## INDUCTION OF MR. LARRY LUCKETT

On April 15th Compatriot Lar-

ry Luckett was inducted into the SAR through his Patriot Ancestor Andrew Broga. Compatriot Luckett served 22 years in the US Army as Medical Service Corps Officer as a Nuclear Engineer and Certified Health Physicist an Retired in the grade of Lt Colonel. He now volunteers at the San Antonio Genealogical and Historical Society Library where he serves as a Secretary of the Society and Editor of their Journal "Our Heritage".

Compatriot Luckett's Patriot Ancestor Andrew Broga enlisted in December 1775 at Southwick, Massachusetts for the term of one year as a private in the company commanded by Captain Oliver Hanchet in the 2nd Connecticut Regiment commanded by Colonel Wyllys. On January 1, 1776 the 2nd Connecticut Regiment was re-designated as the 22nd Con-



tinental Infantry Regiment (Connecticut) which served in the Siege of Boston, the Battle of Long Island, the Battle of White Plains and the Defense of the Hudson River Highlands. We hope Compatriot Luckett will share more of his Ancestor's life at a Chapter Event.

# GUEST SPEAKER TELLS ABOUT ARMY'S PERSONNEL RECOVERY PROGRAM

On April 15th, Mr Doug Sanders, Retired Military and US Army Ranger was our Guest Speaker. He is currently serving as a Department of the Army Civilian, HQ. US Army South, as the Director of the Personnel Recovery Coordination Center.

Mr. Sanders stated that "Personnel Recovery is defined as the sum of military, diplomatic, and civil efforts to effect the recovery and return of US military personnel, Department of Defense civilians and contractors who are isolated in an operational environment." He spoke about the process of recovery of



U.S. personnel held as prisoners in hostile countries around the world who are returned home following extended periods of captivity. He explained how they were transitioned back into life within their home and military or civilian community. This re-integration process is usually a lengthy process, especially if the individual was held in captivity for many years like those held in Iran, Columbia or Vietnam. As a recent example, Mr. Sanders spoke about the re-integration process of Sgt. Bowe Bergdahl, the controversial U.S. soldier who was recovered in Afghanistan last year after five years in captivity.
