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
Trinity University QEP Grant Recipient Survey Results

This report provides the results of a survey conducted with Trinity faculty who participated in Trinity's Information Literacy QEP grant program during at least one semester from 2007 to 2013.

Each of the grant recipients proposed a new or revised course that included information literacy learning in a substantive way, and assessed student learning in relation to one or more of the five information literacy goals (Understand, Access, Evaluate, Use Ethically, and Create).

The survey was conducted from November 5 - 15, 2013. A total of 70 completed surveys were received from a survey population of 80 possible respondents.




Q3. After the semester during which you received the QEP grant, did you include information literacy learning outcomes in other courses?




