## Sir:

At 8:15 A.M. this date together with Detectives Elmer Roubal # 210 and Poalking # 28 went to 28934 Lake Road, Bay Village City, Ohio to examine the scene of the homicide of Marilyn Sheppard.

Examina tion of the home disclosed the following. Spots of what appeared to be dried drops of blood and means upon testing with a benzidine reagent gave a positive reaction, were found at the following locations; on the third tread and the sixth tread from the bottom of the basement landing of the stairs leading from the basement to the kitchen; on both metal bands on the face of the treads and both risers of the steps leading from the kitchen to the first landing of the stairs leading to the second floor; on the face of the first tread and both risess going from the living room to the first landing of the same stairs leading to the second floor; and there were mayaraixspots on several of the risers leading from the landing to the second floor hallway.

Similar spots were also found on the tread of the diving room door leading into the screened in porch on the north side of the building. Spots were also found on the porch floor in the area adjacent to this door.

Examination of the red leather chair in the Doctors Study disclosed several thin film-like spots on the face of the cushion and the area below it. These gave a positive test with Benzidine rea ent.

Scrappings of blood were brought to the Laboratory from the basement and kitchen stairs.

A plasticine impression was made of what appears to be a freshly made tool mark in a door in at the foot of the basement stairs. This door leads to a crawl space at the front of the house. Mark appears to have been made by a chisel or wedge like tool of more than 7/8" in width which is the length of the impression, however this does not show both edges of the toal.
