Herewith submitted is a report of the activities carried on by the Town of Van Buren for the year ending February 28, 1942.

No decision as to the legality of obligations of the Town, incurred previous to and unpaid on August 11, 1937, has, at this time, been rendered by the Supreme Judicial Court in Equity.

On July 7th, the Food Stamp Plan of the Surplus Marketing Administration was inaugurated and the improvement it makes over the previous system of distributing surplus commodities has been appreciated by the producers, distributors and recipients.

The school lunch program as carried on by the joint cooperation of the Works Projects Administration, National Youth Administration, Surplus Marketing Administration and the State Department of Health and Welfare, continues to be very beneficial to the health of the children.

### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To Commissioner Jose, the Board of Selectmen, Superintending School Committee and citizens of the Town of Van Buren:

In accordance with the school laws of Maine, I have the pleasure to herewith submit for your consideration the annual report of the condition and progress of the public schools of Van Buren.

The records of our enrollment for the year ending as of March 1st, show a slight decrease of forty pupils in our elementary and grammar schools, in our high schools thirty-three less than last year. We felt during the summer when it was evident to all of the larger number of our people who were migrating to the industrial centers, that there would be a much greater drop in attendance than actual figures now show.

In the four urban buildings comprising the St. John, Sacred Heart, Champlain and Keegan schools, we have one thousand three hundred and twenty-two pupils pursuing the elementary and grammar grades, forty teachers required to staff these various classrooms, giving an average of thirty-three pupils per teacher and one rural school with ten pupils.

At the Boys' High two resignations were handed me within the last month. I succeeded in filling these places in the persons of Reverend Cyr J. Parent, S. M. and the Reverend Austin Verow S. M. Realizing the critical situation facing us in the years that lie just ahead, relative to a shortage of men teachers, I have been in consultation with the Very Reverend A. M. Cyr S. M. Provincial of the Marist Order, relative to taking over this school and running it as a private academy, the town then contracting with them on a tuition per pupil basis. An

article in the warrant for the forthcoming town meeting has been inserted for your consideration of this proposal.

Our teachers as a whole are doing a commendable job in their individual classrooms. However, the cooperation of parents is absolutely necessary in a follow-up to see whether or not their children are putting into daily use the theory acquired at school. I have instructed all teachers to insist that English shall be spoken in and around the schools, exceptions, of course, being during the teaching of French and religious instruction.

The noon lunch served at St. John, Champlain and Keegan schools has progressed most favorably. Too long have we failed to realize that many children are seriously handicapped because they are suffering from malnutrition. To be undernourished does not necessarily mean that one does not have enough to eat but most often signifies a lack of proper food to supply the requirements of the body. Failure to recognize the school lunch as an essential part of the school program means failure to take advantage of a most important factor in reducing malnutrition. To all who have had a part in promoting this most worthwhile project, the pupils are most deeply grateful.

Another program of the most far reaching importance is that sponsored by the Rotary Club for the procurement of eye glasses for those children whose parents are not financially able to purchase them. Dr. Plourde has only recently completed a thorough examination of all the children in the schools of Van Buren. I trust that when the necessary data is available all parents will make a close follow-up to correct immediately conditions warranting treatment.

A program for out of school youth sponsored by the State Department of Education, has been carried on since the Christmas holidays, three courses, one in electric welding with Emile Baker as instructor, one in electricity with Guy Madore instructing and one in automotive repair by Leon Vaillancourt. Each of these schools has maintained an average attendance of nine for four nights weekly. The sum of \$2,670.10 was forwarded to the treasurer, Mr. Jose, and all vouchers for salaries, heat, light, supplies, etc., are issued from the superintendent's office. Mr. Findlen is entailed with the actual supervision of the work.

Many of the men enrolled in these courses will shortly be serving in various units of the armed forces, where the training they are now receiving will enable them to perform their duty with greater efficiency. I trust that many others eligible for these courses will sign up for them.

May I hasten to advise the parents of the boys and girls attending our schools that every precaution necessary is being taken to ensure the safety of their children for whatever exigency may arise in the days to come.

In closing I wish to express in a special manner the appreciation of the teachers and myself, for the most courteous treatment received from Commissioner Jose, the selectmen and members of the school committee.

#### WARRANT

TO: George Baker, a Constable of the Town of Van Buren in the County of Aroostook and State of Maine.

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Van Buren, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet and assemble at the Gayety Theatre, in said Town of Van Buren on Thursday, March 26th, 1942, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:—

- ART. 1—To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- ART. 2—Tosee if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for General Government.
- ART. 3—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 for Maintenance of Roads, Highways and Winter Roads.
- ART. 4—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$999.00 for the construction of State Aid Highways on locations designated by the State Highway Commission.
- ART. 5—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$317.00 for the maintenance of improved sections of Third Class roads or to be used in construction of Third Class Roads, as designated by the State Highway Commission.

- ART. 6—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$754.50 for State Highway Patrol Maintenance.
- ART. 7—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,050.00 for Police Department Fees.
- ART. 8—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 for Fire Inspection Fees.

- ART. 18—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the Support of Poor.
- ART 19—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for Board at State Institutions.
- ART. 20—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,691.96 for State Mothers' Aid.
- ART. 21—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,200.00 for Dependent Children.
- ART. 22—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,550.00 for W. P. A. materials and supplies to be used in conjunction with Federal funds on work projects.
- ART. 23—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$36,200.00 for Education.
- ART. 24—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for payment of Workmen's Compensation Insurance.

ART. 25—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for Discounts and Abatements.

ART. 26—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Silver Bell Band.

ART. 27—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be set apart in a Sinking Fund to apply on Accounts Payable at such time that is determined by the Board of Emergency Municipal Finance.

ART. 28—To see if the Town will vote to make poll taxes due and payable on May First.

ART. 29—To see if the Town will vote that taxes shall become due and payable on demand, and also to see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of six per cent per annum from date of payment to December 1, 1942, and charge interest at the rate of six per cent per annum from December 1, 1942, to date of payment.

ART. 30—To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to execute and negotiate Town of Van Buren notes for a sum not greater than \$25,000.00 payable during the year within which same are made out of money raised during such current year by taxation, and bearing such rate of interest as said Selectmen and Treasurer may determine, subject to confirmation by the Emergency Municipal Finance Board.

ART. 31—To see if the Town will vote to lease the Van Buren Tennis Club for the ensuing year,

at the rate of \$1.00 per year, part of lots two and four and lots twenty-one and twenty-three on the College tract, so-called, with the exception of the parcel now occupied by a warehouse.

ART 32—To see if the Town will authorize the Town Treasurer, under the direction of the Selectmen, to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes thereon, or otherwise, on such terms as they may deem advisable and to sign and execute quit-claim deeds for such property.

ART. 33—To see if the Town will accept the Municipal Officers' Report as printed.

ART. 34—To transact all other necessary business that may properly come before said meeting.

ART. 35—To see if the inhabitants will vote to discontinue the boy's free high school in the town of Van Buren provided, however, that other suitable arrangements be made for the secondary education of such boys.

ART. 36—To see if the inhabitants will authorize its superintending school committee to contract with and pay the trustees of Van Buren college to furnish standard class A secondary education for any male student in the town of Van Buren who have satisfactorialy passed an examination in common school branche's in accordance with chapter 19 section 91 of the revised statutes of 1930.

The selectmen will be in session at the Town Office of Van Buren on the 25th day of March, from ten o'clock in the forenoon to five o'clock in the afternoon, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
