WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

Androscoggin, ss.

State of Maine

To L. C. Mendall, Constable of Greene in said County,
Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Greene qualified by law to vote in Town affairs to assemble at the Town House in said Town on the 11th day of March, 1929, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles to wit:

- Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of the Town Officers.
- Art. 3. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 4. To see if the Town will choose one or more Road Commissioners.
- Art. 5. To see if the Town will grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance and support of schools, current expenses and cost of poor, repairs of roads and bridges and defray all other town charges for the year ensuing, including the snow bills for the past year.
- Art. 6. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise to pay for High School tuition for the ensuing year.
 - Art. 7. To see what sum of money the Town will

grant and raise for the salary of the Superintendent of Schools for the ensuing year.

- Art. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for a Grammar School graduation.
- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for the repairs of Schoolhouses.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for text books and supplies.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to continue the Hill School for the ensuing year.
- Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25 of the Public Laws of 1916.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$533.00 for the improvement of the Section of State Aid Road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges; the above amount being the maximum which the Town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Section 18, chapter 25 of the Public Laws of 1916.
- Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise money and what sum for the maintenance of State and State Aid Highways within the limits of the Town, under the provisions of Sections 9 and 18 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for maintenance of Third Class Road.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for cutting bushes on the State, State Aid and Third Class Road.

- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$80.00 for the maintenance of the Special Resolve Road built in 1928, as required by law.
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise to gravel a section of College Road extending from Lewiston Line toward Green Depot.
- Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Town Way as laid out by the Selectmen on Feb. 20 and described as follows: being substantially as now laid out and used extending from the highway leading past and near the former residence of F. T. Hill and extending to the residence of the heirs of William A. Chadbourn, the same to be three rods in width.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise to repair the Private Way over the John Gray Hill.
- Art. 21. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise to repair the bridge on the Line Road east of C. A. Austin's residence.
- Art. 22. To see if the Town will grant and raise the sum of \$1,000.00 to repair the road from the Wales Line to the Thompson Bridge so-called.
- Art. 23. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise to repair Meadow Hill.
- Art. 24. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for cutting bushes on the Town Roads.
- Art. 25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to pay a man, and a man and team per day for labor on the road, also compensation for all Town Officials.
- Art. 26. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise to pay on debt and interest for the ensuing year.

- Art. 27. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for Memorial Day for the ensuing year.
- Art. 28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer to make a temporary loan.
- Art. 29. To see if the Town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$120.00 for the maintenance of Street Lights for the ensuing year.
- Art. 30. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise to be expended and used for advertising the resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.
- Art. 31. To see if the Town will vote to accept One Hundred Dollars as a Trust Fund for the care of the Silas Harris lot in Greenwood Cemetery.
- Art. 32. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise to repair the fence in Greenwood Cemetery.
- Art. 33. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise to fence the Morse, Fogg and North Greene Cemeteries.
- Art. 34. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise to finish the Greene Corner Schoolhouse repair work.
- Art. 35. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the services of a County public health nurse working under the supervision of the Maine Public Health Association.
- Art. 36. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise to aid in controlling the White Pine Blister Rust in Greene.
- Art. 37. To see what action the Town will take on any business which may legally come before the meeting

and to see what sums of money the Town will grant and raise for the same.

Art. 38. To see if the Town will accept the list of Jurors as prepared by the Selectmen, Clerk and Treasurer.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising the voting list, at the Town House at nine o'clock in the forenoon of the day of said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Committee and Citizens of the Town of Greene:

I wish to submit for your consideration my third annual public report of the conditions of your school system.

This year has witnessed the adoption of a new system of reading. Excellent results are being obtained and as the teachers become more familiar with the new method we have every reason to believe that our reading problem will be lessened.

Our teachers are at the present time working on several new texts in an endeavor to find the one most suited to our needs. In the adoption of a new book I believe that the advice of the teacher who uses the book, should to some extent, govern the selection. These reviews will be completed by the spring term and selection made at that time. This does not call for any additional appropriation for the amounts usually set aside for replacement will furnish the new books.

The general character of the work done in all the schools this year has been excellent. Never before have all the schools been kept in a more sanitary condition.

The repair work this past summer consisted of the general cleaning and minor repairs always found necessary at the close of school. Besides this the windows were changed at the Morse school and the room papered, painted and whitened. This room is now very neat and attractive.

This coming year besides the usual general repairs

we hope to paint at least two of our schoolhouses outside. New floors should be laid in the entries at the Mountain and the Morse school, the front sill should be repaired at the Mountain and the sink spout made more sanitary at the Morse.

The health work consisted of an examination by Doctor Crites and a notification to the parents. Much good has resulted from this work. As soon as suitable plans can be devised I hope to have some follow up work which ought to improve conditions.

Our music this year was in the hands of Mrs. Ruby Briggs of Mechanic Falls, I inclose her report here:

REPORT OF MUSIC SUPERVISOR

To the Superintendent of Schools:

It is with pleasure that I submit my second annual report to the citizens of Leeds and Greene.

In regard to the good will that exists between teachers, pupils and music teacher, I can only repeat what I said last year, all has been very pleasant. This year I have laid out work for the teachers, to be undertaken, during the winter months when it is impossible for me to make my visits.

We put on an Operatta entitled, "Aunt Druscilla's Garden", at the Children's day at Leeds and this gave me a good opportunity to develop some individual voices as it carried a large cast. I intend to use the same thing at Greene for Children's day.

Quite a bit has been done with two-part work this year and I hope to demonstrate some of this at graduation.

There are surely some splendid voices even among the tiniest tots who have just started in school this fall.

It was with regret that I closed my duties this fall for knowing the teachers and pupils still better a warm friendship has sprung up among us all which I think is very essential if we study music together.

A great teacher once told me, "You are building for

eternity when you teach boys and girls to sing." I firmly believe it.

In closing I wish to thank parents, pupils, school boards, teachers and superintendent for the hearty co-operation received.
