's mission to create and develop meaningful relationships with students and faculty and provide multiple formative learning experiences such as a major research project, an internship, a service learning program, or other forms of applied learning.

The conference began April 23 with a welcoming address by Dominican President Mary B. Marcy in Angelico Hall at 4:30 p.m. followed by a keynote address by Dr. Tricia Rose, Africana Studies professor at Brown University and director of the university's Center for the Study of Race and Ethnicity in America.

Beginning at 6 p.m., oral presentations will be given in several classrooms in Guzman Hall, poster presentations will be displayed in Guzman Lecture Hall, and a reception will be held for the Senior Art Exhibit Opening in Alemany Library for the Department of Art, Art History and Design.
