Report of the Schools of Brooks for the year ending February 15, 1903.

Fellow Citizens:—I hereby submit the annual report of the schools as conducted for the past year. At the first regular meeting of the Superintending School Committee they retained the duties of hiring teachers and purchasing fuel. The other duties were delegated to the Superintendent. It was also decided to discontinue the schools at East Brooks, Pond Hill, and Ellis District for the year. The Superintendent was duly authorized by the Committee to procure conveyance for all scholars residing in said districts for school year. The scholars from Pond Hill and Ellis Districts were conveyed separately as there were more to convey than in former years. Other, scholars were boarded near the schools at a less expense than by conveyance.

No changes in text books have been made during the past year as the appropriation was scarcely sufficient to replace books worn out and otherwise injured. The condition of the books will necessitate a larger appropriation than usual.

The School Committee selected teachers residing in town as far as they thought practicable. The work of the several teachers has been commendable.

Report of the Schools of Brooks for the year ending February 15, 1903.

Fellow Citizens:—I hereby submit the annual report of the schools as conducted for the past year. At the first regular meeting of the Superintending School Committee they retained the duties of hiring teachers and purchasing fuel. The other duties were delegated to the Superintendent. It was also decided to discontinue the schools at East Brooks, Pond Hill, and Ellis District for the year. The Superintendent was duly authorized by the Committee to procure conveyance for all scholars residing in said districts for school year. The scholars from Pond Hill and Ellis Districts were conveyed separately as there were more to convey than in former years. Other, scholars were boarded near the schools at a less expense than by conveyance.

No changes in text books have been made during the past year as the appropriation was scarcely sufficient to replace books worn out and otherwise injured. The condition of the books will necessitate a larger appropriation than usual.

The School Committee selected teachers residing in town as far as they thought practicable. The work of the several teachers has been commendable. No course of study has been introduced into the schools as yet but at the same time the scholars have done their work in a thorough and systematic manner. Much praise is due our teachers in this direction.

The house at West Brooks needs new windows and a few other minor repairs. South Village building is in a very poor condition. It is not large enough to accommodate the scholars to any degree of convenience. The desks are of such small dimensions that the pupils make a great deal of confusion in passing to and from their recitations.

A third teacher could be worked to a great advantage in the village schools if either building had a recitation room.

On the whole, the work of the year has been a success. It has been my object to so direct the school work that our schools should be practical and economical. The object of our common school work is not to teach our scholars how to live without labor, but, rather, how to labor intelligently and how to rightly discharge the duties of citizenship. Our schools are now on a good working basis and we owe it to ourselves, to the State, and to humanity, to keep them on the line of practical progress.
