

INTRODUCTION

This "fact book" has been prepared because of many requests for 1980 population, housing, and farm information for the counties in South Dakota. Requests for an earlier publication based on the 1960 and 1970 U.S. Censuses indicate that South Dakotans feel a very strong need for this type of basic population data to keep abreast of rapid social and economic changes in the state. This is particularly true for those in such positions as community leaders, county agents, educators, legislators, business, professional, and labor leaders. An ever present concern these leaders face is obtaining reliable up-to-date information upon which to make decisions. This is particularly true for information that is readily available in a useful form and permits comparison with other counties and the state. This new publication attempts to perform that kind of service.

The data contained in this publication are based on the most recent official United States Census Reports for South Dakota's population, housing, and farms.¹ The findings for the 1982 Census of Agriculture will be in a new Up-Date when available. The present publication presents information for each county of the state, and the counties are ranked in order to show the relative position of each county with respect to the particular item under consideration. State totals or averages are given so the position of the county can be compared with that of the state as a whole.

Users of census data are cautioned regarding the nature of information in the tables of this publication. Many tables involve use of terms which have special definitions developed by the United States Census Bureau to provide concise, basic definitions of census concepts which appear in their printed reports. Definitions of these concepts (terms) and explanations of tables are provided in the Appendix. Some tables are based on sample data. Samples involve collection of information from a randomly selected portion of the population with the assumption that the characteristics noted in the sample accurately reflect those of the whole population. Persons using sample data in statistical analysis are reminded that caution must be exercised when results are evaluated.

APPENDIX

EXPLANATION OF TABLES

- Table 1. Asterisk(*) on Jackson County: This and following tables indicates Jackson County population combined with Washabaugh County by the U.S. Census, 1979.
- Table 3. Percent Change: Calculated by taking the difference in the numbers for the two years (1970 and 1980) and dividing it by the 1970 figure.
- Table 5. American Indian Population: Number of persons who indicated their race as American Indian.
- Table 6. Urban Population: In 1980, the urban population included all those people living in incorporated and/or census designated places of 2,500 or more inhabitants and other territory, incorporated or unincorporated, included in urbanized areas.
- Table 7. Urban Population: See explanation for table 6.
- Table 8. Rural Population: Includes both farm and residents in places under 2,500 inhabitants and open country.
- Table 9. Rural Nonfarm: In the 1980 Census the rural nonfarm population consists of all the rural population outside the category of rural farm (see definition of rural farm below). Sample data.
- Table 10. Rural Farm: In the 1980 Census the farm population consists of persons living on any place from which \$1,000 or more agricultural products were sold during the census year. Sample data.
- Table 11. Migration: Migration as presented is net migration. Net migration of the population is the balance of out-migration offset by in-migration. Net migration is determined by subtracting the potential 1980 population (1970 population plus births minus deaths) from the actual 1980 Census population. If the potential population is larger than the actual population then we find a negative number indicating the estimated amount of net out-migration. If the actual population is larger than the potential population we find a positive number indicating the estimated amount of net in-migration.
- Table 12. Migration: See explanation for table 11.

- Table 13. Net Migration of Young Adults: Data from Sidney Goss, Ph.D. Dissertation, SDSU, July, 1983.
- Table 16. Rural Farm: See explanation for table 10 (sq. miles of farmland).
- Table 26. Median: A form of "average," the "middle" value, or that value which is exceeded by as many values as it exceeds. It divides the measures into two equal parts such that one-half are larger and one-half are smaller than the "median."
- Table 27. Median: See explanation for table 26.
- Table 28. Index of Aging: A ratio of the old to the young segment of a population. It is a fairly sensitive indicator of the aging process. Calculated by dividing the number of persons 65 years of age and over by those under 15 years of age and multiplying the result by 100.
- Table 29. Young Adult Ratio: A measure which focuses attention on that segment of a population which contains those individuals who are actually (or potentially) in the early stages of the family building process. Calculated by dividing the number of persons 15-34 years of age by the total of those 0-14 years of age and 35 years of age and over, and multiplying the result by 100.
- Table 30. Sex Ratio: Number of males per 100 females.
- Table 31. Sex Ratio: See explanation for table 30.
- Table 32. Youth Dependency Ratio: Based on the fact that there is an approximate lower limit of productive power (age 15 in this instance) and theoretically, all below this limit are economically dependent upon the economically productive proportion of the population. Calculated by dividing the number of people aged 15-64 into the number of people under 15 years of age, and multiplying the result by 100. A ratio of 48 would mean that there are 48 people under the age of 15 for every 100 aged 15-64.
- Table 33. Aged Dependency Ratio: Based on the idea of a theoretical upper limit of productive power (aged 65 in this instance). Individuals above this limit are considered to be economically dependent upon the economically productive proportion of the population. Calculated by dividing the number of those aged 15-64 into the number of people 65 years of age and over, and multiplying the result by 100. A population with an aged dependency ratio of 10 has 10 people 65 years of age and over to every 100 people aged 15-64.

- Table 34. Total Dependency Ratio: Based on the idea that certain age groups in the population are generally productive. Other age groups are generally dependent upon the efforts of the productive group. Of course, the term "dependent" is somewhat arbitrary and there will be exceptions. Nevertheless, it has become customary to refer to the population under 15 and over 65 years of age as the dependent population and the population 15 through 64 years as the productive population. Ratio is calculated by adding the number of inhabitants 0-14 years of age and the number of inhabitants 65 years of age and over and dividing this total by the number of people 15-64 years of age and multiplying the result by 100.
- Table 35. Births: Includes the number of recorded live resident births occurring within the decade April 1, 1970 to April 1, 1980. This information was obtained from the South Dakota Department of Public Health, Office of Vital Statistics.
- Table 36. Deaths: Includes the number of recorded resident deaths occurring within the decade April 1, 1970 to April 1, 1980. This information was obtained from the South Dakota Department of Public Health, Office of Vital Statistics.
- Table 37. Fertility Ratio: Often referred to as the "child-women ratio." A more refined measure of fertility which eliminates the influence of differences in population size and limits fertility to females of child bearing ages. It is based on census data and is calculated by dividing the number of children under 5 years of age by the number of women ages 15 thru 49 and multiplying the result by 1,000.
- Table 38. Fertility Ratio: See explanation for table 37.
- Table 43. Family: A family consists of a householder and one or more other persons living in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption; all persons in a household who are related to the householder are regarded as members of his or her family.
- Table 44. Household: A household, according to the 1980 Census, includes all the persons who occupy a group of rooms or a single room which constitutes a housing unit.
- Table 45. Percent Change: See explanation for table 3.
Household: See explanation for table 44.
- Table 46. Household: See explanation for table 44.

- Table 47. Group Quarters: All persons who are not members of households are regarded as living in group quarters. Group quarters are living arrangements for institutional inmates, or for groups containing five or more persons unrelated to the person in charge, whose quarters are not divided into housing units. Group quarters are located most frequently in institutions, lodging and boarding houses, military barracks, college dormitories, and the like.
- Table 49. Year-Round Housing Units: All occupied units plus vacant units which are intended for year-round use.
- Table 50. Occupied Units: A housing unit is classified as occupied if a person or group of persons are living in it at the time of enumeration or if the occupants are only temporarily absent, for example, on vacation.
- Table 51. Owner Occupied Units: A housing unit is "owner occupied" if the owner or co-owner lives in the unit, even if it is mortgaged or not fully paid for. A cooperative or condominium unit is "owner occupied" only if the owner or co-owner lives in it.
- Table 52. Renter Occupied Units: All occupied housing units not classified as "owner occupied" are classified as "renter occupied," including units rented for cash rent and those occupied without payment of cash rent.
- Table 53. Year-Round Housing Units: See explanation for table 46.
Vacant: A housing unit is vacant if no one is living in it at the time of enumeration, unless its occupants are only temporarily absent.
- Table 54. Occupied Units: See explanation for table 50.
Lacking Some or All Plumbing Facilities: Units lacking toilet facilities, bathing facilities, or hot piped water or any combination of these are classified as lacking some or all plumbing facilities. Also included are units having no piped water inside the structure and units with toilet or bathing facilities which are for the use of the occupants of other housing units.
- Table 55. Median: See explanation for table 26.
Owner Occupied Units: See explanation for table 51.
- Table 56. Median: See explanation for table 26.
Contract Rent: The monthly rent agreed to, or contracted for, regardless of any furnishings, utilities, or services that may be included.
- Table 61. Median: See explanation for table 26. Sample data.

- Table 62. Sample Data. Samples for the 1980 Census are based on two rates. For incorporated places and minor civil division, with fewer than 2,500 persons, one-half of all housing units and persons in group quarters were included. In all other places one-sixth of the housing units or persons were sampled. Nationwide this yielded a sample of 19 percent.
- Table 63. Sample Data. See explanation for table 62.
- Table 64. Poverty Level: The poverty statistics are based on a definition originated by the Social Security Administration in 1964 and subsequently modified by a Federal Interagency Committee. The index provides a range of poverty income cutoffs adjusted by such factors as family size, sex of the family head, number of children under 18 years age, and farm and nonfarm residence. This level is based on 1979 income data and poverty level is based on 1980 cutoffs. Sample data. See explanation for table 62.
- Table 65. Public Assistance Income: This includes cash receipts of payments made under the following public assistance programs: aid to families with dependent children, old age assistance, general assistance, aid to the blind, and aid to the permanently and totally disabled. Sample data. See explanation for table 62.
- Table 66. Poverty Level: See explanation for table 64. Sample data. See explanation for table 62.
- Table 67. Elderly: Persons ages 65 years and over.
Poverty Level: See explanation for table 64. Sample data. See explanation for table 62.
- Table 69. Labor Force: Labor force includes all persons classified as employed or unemployed and also members of the Armed Services on active duty. Employed persons comprise all civilians 16 years of age and over who were at work for pay or profit, or worked without pay for 16 hours or more on a family farm or family business, or those who were with a job but were not working the day of the interview due to weather, industrial dispute, vacation, illness and other personal reasons. Sample data. See explanation for table 62.
- Table 70. Labor Force: See explanation for table 66. Sample data.
- Table 71. Farm: See explanation for table 10.
- Table 72. Farm: See explanation for table 10.

Table 73. Farm Operator: The term "farm operator" is used to designate a person who operated a farm either doing the work himself or directly supervising the work. He may be the owner, a member of the owner's household, a hired manager, or a tenant, renter or sharecropper. In the case of a partnership only one partner is considered as an operator. The number of farm operators is considered to be the same as the number of farms.
