Intermediate School.

Owing to the large attendance in this school, an assistant was necessary, and Miss Bessie Woodward was employed. From this time two teachers will be needed in this room.

Grammar School.

Owing to Miss Rumery's illness it became necessary to supply a substitute

and Bennet H. Quinn Bates '99 was selected for the position. Mr. Quinn had no trouble in carrying on the work, which was well arranged. Miss Rumery will return to the school again at the commencement of the Spring term.

### High School.

We were very fortunate in securing the services of M. C. Merrill, Bates '99, as Principal of this school, with the able and faithful assistance of Miss Geary, good work is being done.

### Mills School.

The present arrangement in this school is unsatisfactory. There being but two terms in the grammar grade, leaves a goodly number of pupils from this grade to mix in with primary scholars during the fall term. This gives entirely too much work for one teacher. I would advise that a competent teacher be employed for the entire year, to take charge of the Grammar grade. These remarks and suggestions apply to the school at So. Lubec also.

The work in general for the year, has been above the average, but much improvement is still needed. However I have said so much about the public schools of this town and been able to accomplish so little, I do not propose to thrash the old straw any longer.
