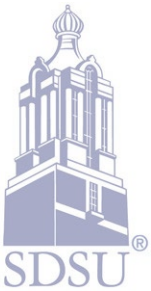

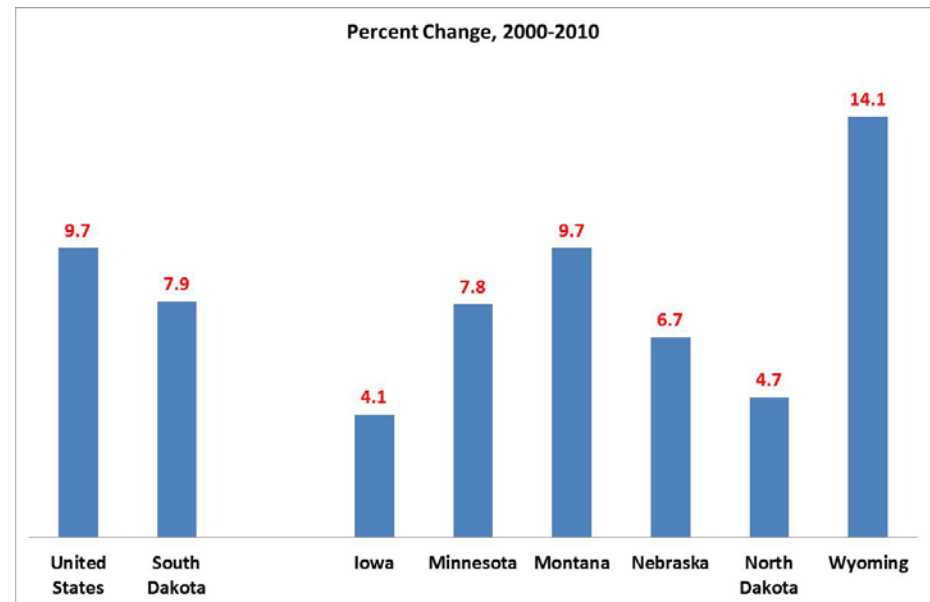

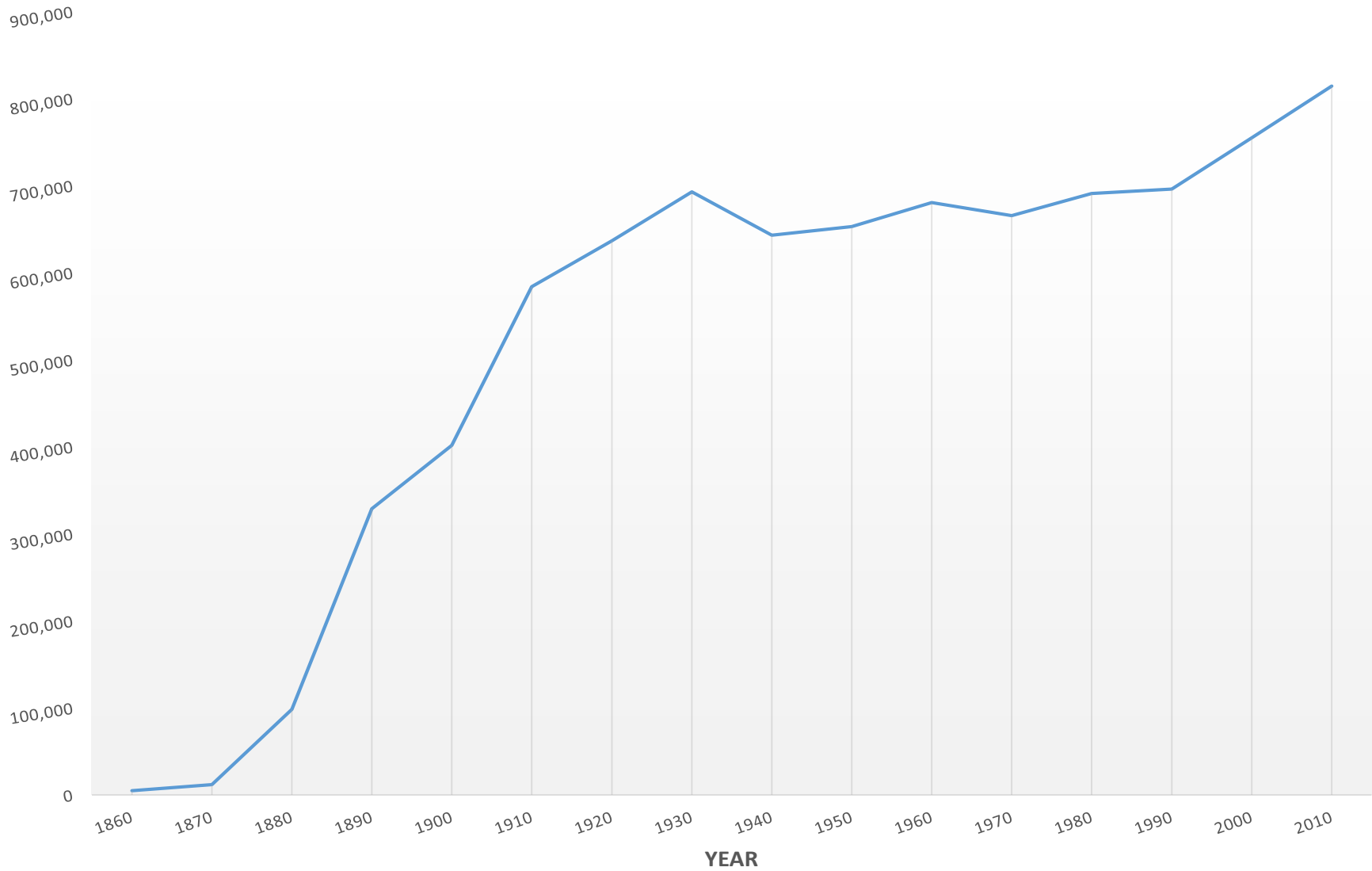
State Population Count

In 2010, South Dakota had a population count of 814,180 persons, an increase of 59,336 or 7.9 percent from the 2000 count of 754,844.

In 2014, South Dakota's population was estimated as 853,175 (an increase of 13 percent since 2000).



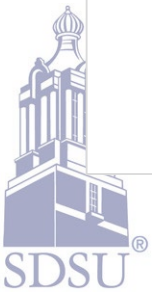
SOUTH DAKOTA - STATE POPULATION GROWTH FROM 1860 TO 2010

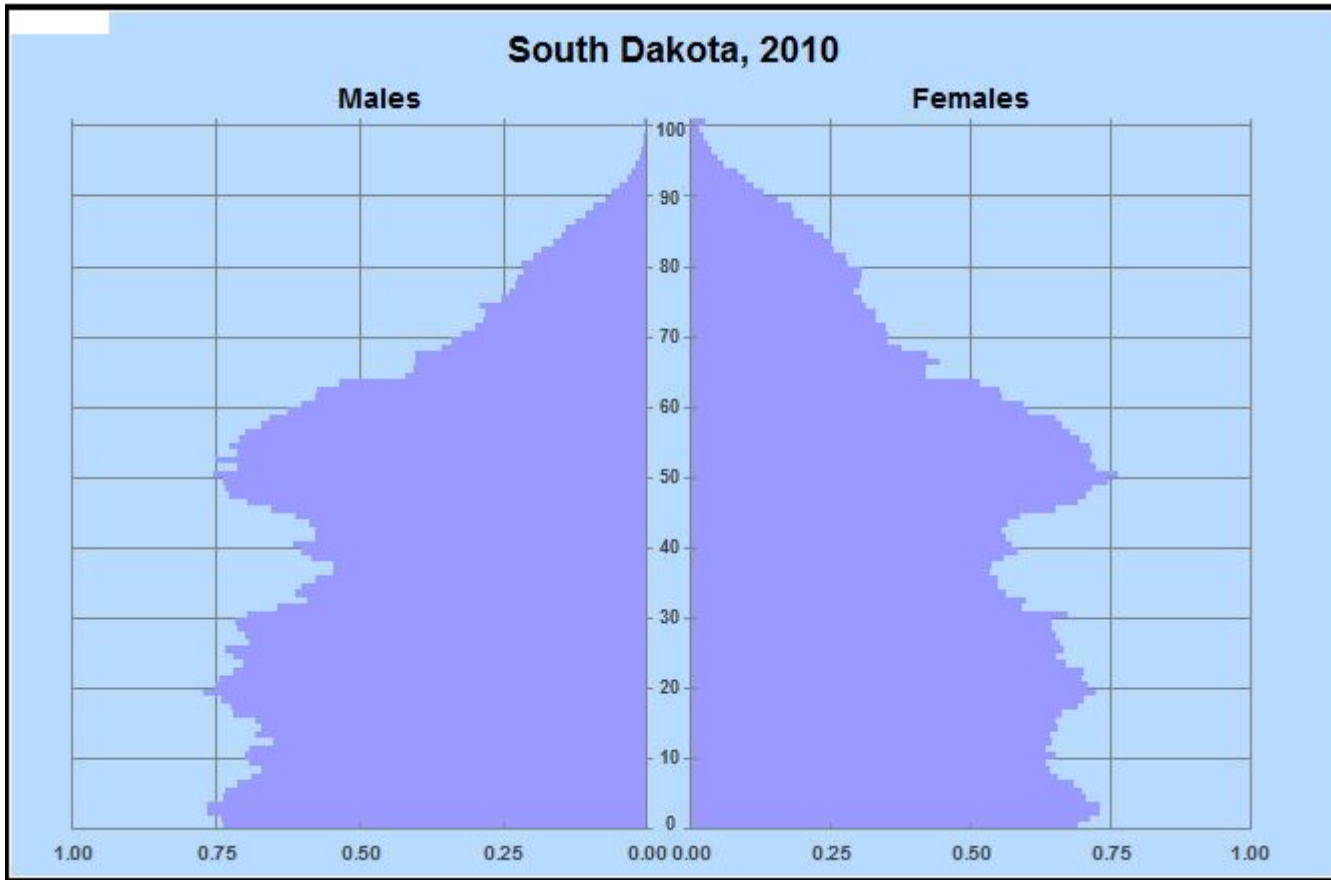

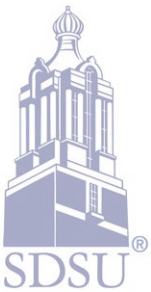

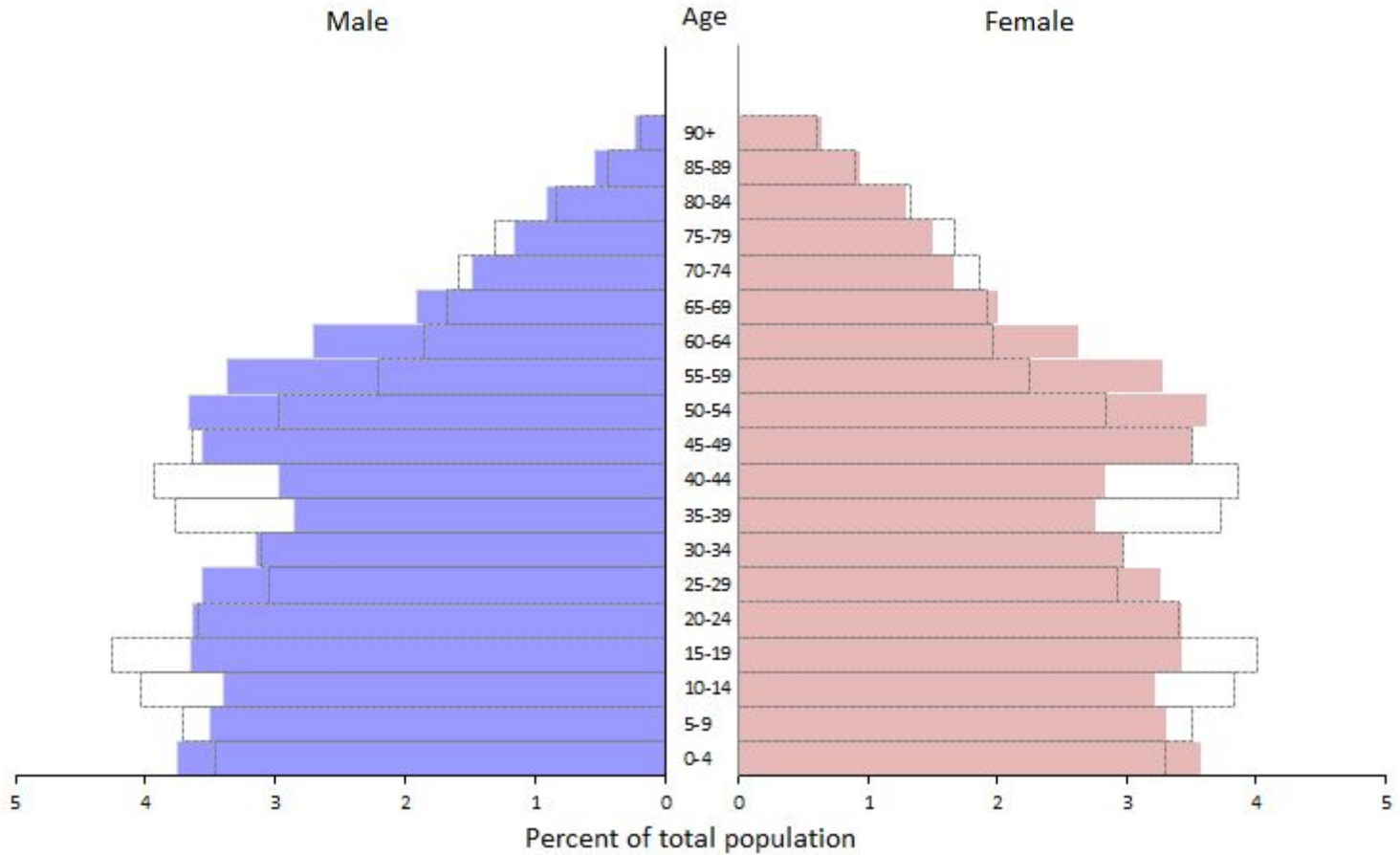

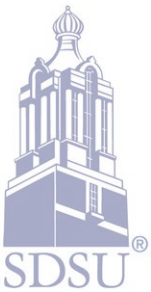

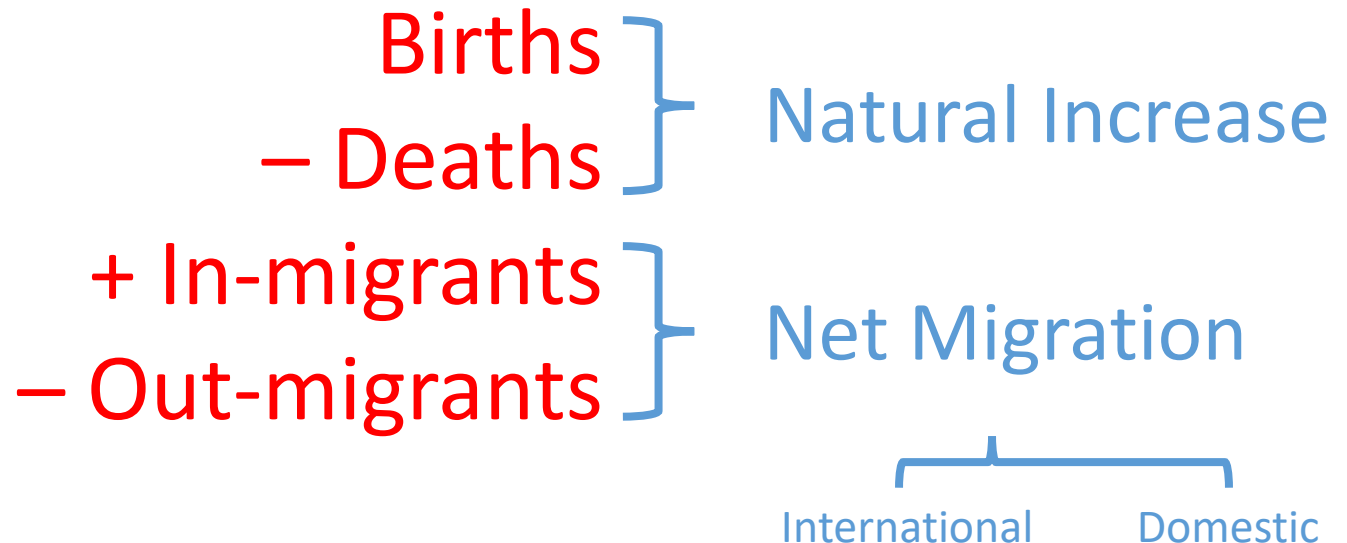

Decompose South Dakota Population Change Between 2010 and 2014

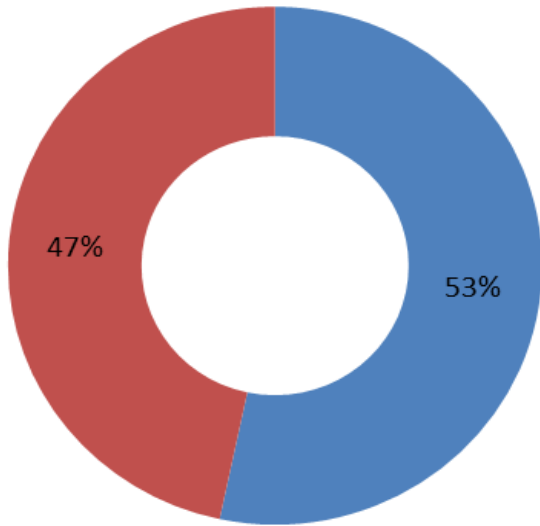

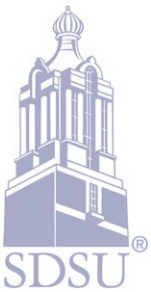

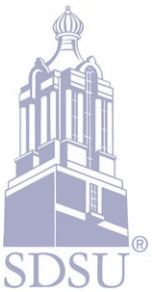

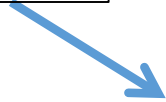

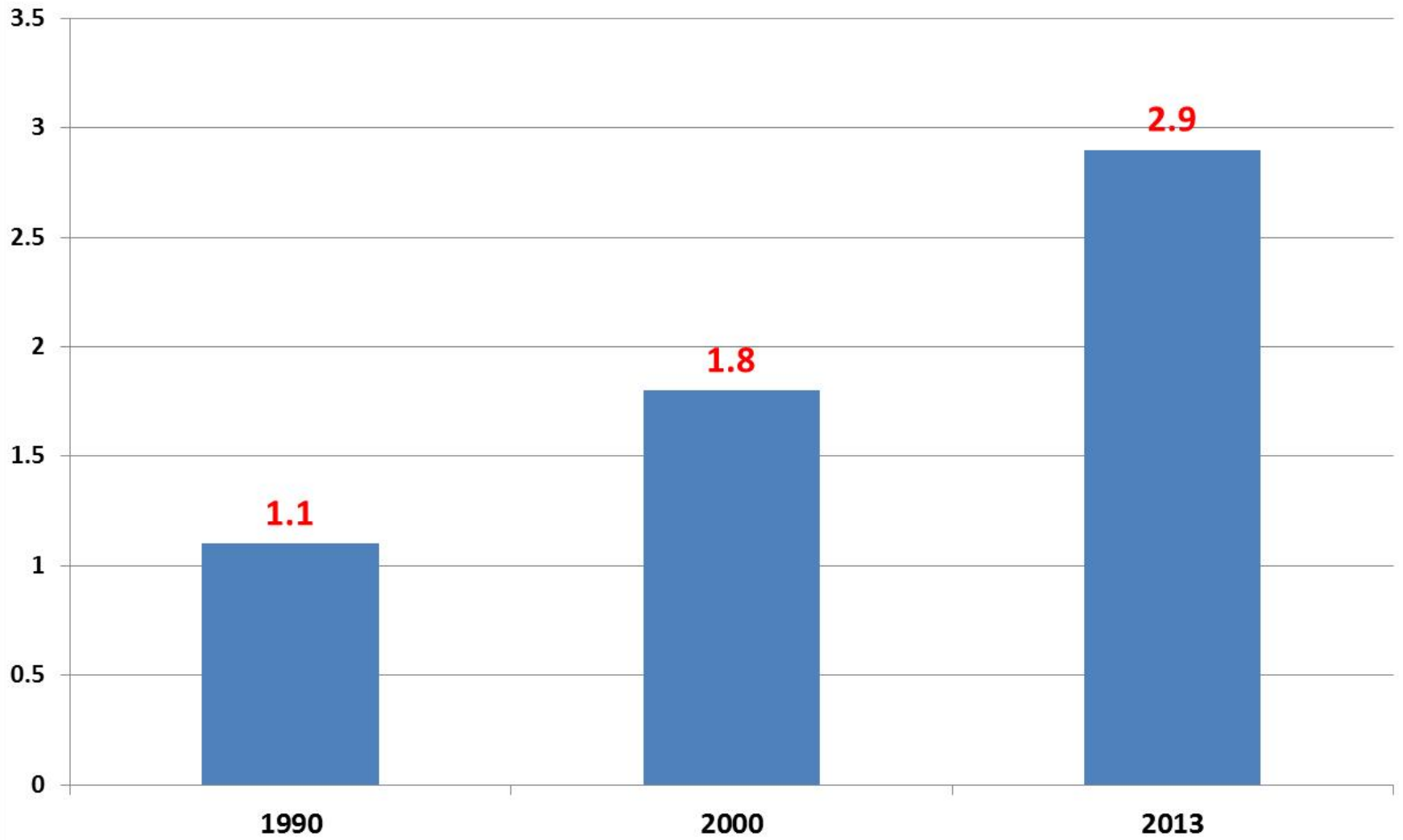

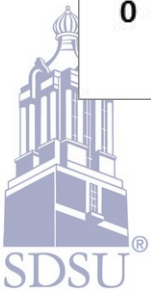

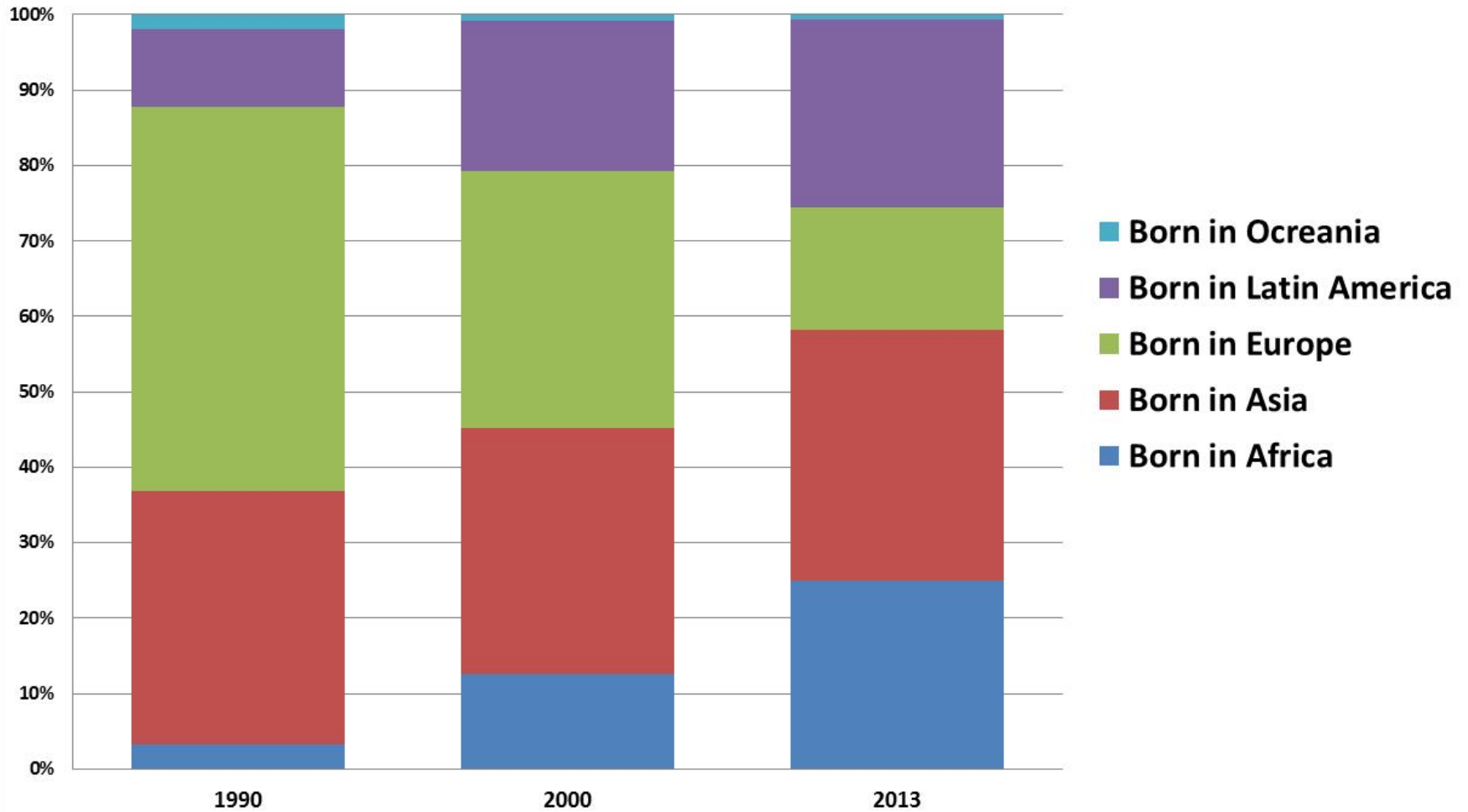
% Foreign Born of the State Population

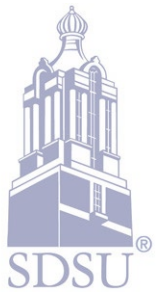

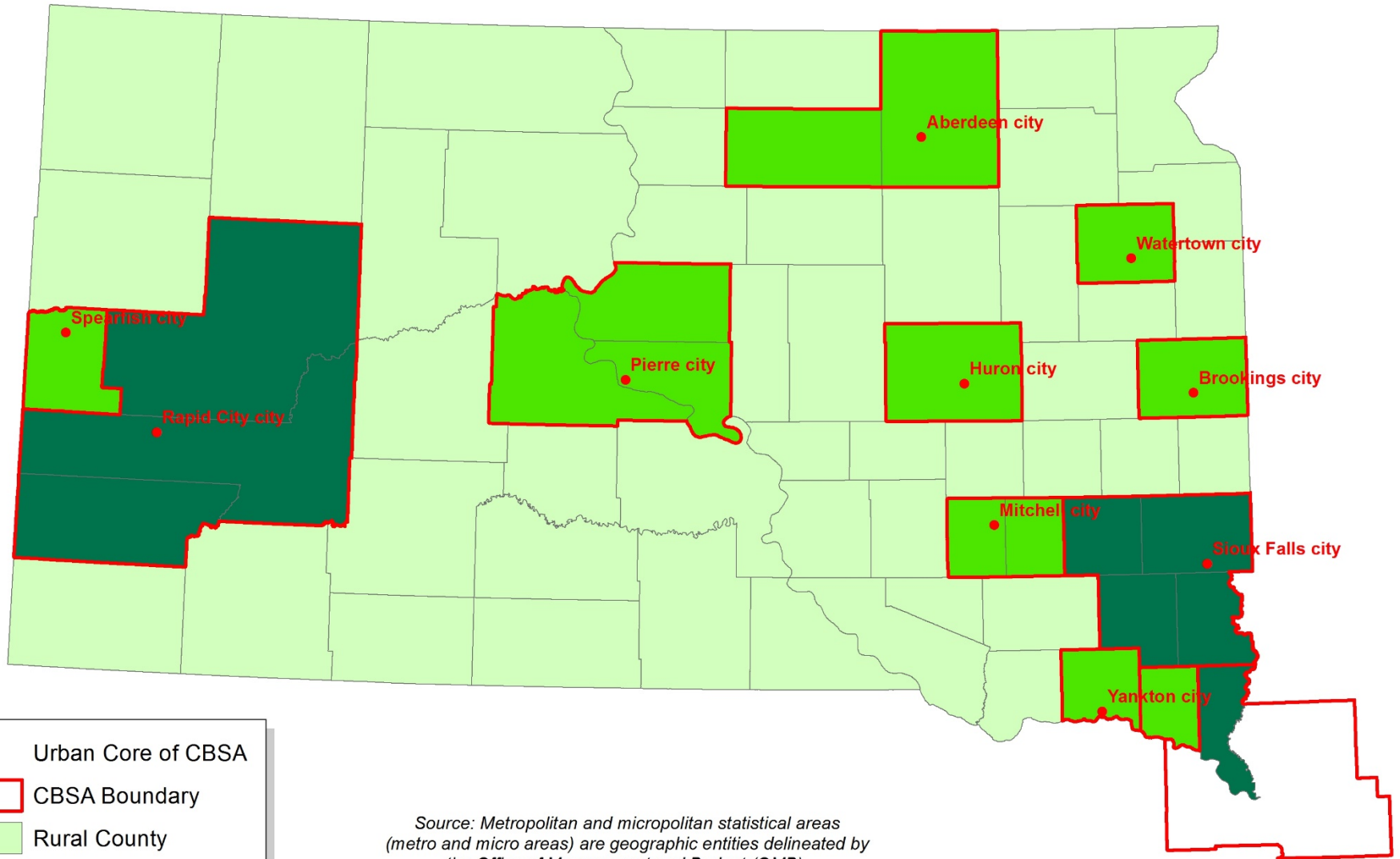


Within-State Heterogeneity

- County: N=66
- County Based Statistical Area (CBSA): metropolitan counties and micropolitan counties
- Metropolitan: Sioux Falls, SD, Rapid City, SD, and partially Sioux City, IA-NE-SD
 - contain at least one urbanized area of 50,000 population or more
 - 8 counties
- Micropolitan: Spearfish, Vermillion, Watertown, Yankton, Pierre, Aberdeen, Mitchell, Huron, Brookings
 - areas with at least one urban cluster of at least 10,000 but less than 50,000 population
 - 13 counties



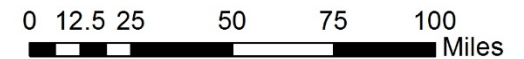
Counties in South Dakota by Metropolitan and Micropolitan Classification



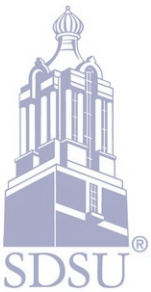
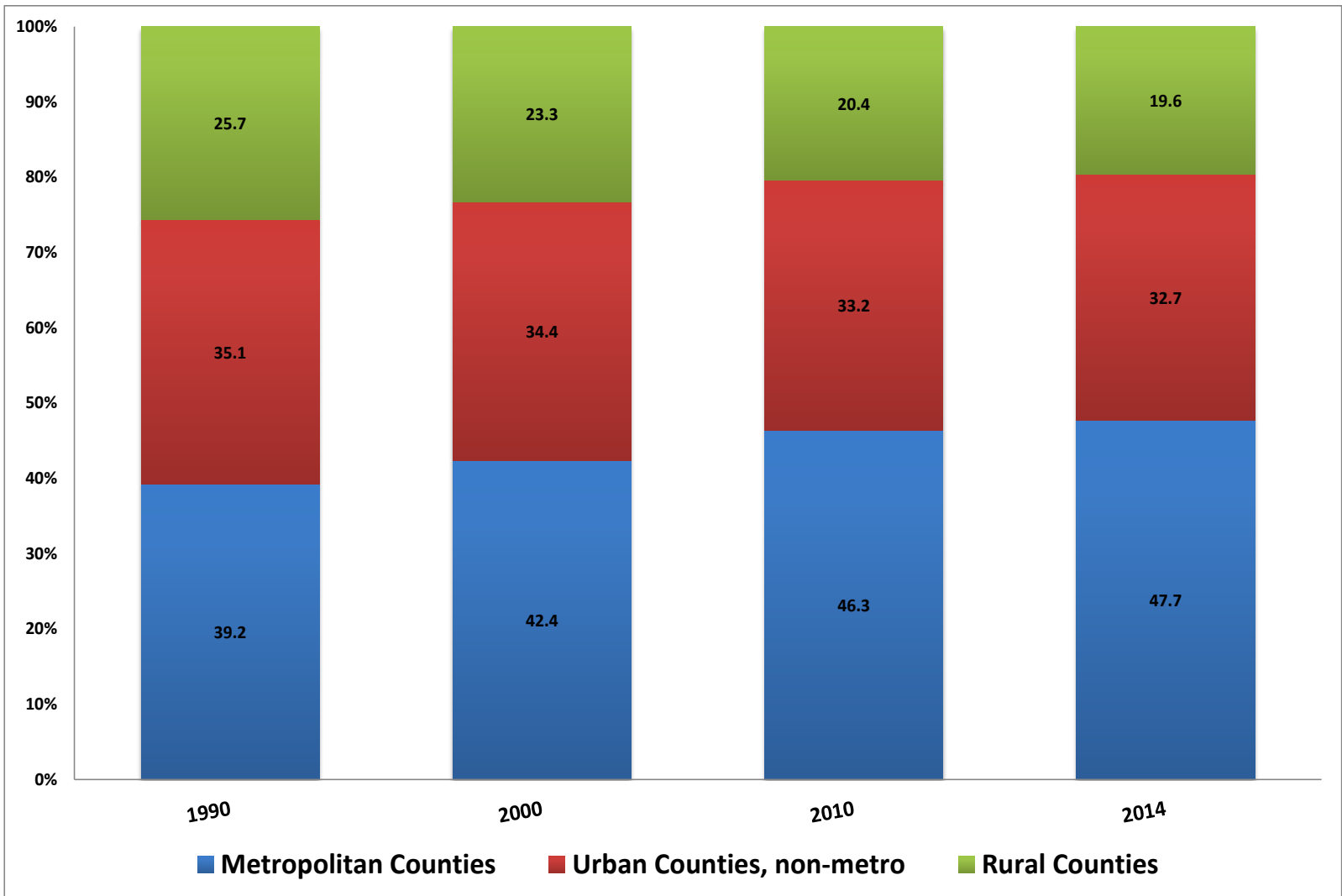

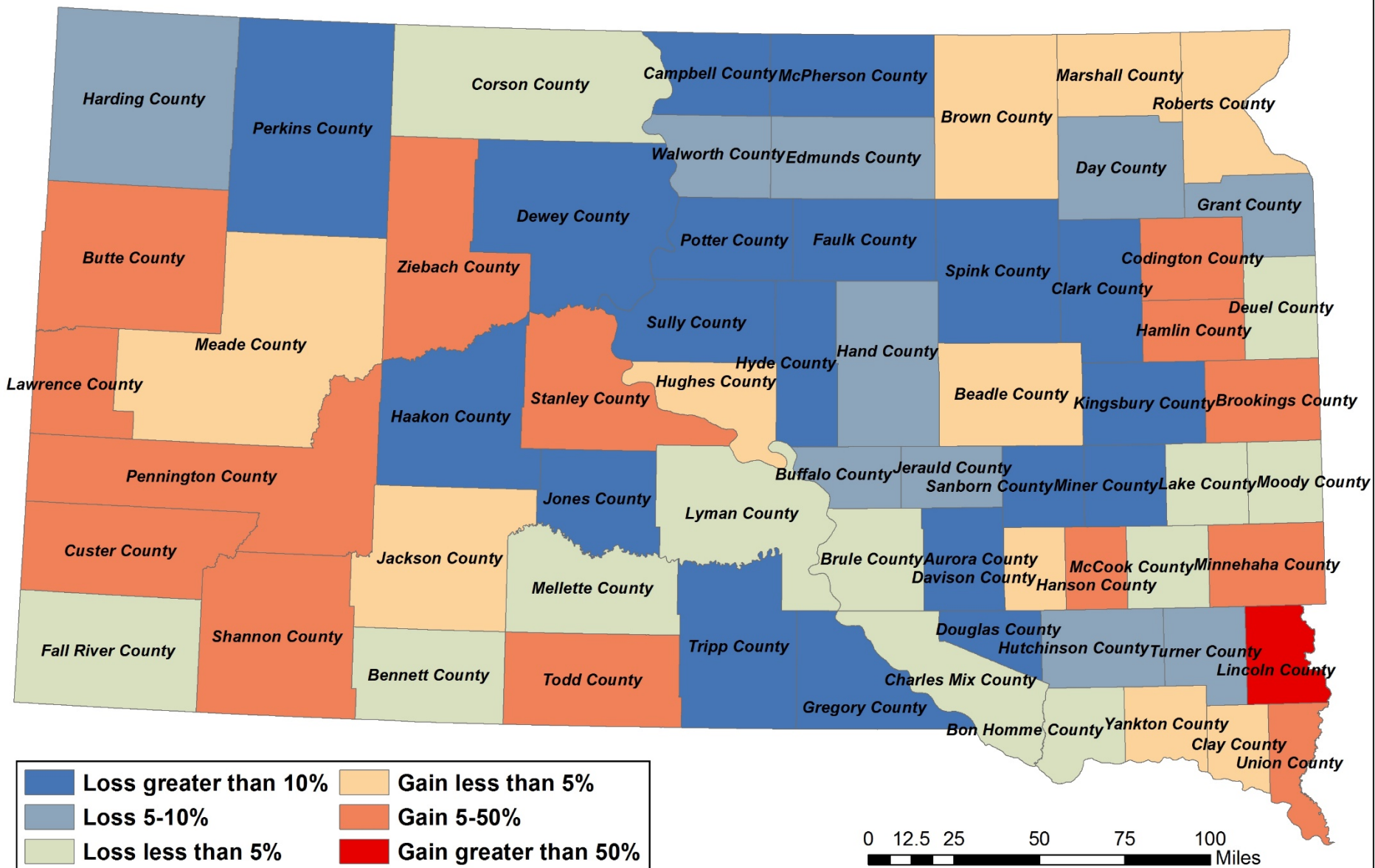

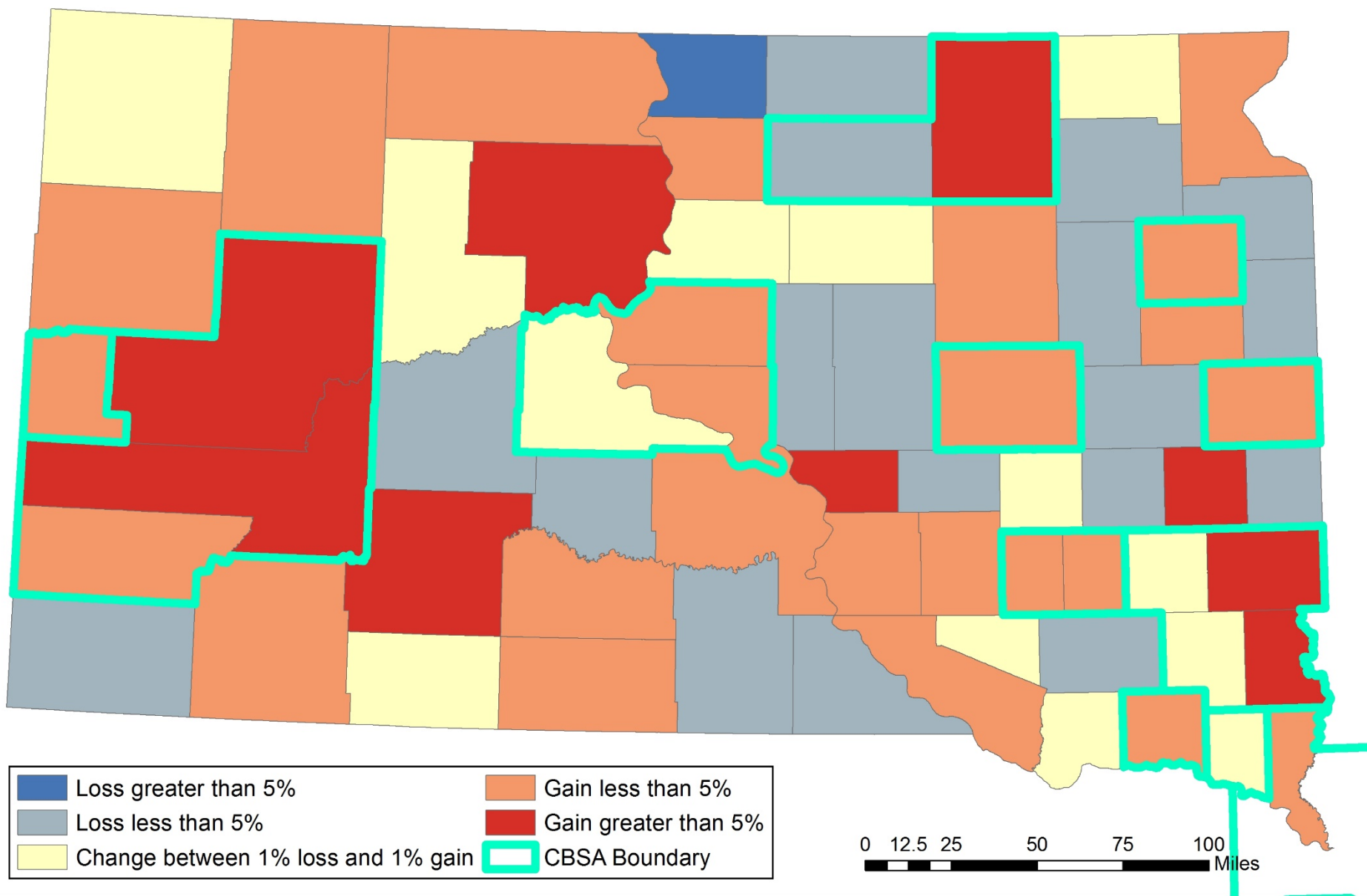
Percent of the State Population by Metro, Urban Non-Metro, Rural Status, 1990-2014



Percent Population Change between 2000 and 2010 South Dakota Counties

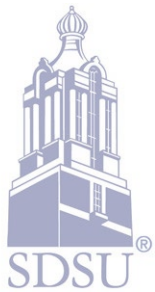

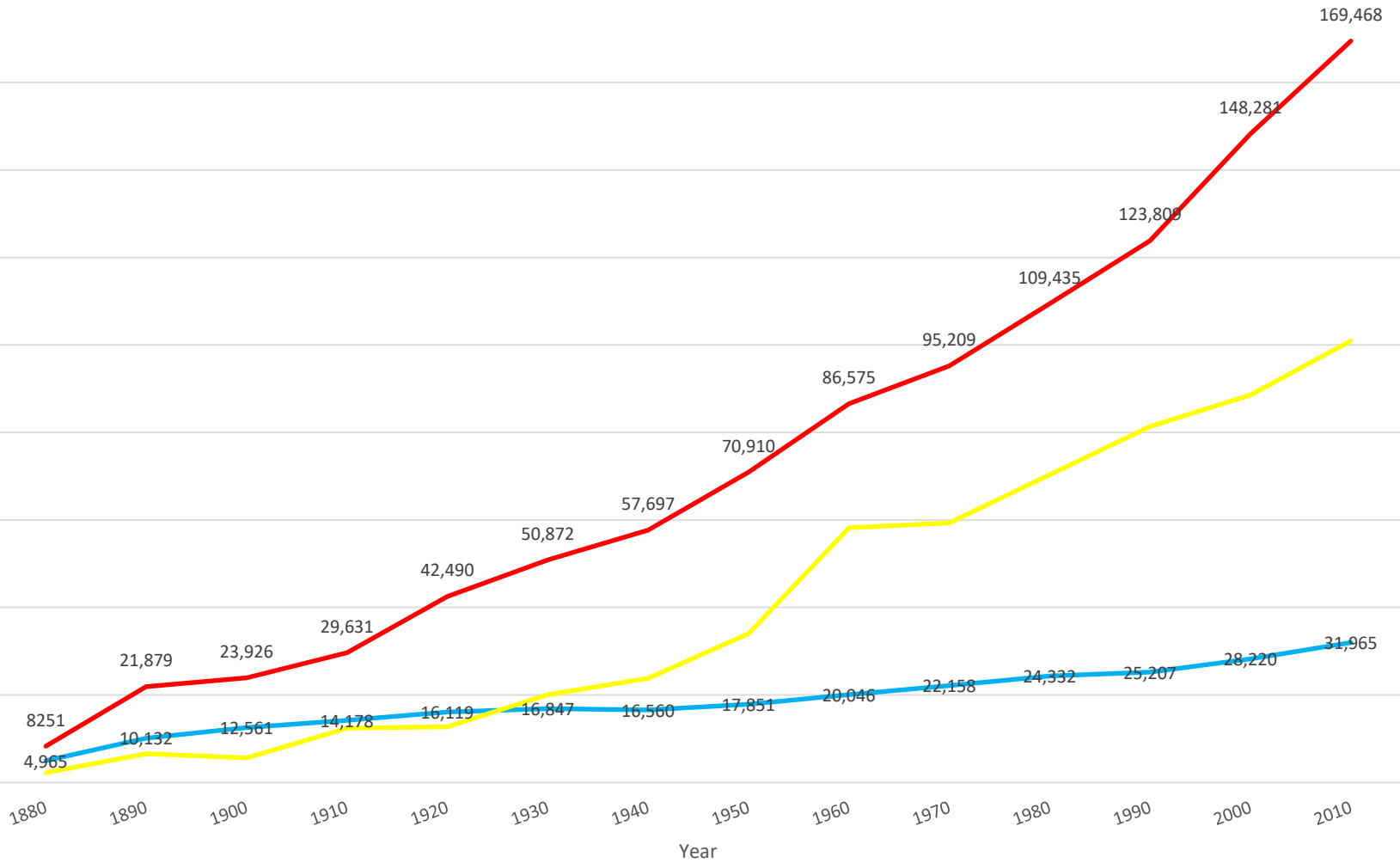

Recall that between 2010 and 2014, South Dakota's population increased by 38,995 (814,180 enumerated in 2010 and 853,175 estimated in 2014).



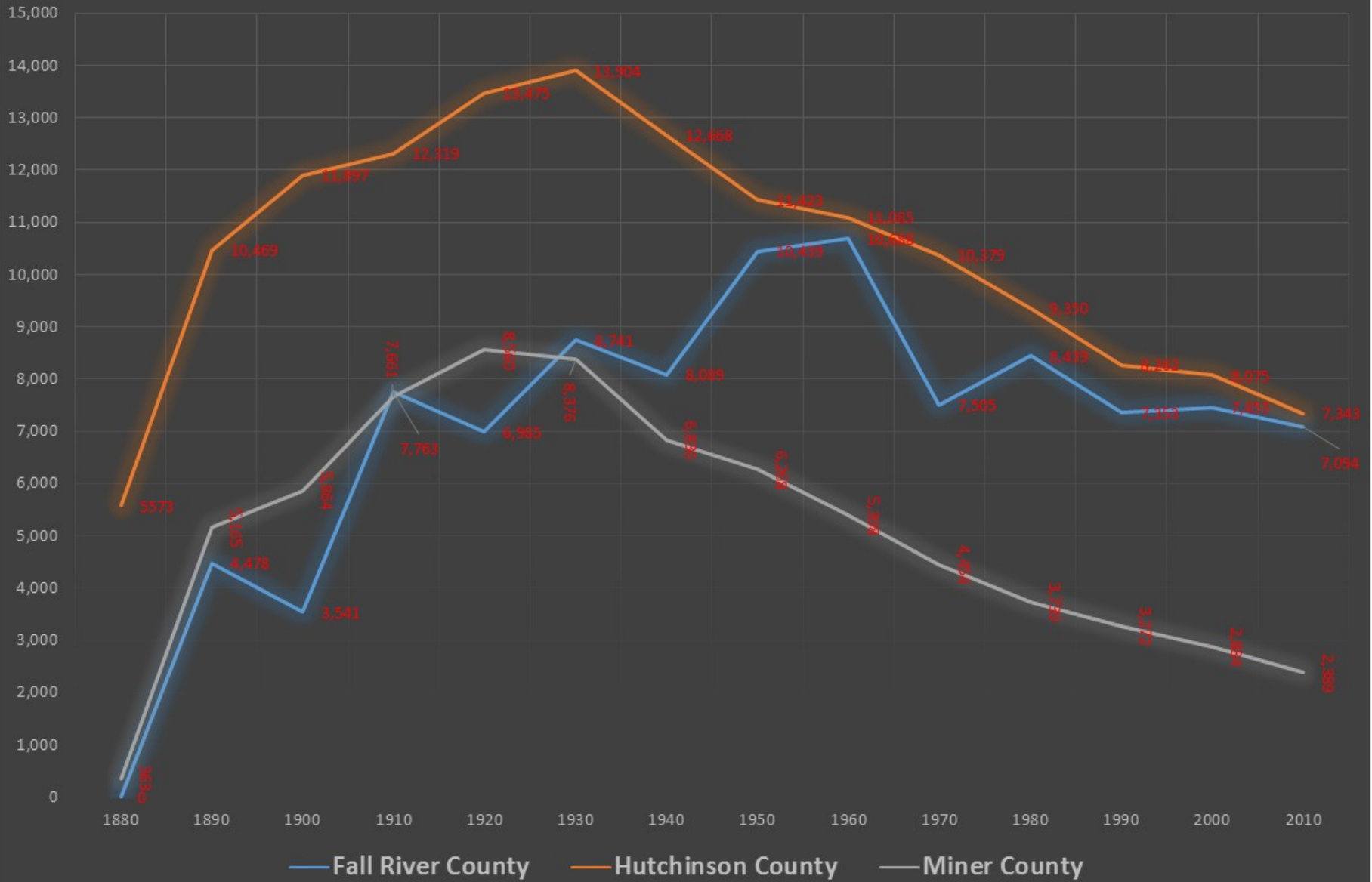

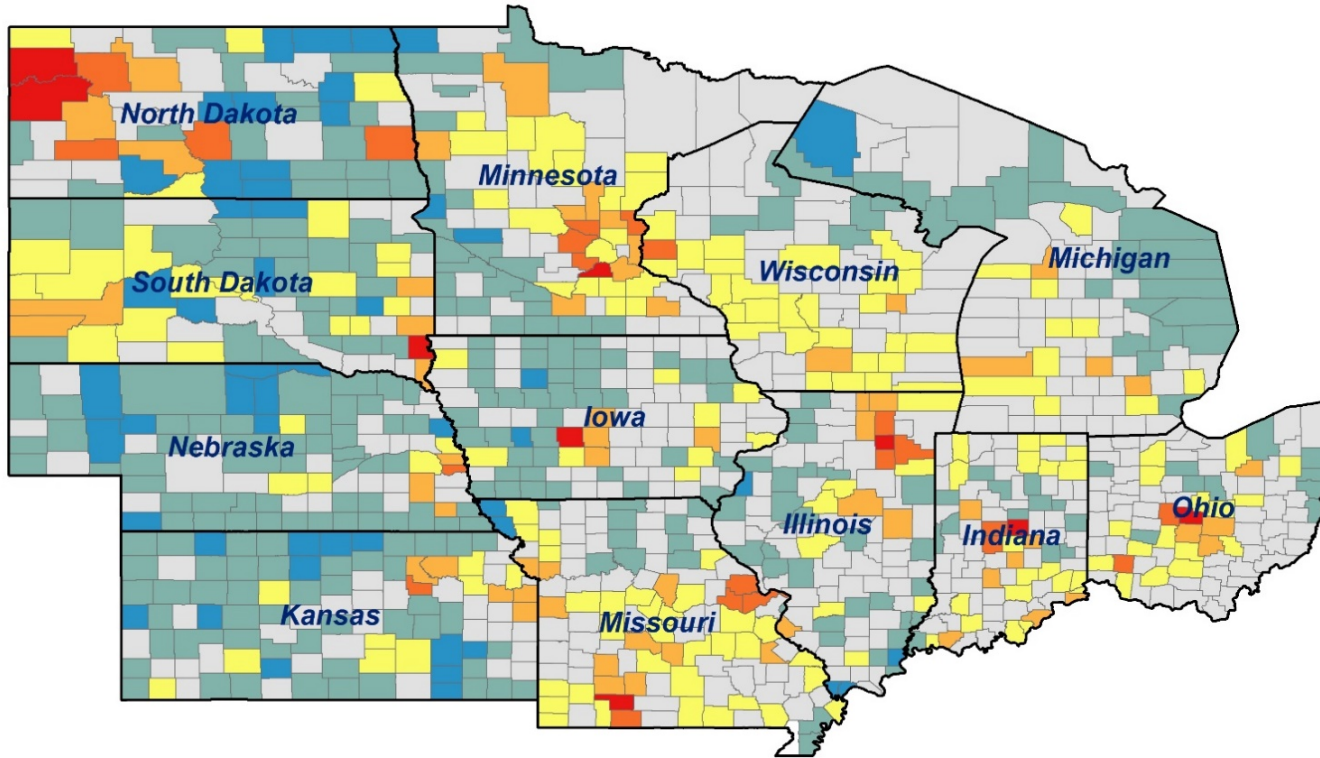

COUNTY POPULATION CHANGE, 2000-2014, ACROSS THE GEOGRAPHY OF 12 STATES

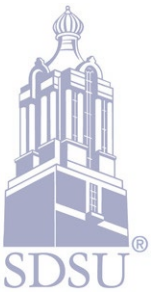

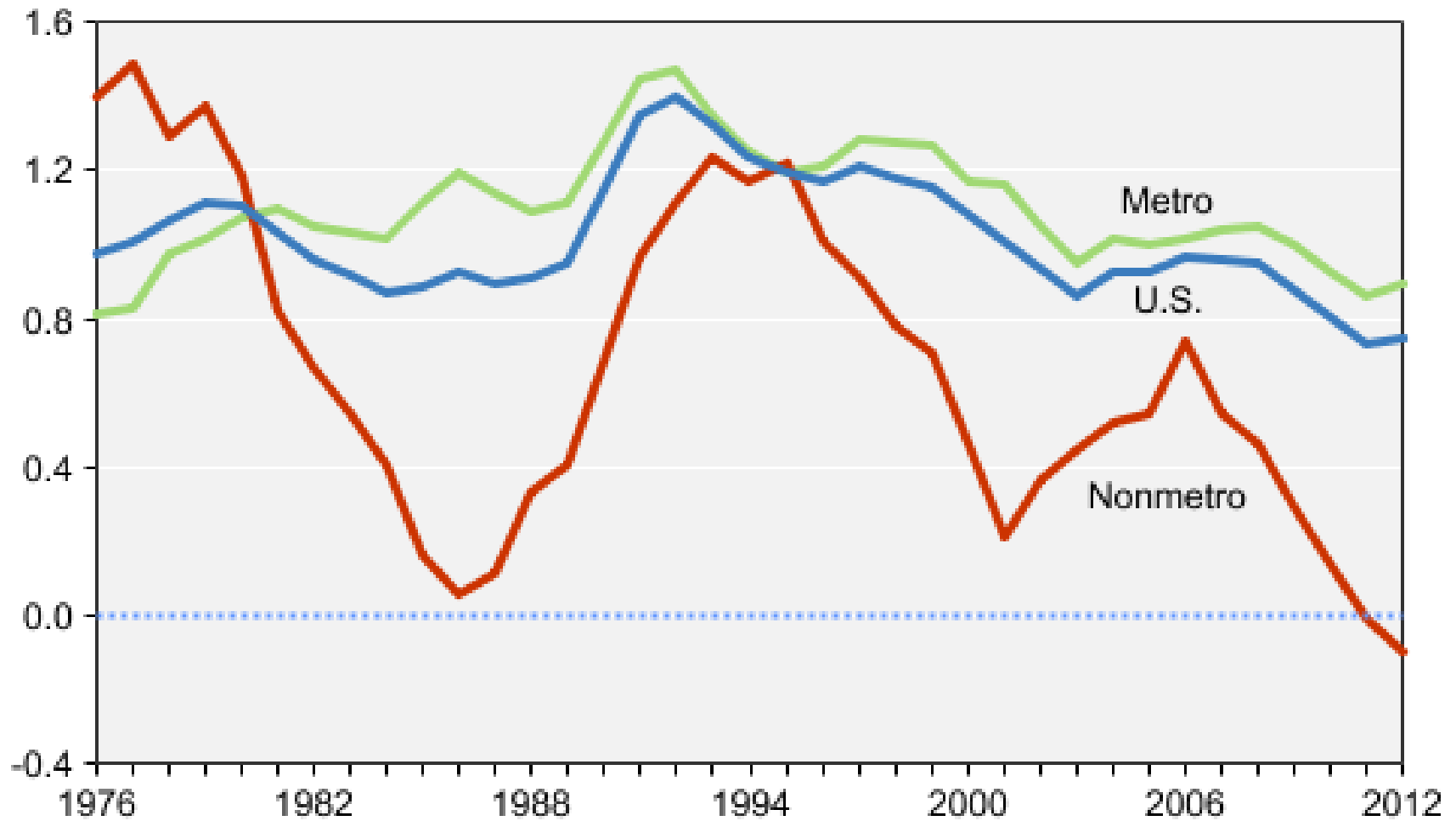

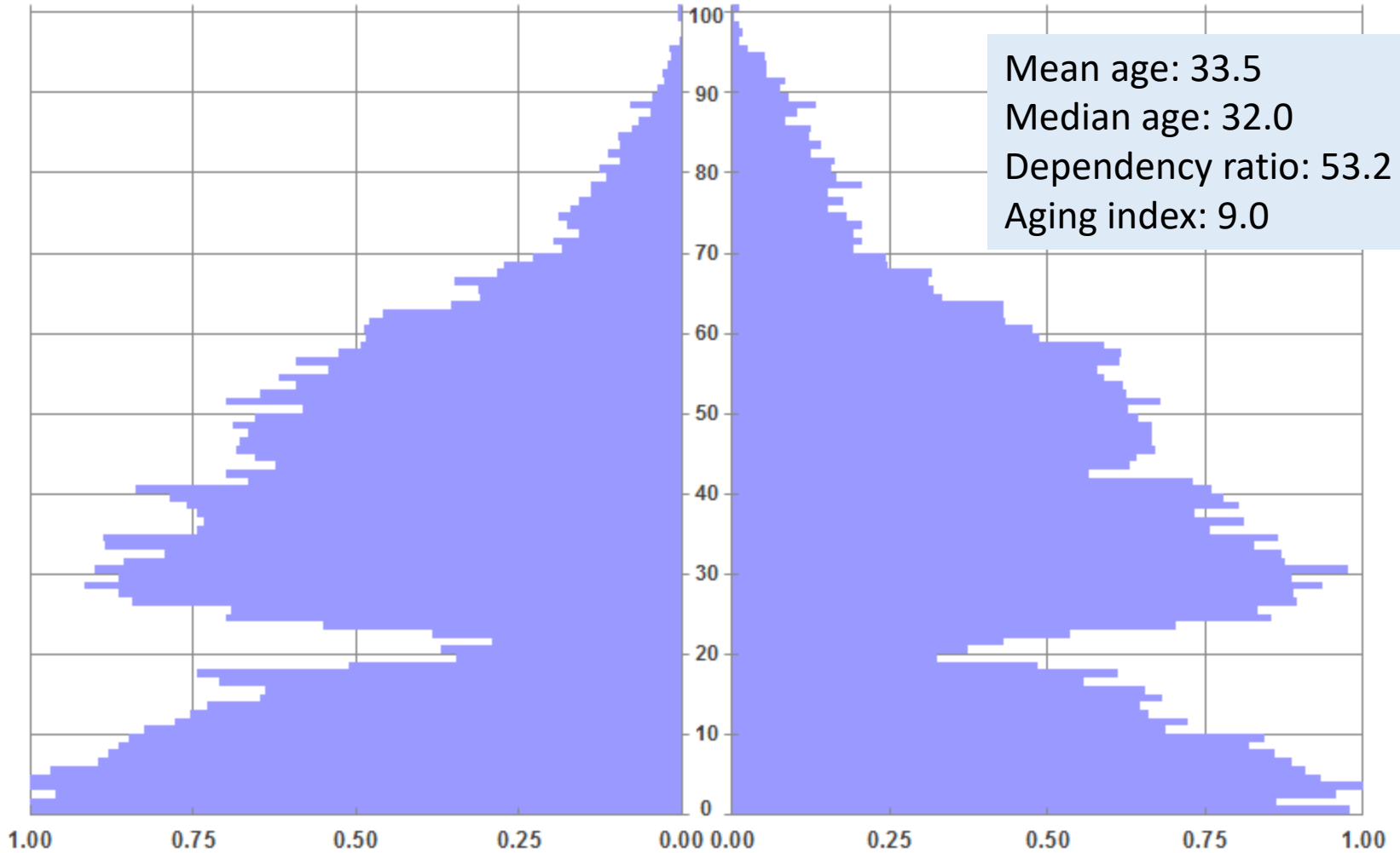

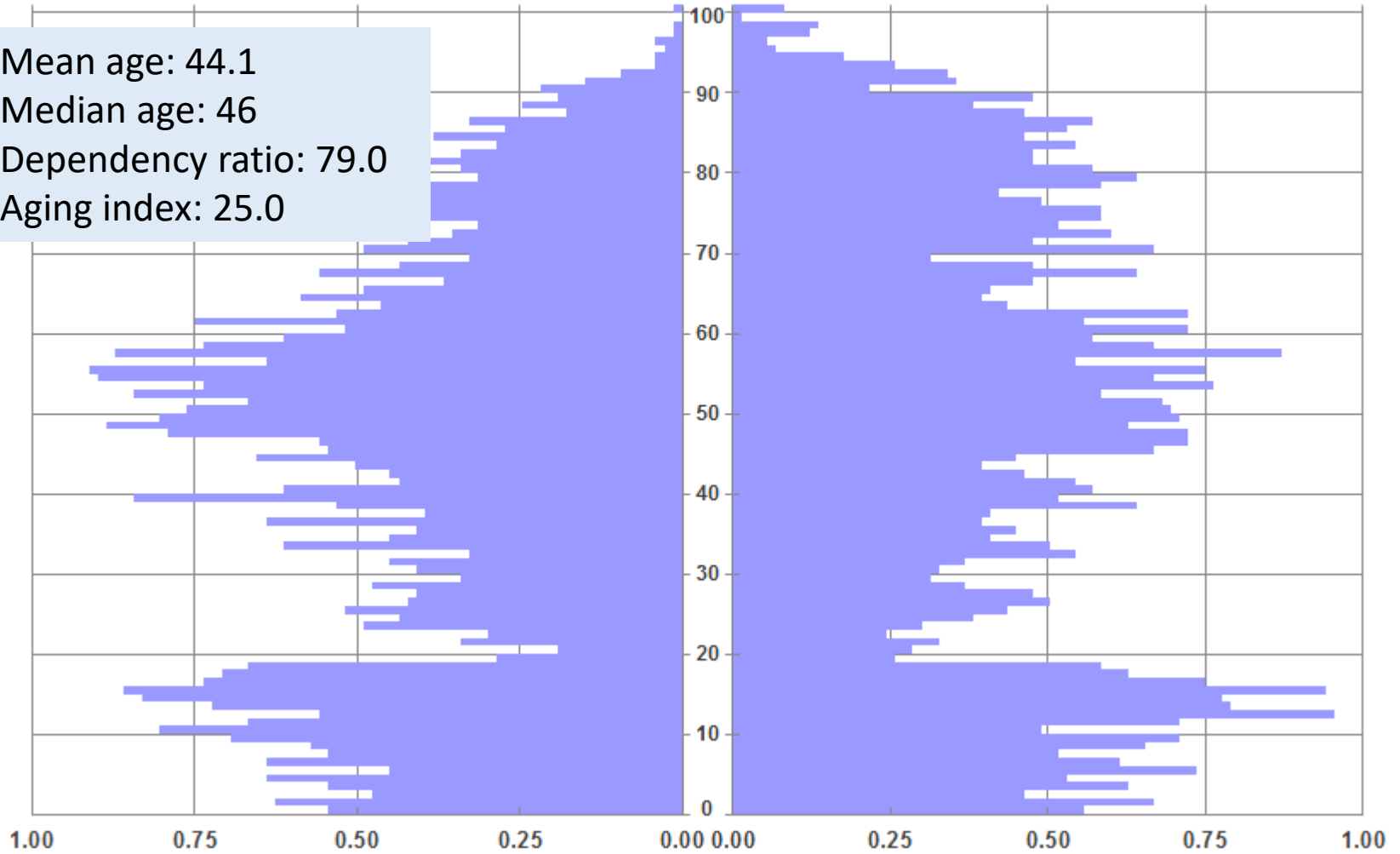

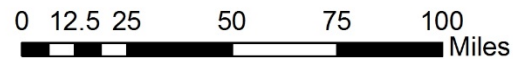

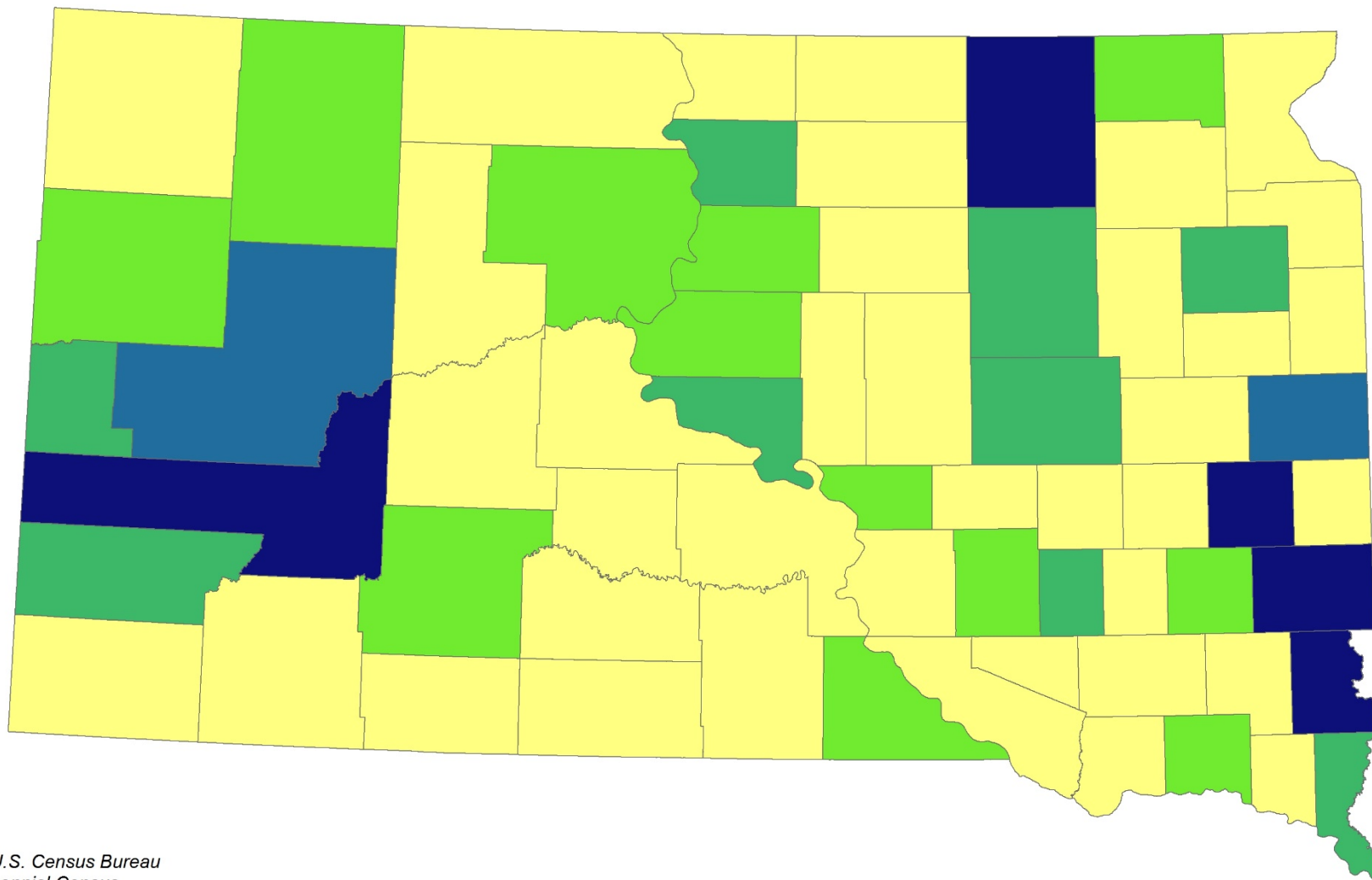
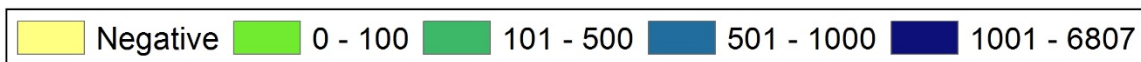
Natural Increase between 2010 and 2014 South Dakota Counties



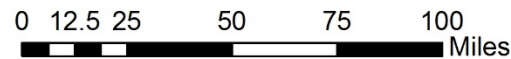

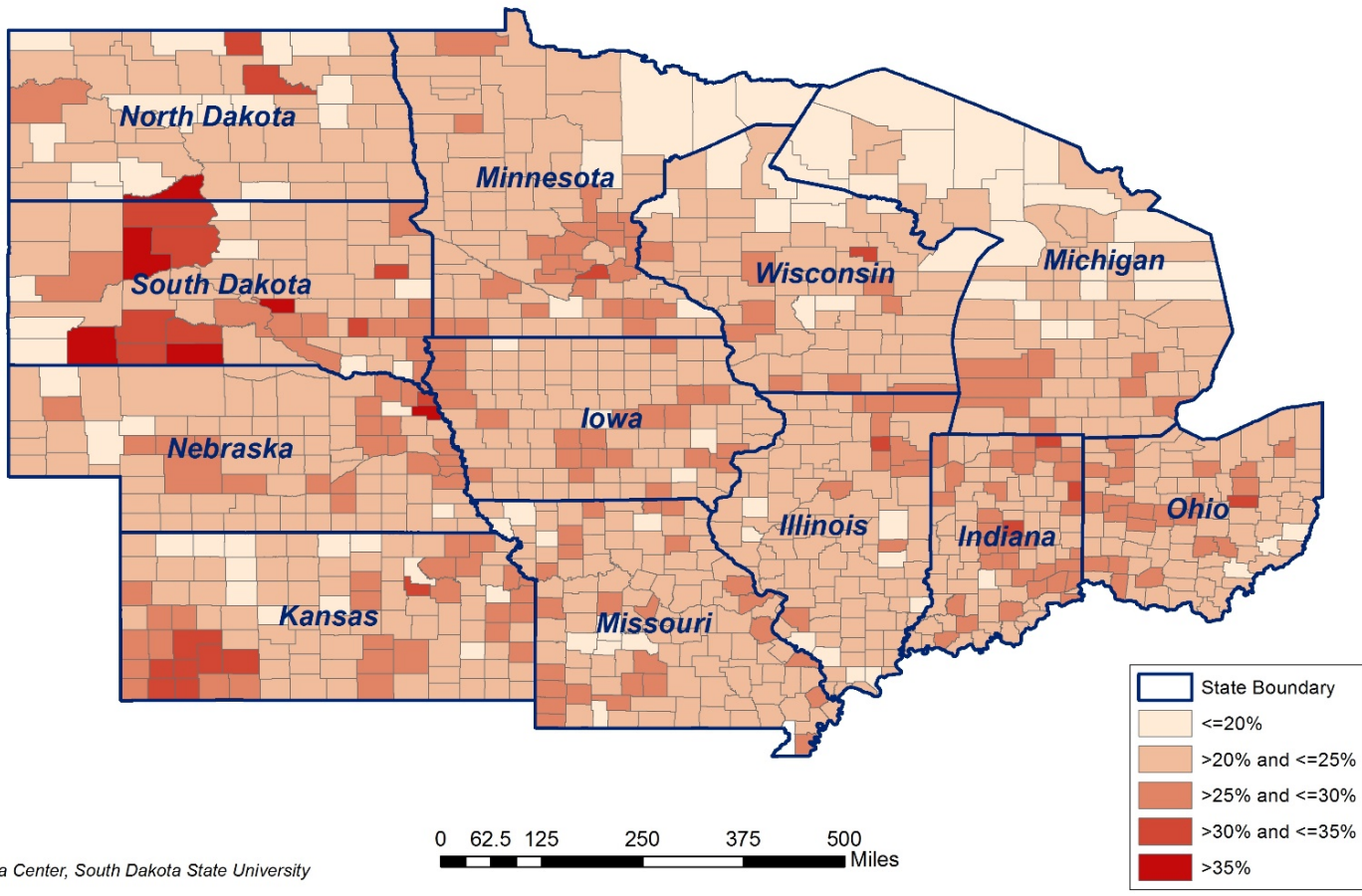
Net Migration between 2010 and 2014 South Dakota Counties

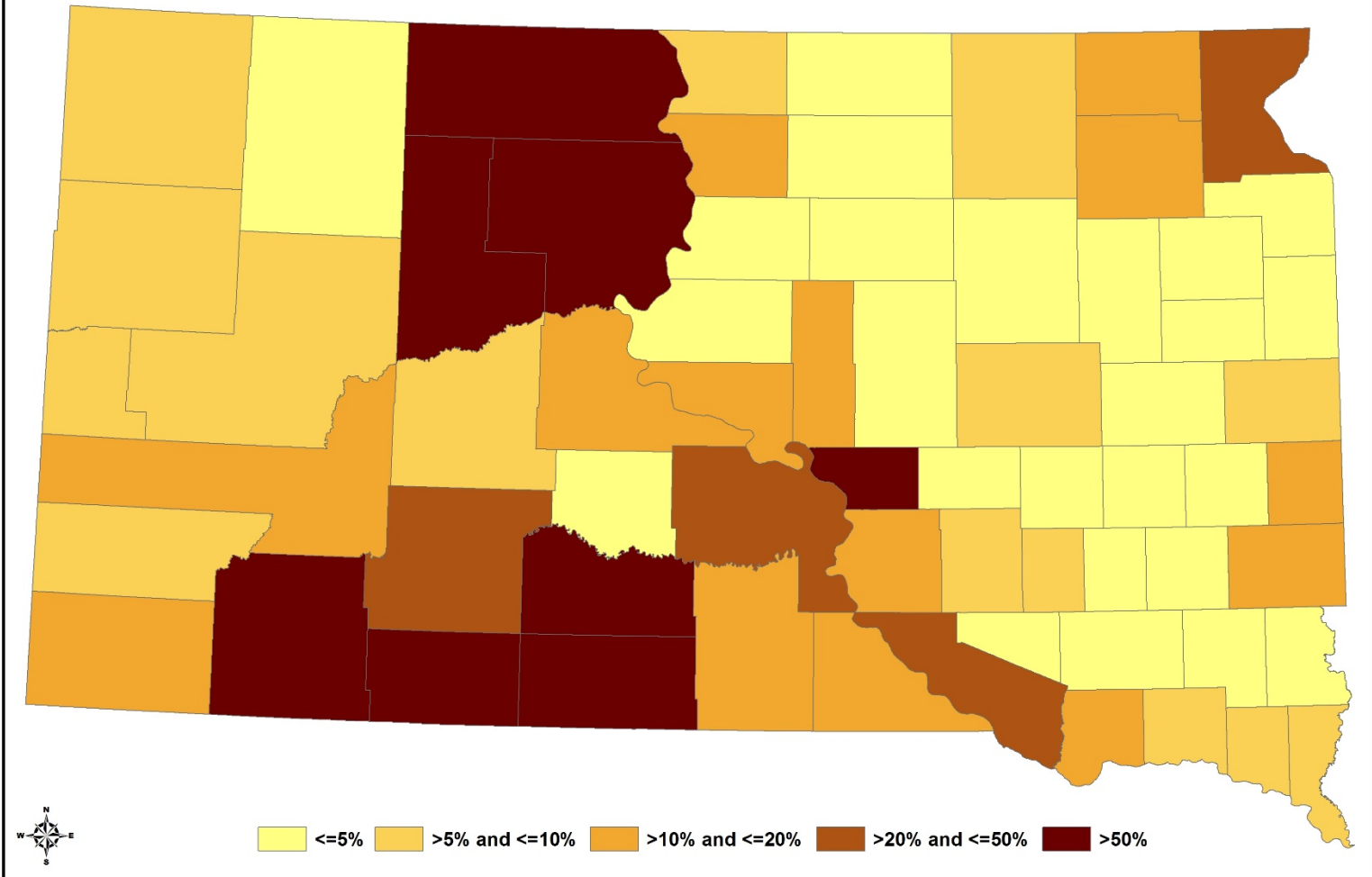

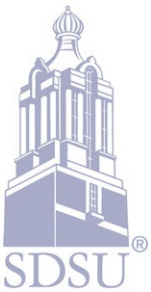

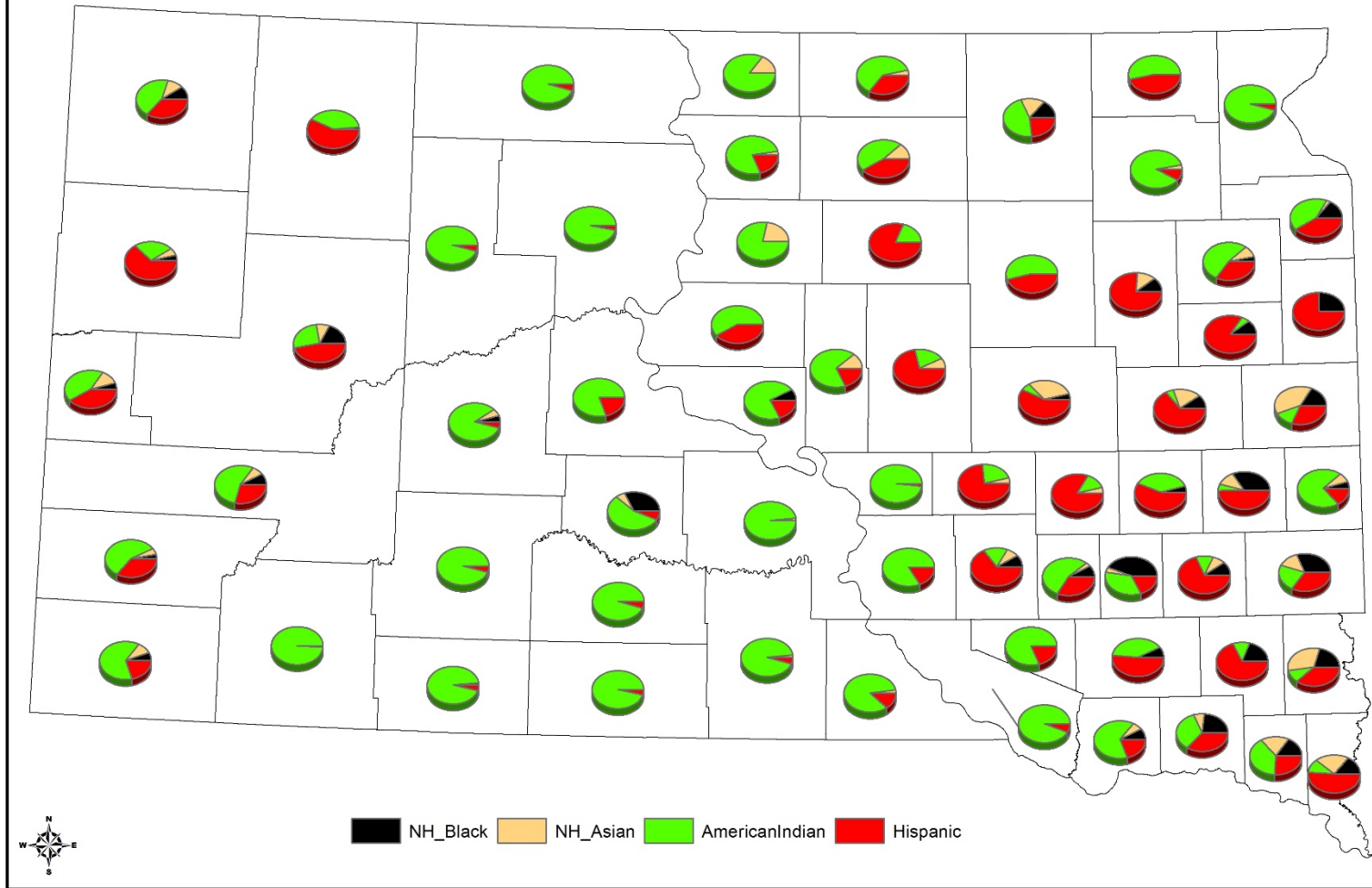
NON-WHITE POPULATION AS A PERCENTAGE OF COUNTY POPULATION, SOUTH DAKOTA



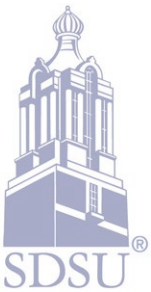

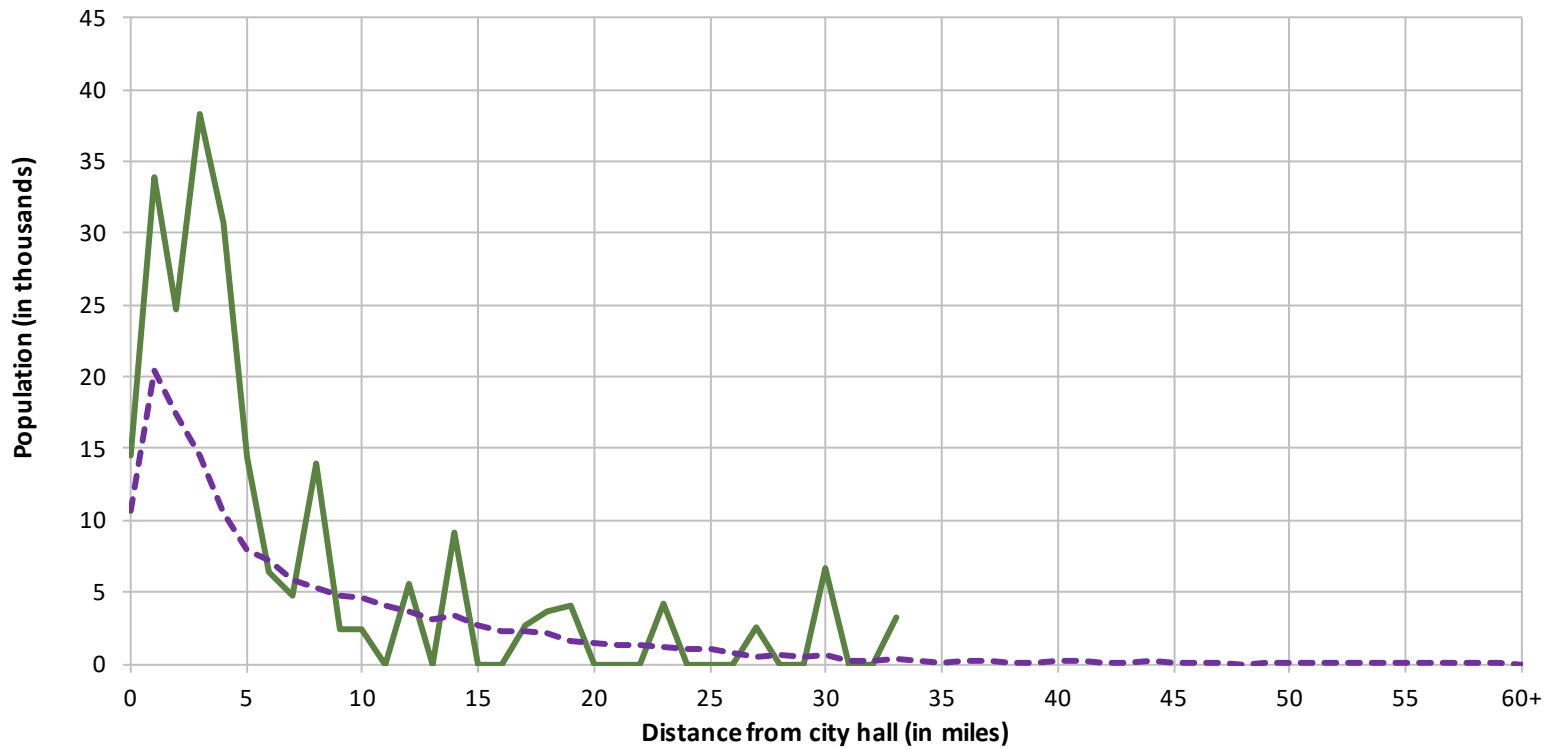

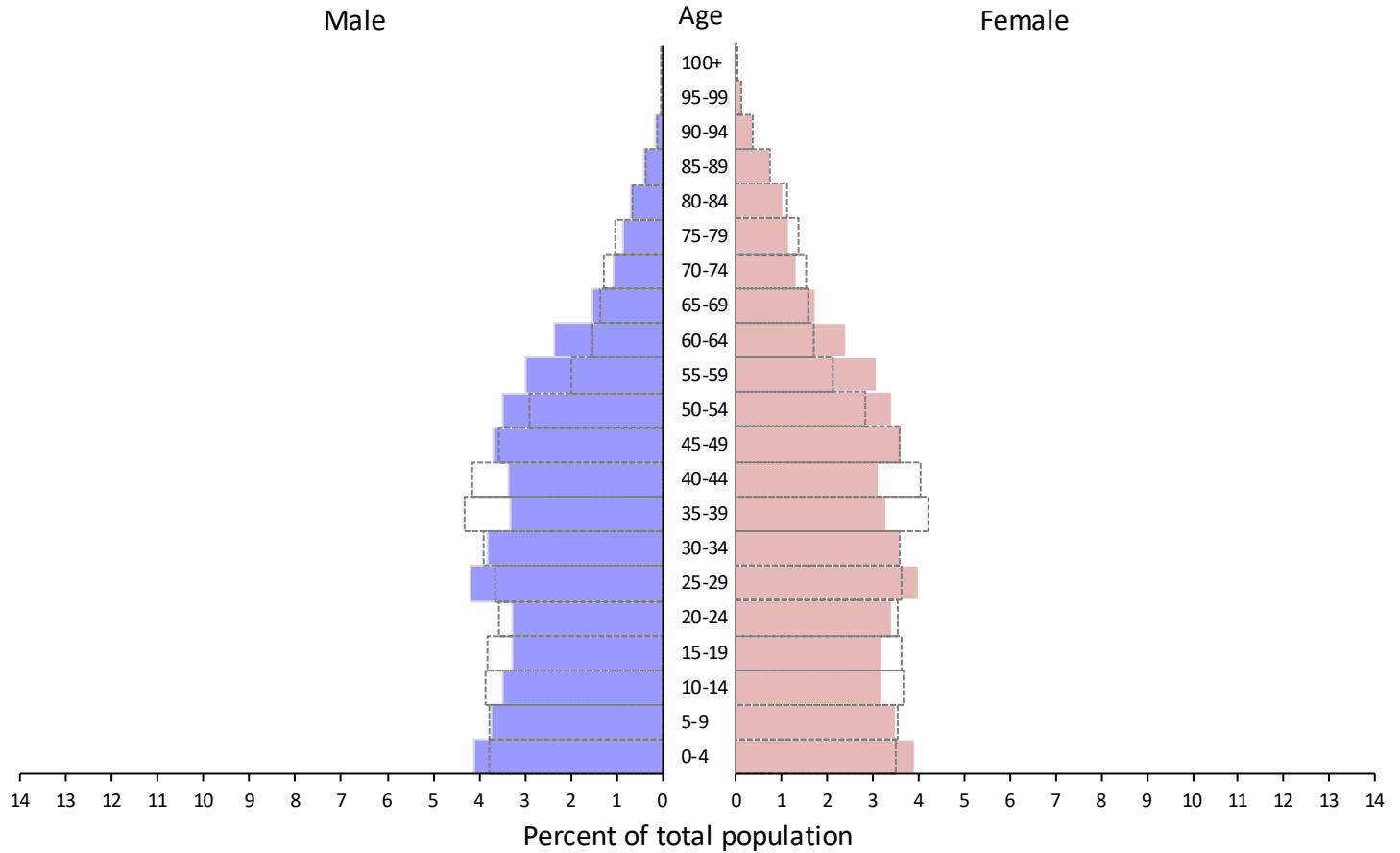
Population by Distance From City Hall

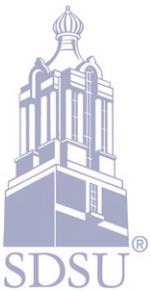
Age and Sex Structure by Core Based Statistical Area (CBSA) Status: 2000 and 2010

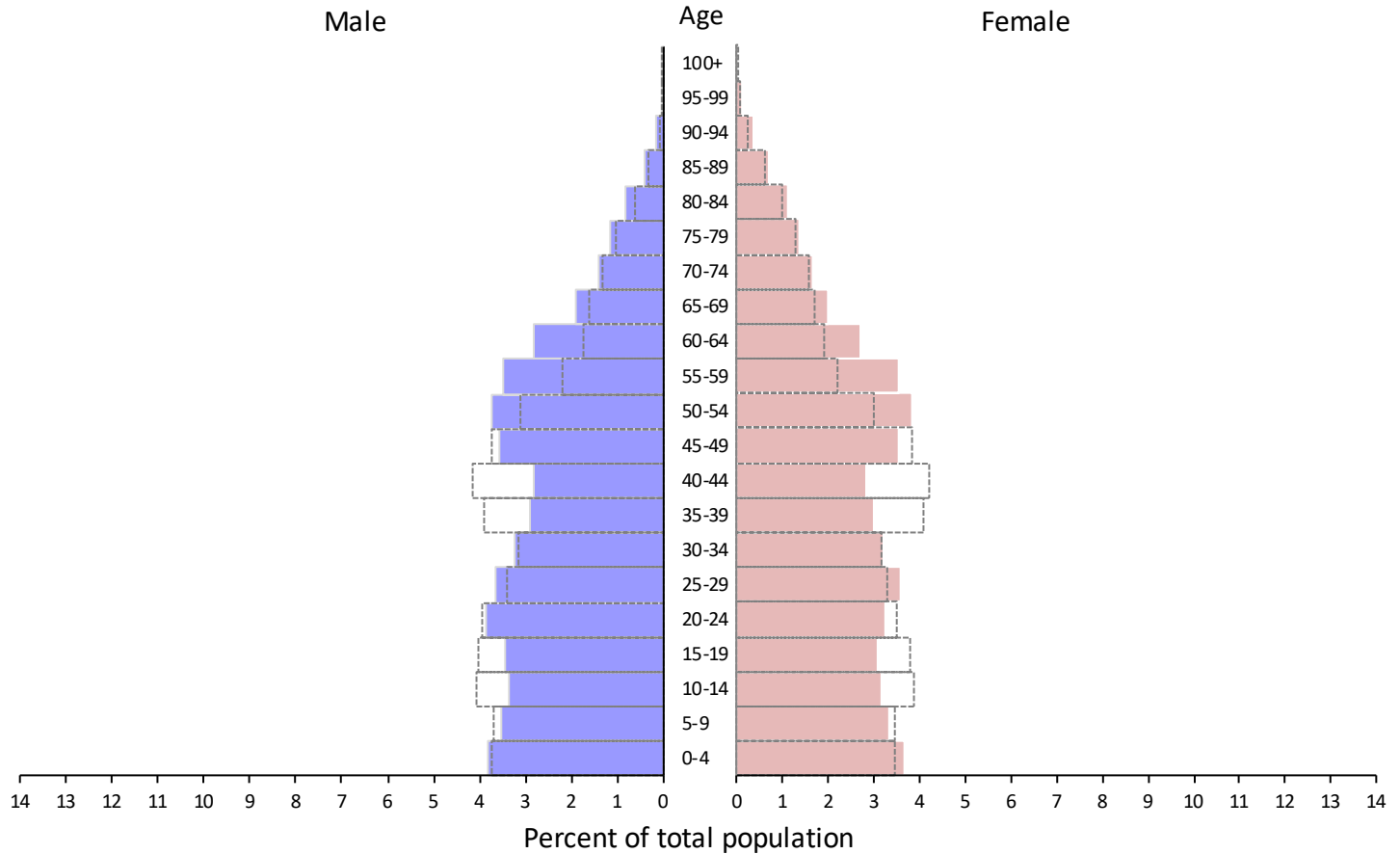
