A Sigma Xi Distinguished Lecturer, Fall 2002

Submitted by François G. Amar for the University of Maine Chapter of Sigma Xi

The University of Maine Chapter of *Sigma Xi*, *The Scientific Research Society* requests funding to help support the visit of a *Sigma Xi* Distinguished Lecturer in the Fall of 2002. The lecture will be of interest to a general audience, free and open to the public. We will publicize the lecture on campus, in the community, and at institutions in central Maine (e.g. Colby, Jackson Labs, high school science clubs).

Sigma Xi is a national organization devoted to promoting scientific research (through grants, meetings, and its journal, American Scientist) and honoring students and professionals who have demonstrated achievement in this area. The University of Maine Chapter (Chapter #100) has been inactive for about ten years and is being revitalized this year by a small group of members. This spring, for the first time in a decade, the organization will nominate and induct a new group of students and faculty.

We intend to help fulfill our mission and to kick-off our renewed presence on campus by inviting a *Sigma Xi* Distinguished Lecturer to give a public talk of general interest here on campus in the Fall of 2002. In our application to the national office of Sigma Xi for partial support for this visit, we identified 3 out of 30 proposed speakers: 1) Alan Taylor, Department of Mathematics, Union College (Topic: *The Mathematics of Voting*); 2) Jacqueline Krim, Department of Physics, N.C. State (Topic: *Nanoscale Machines: These Squeaky Wheels Will Get No Grease*); 3) Mriganka Sur, Department of Brain and Cognitive Sciences, MIT (Topic: *How the Brain Wires Itself*). Our proposed date for the lecture is Thursday, October 10, 2002. We are presently awaiting approval from Sigma Xi before firming up the invitation to one of these speakers.

As a fledgling organization, we presently have only very limited local resources. Committing \$100 to a lecture this year, we anticipate that this situation will improve in a year or two. Thus we have requested support from a variety of sources: \$500 from the national office of Sigma Xi (pending), \$200 (committed) from Provost Kennedy's office, and \$500 requested of CA/DLS. We note that Sigma Xi lecturers agree to limit their honorarium to \$200 and that the funding from the Provost's office is earmarked for a public reception following the lecture.

We thank you in advance for your consideration of our request.
