Additional Details of Offense, Progress of Investigation, etc.

8-19-54, Thurs:

On information received from one CHRISTINE CARPENTER, W.F. 23 yrs, of 1454 Roycroft Ave. Lakewood, O. that a strange acting man lived on their street and worked at the Hiel Processing Co., 12901 Elmwood Rd., Lkwd., his name was Edle, and that she feared he killed Marilyn Sheppard.

At Hiel Processing Co. interviewed Plant Supt. F.H. Stenenson, found subject to be one Edward M. PECK, W.M. 37 yrs, Single, living at 1498 Roycroft Ave. Lkwd. O. at the home of Mrs. Julia McKenna. Subject was hired July 21, 1952, and had a good record at plant, was a good worker and steady.

Checked with Lakewood Police, subject carried no record.

Questioned EDWARD M. PECK, subject stated that to the best of his recollection of July 4, 1954 he was about Lakewood. That Sat. night July 3 he went to the ~~Dak~~roit Theater, he could not recall picture, that he then went to ~~alters~~ Resturant, at Sloane & Detroit for coffee, returning home about 2:00 A.M. Sunday morning. He arose Sunday, July 4, about noon. His first knowledge of what had happened was when he read a paper Monday, July 5th. Subject stated that he owned no car.

Interveiwed Mrs. Julia McKenna, 1498 Roycroft Ave. She atated subject highly recommended from the YMCA and was a model ~~rou~~mmmer, that he came to her around Christmas, 1953. She could not recall whereabouts over July 3rd & 4th.
