

REPORT OF TOWN NURSE

This year the town, in cooperation with the Maine Department of Health and Welfare, established an Enabling Act Service in which the public health nurse works full-time in Fort Kent. With the aid of an active Health Council this has meant the development of a more effective health program.

The Health Council has been functioning for several years. This Council consists of three officers: Chairman—Dr. Maurice Cyr, Vice-Chairman Mrs. Nick Cunliffe, and

Secretary-Treasurer Mrs. Edward Charron. Each organization and church is represented on the Council.

The community, as a whole, has become aware of the various services offered through the Department of Health and Welfare. With the cooperation of local organizations, proposed projects have been carried out and have acquired a firmer foundation with possibilities of expanding some of these in the future.

Because the early formation of good health habits may influence the future health of the individual, emphasis was placed on health supervision visits to maternity patients, infants, preschool and school children.

During the year home visits were made to 130 maternity patients, 256 infants, 198 preschool children and 67 crippled children. Many visits were also made to school children with health problems. Several times the public health nurse has had the opportunity to demonstrate home care in families where there has been illness.

There have been four child health conferences held. Fifteen have completed immunizations against whooping cough and diphtheria. Twenty-three have been vaccinated against smallpox. Twenty-nine have had physical examinations. Recommendations made by the examining physician were followed up by the nurse.

The Rotary Club sponsored the dental program, conducted by Dr. Maurice and Normand Cyr. Mrs. Maurice Cyr volunteered to do recording and filing.

Mr. Albert Cyr, our superintendent of schools, was able to obtain a tutor for two children who are in need of special classes because of eye defects.

Children in all age groups have been referrd to the following: Pediatric Clinic, Crippled Children's clinic, Tumor clinic and Eye clinic.

Mrs. Camille Labbe has done much in getting a health program started. She carried on, until July, a very efficient eye program sponsored by the Lions Club.

The volunteers who help at our clinics and conferences have been responsible for the success of these activities.

Plans for the coming year include immunizations against diphtheria, whooping cough, and smallpox.

The audiometer (a device for testing hearing) will be used in the schools soon.

The Lions Club is planning to have eye examinations of the pupils screened by the teachers.

Some of the possibilities for future planning include:

Mother's classes.

School Lunch Program.

Health examination of selected groups of school children.

Your public health nurse wishes to thank everyone who contributed to make the first year's program a success.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and citizens of Fort Kent:

I herewith submit my first annual report of your schools for consideration.

During the past year this community had led the way in establishing the local Community School District, the first in the State of Maine. Since the last town meeting St. John and St. Francis have joined with Fort Kent, Eagle Lake, Wallagrass and New Canada in this new undertaking. Through the united efforts of these six communities, we should see in Fort Kent, in the near future, a high school which will be the pride of this section and which will serve the needs of our youth.

The old Fort Kent High School building is entirely inadequate and before long will have to be replaced by a completely new plant. A first step in that direction has been
taken by the construction of a six room building, which is
now in use. It is hoped that before too long other units will
be added to this new building. That there is an urgent
need for such new units can readily be seen when we
realize that the registration at the high school was 309 in
October 1946, 352 in October 1947, and 409 in October
1948. Within two years the enrollment will most likely be
over 500.

Great as is the need of building for the High School, of even greater urgency is the need of additional building to take care of our elementary school children. The elementary school is the foundation upon which all further education rests. It must be complete, it must be solid, and, under present conditions, cannot be either. To properly house the children now enrolled in St. Louis School would require at least ten additional classrooms. At least eight of our twelve rural school groups are in classrooms which are neither healthy nor conducive to sound education. They should be replaced by a central building. I therefore strongly urge you, the parents of these children, to begin at once raising some money towards a Common School Building Fund.

I hope that the citizens of Fort Kent appreciate the work of the Lions Club, the Rotary Club, and the Health Council in making our Eye, Dental, and Immunization Clinics. In very few communities will you find such groups giving so generously of their time, energy, and resources for the welfare of all the children. Without their help much of the good now being accomplished would be impossible. On behalf of the pupils I wish to thank all who take part in this work.

AUDITORS' REPORT

April 21, 1948

Town Manager and Council Fort Kent, Maine

Gentlemen:

In accordance with Chapter 16, Section 3 of the Revised Statutes of 1944 and at your request, the records of the Town of Fort Kent have been audited by Auditor M. E. Libby for the period March 6, 1947 to February 28, 1948 inclusive.

The examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards applicable in the circumstances and included all procedures which were considered necessary. Insofar as could be ascertained within the scope of the examination, the financial transactions of the Town appear to have been appropriately handled, with such exceptions as may be noted in the accompanying Comments.

Exhibits and Schedules incorporated in this report present the result of the financial operations of the Town for the period designated.

COMMENTS

CASH

A detailed examination of the accounts of the Treasurer indicated that all recorded cash receipts had been deposited promptly in the bank.

The cash balance of \$27,417.14, as reflected by the records of the Treasurer at February 28, 1948, was verified by reconciliation of the bank balance with the statement furnished by the depository.

Disbursements were made by check from warrants signed by the Town Manager.

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE

This account is comprised of amounts due from the State and other municipalities for pauper supplies furnished during the year, and \$1.05 due from the Tax Collector.

TAXES RECEIVABLE

An examination of the records of the Tax Collector indicated the warrant of commitment for 1947 taxes to be in agreement with the records of the Assessors. Cash collections, discounts, and abatments accounted for 90.6% of the current tax assessment charged to the Collector. Collections, abatements and transfers to tax liens accounted for 98.1% of unpaid prior years' taxes.

As a result of errors in posting, \$1.05 was due from the Collector.

TAX LIENS

Tax liens on file were examined and it appeared that the correct procedure had been followed.

Cash collections during the year totaled \$8,445.85 and liens amounting to \$805.27 were cancelled by the Assessors, leaving a balance of \$3,015.46 in this account at the year end.

VILLAGE CORPORATION TAXES

If the taxes assumed by the Town after the dissolution of the Village Corporation are not considered to be collectible, it is suggested that the charging off of these accounts be referred to the voters for consideration at a regular town meeting.

CAPITAL RESERVE FUND

The amount of \$20,000.00 was appropriated and added to the Capital Reserve Fund established for a high school building. The Fund, totaling \$30,000.00, together with interest in the amount of \$66.76, is on deposit in a savings account at the local bank.

BONDS PAYABLE

During the year, the bonded indebtedness of the Town was reduced to \$7,000.00 by payment of 2,500.00 appropriated for this purpose. The records indicated that all matured bonds and interest coupons had been paid.

TRUST FUNDS

The Ministerial and School Fund is represented by a time deposit in the local bank and certain lots of land. The land is not carried in the accounts of the Town at this time. However, an appropriation has been made to be used to survey and establish the boundaries of the lots.

SURPLUS

At the close of the municipal year, the Town had a Net Surplus of \$42,654.14, which balance reflects an increase of \$2,273.34 as a result of the current year's transactions. Of this amount, \$21,895.78 has been earmarked for definite purposes, leaving an Unappropriated Surplus of \$20.758.36.

The items which comprise the Appropriated Surplus are shown on Exhibit D.

GENERAL

The corporate surety bonds furnished by the Treasurer and the Tax Collector were examined and appeared to be adequate.

The Overlay of \$2,068.03 was within the legal limit of 5% of appropriation plus State and County taxes and was transferred to the Incidental Account.

The excise tax receipts for 1947, Nos. 13998 to 14722, and those for 1948, Nos. 21001 to 20803, were added and it was ascertained that the total collected was in agreement with the amount deposited with the Treasurer.

Unexpended balances required by Statute to be carried forward, and unexpended balances on projects not completed have been carried forward to the 1947 municipal year.

The paid bills and pay rolls examined appeared to be reasonable and proper charges.

A net overdraft in the amount of \$5,872.77 has been charged to the Surplus account. The Attorney General has rendered an opinion on this point and it is included for the benefit of the municipal officers.

"The municipal officers are bound by the terms of the articles in the warrant calling the meeting providing for the expenditure of money. The officers should not spend more than the taxpayers appropriated at town meeting, unless the statute expressly authorizes an expenditure in excess of the appropriation."

The provisions of Chapter 84, Section 81 of the Revised Statutes of 1944, however, relate to expenditures of monies for highway purposes and permit overdrafts in case of emergencies to the extent of 15% of the appropriation.

The records of the Town officials were found in a satisfactory condition.
