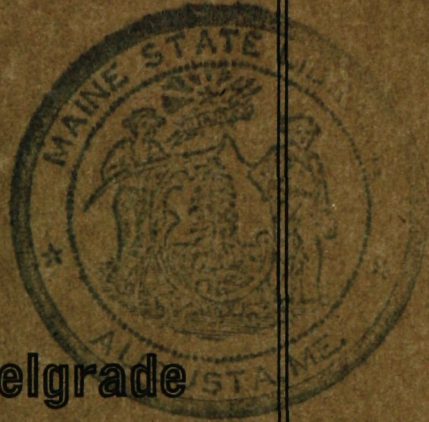

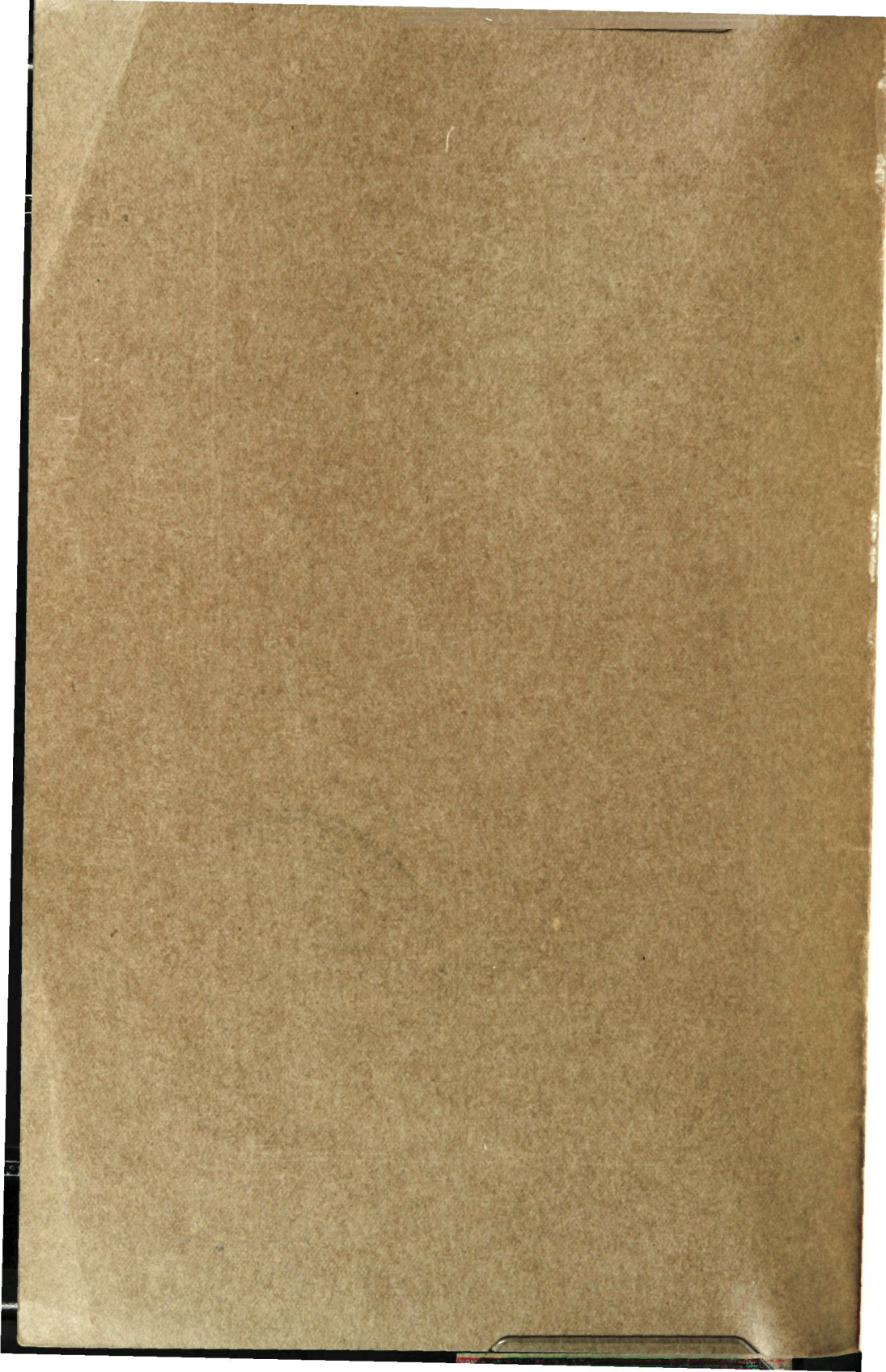

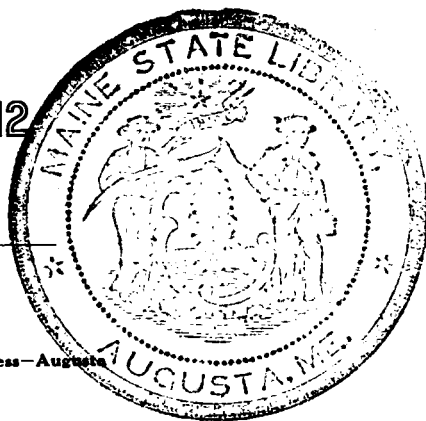

Warrant

To Guy A. Yeaton, Constable of the town of Belgrade.

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Belgrade qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at Grange Hall in said town, on Monday the fourth day of March A. D. 1912, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

First—To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Second—To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Third—To see if the town will vote to have one or more Road Commissioners.

Fourth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the support of schools for the ensuing year.

Fifth—To see if the town will vote yes or no upon the adoption of the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907 as amended by Chapter 69 Public Laws of 1909, relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to State aid for Highways for 1912.

Sixth—To see if the town will raise and appropriate in addition to the amounts regularly raised and appropriated for care of ways, highways and bridges, the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) being the maximum amount which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907, as amended by Chapter 69 Public Laws of 1909.

Seventh—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the snow bills of the winter of 1911 and 1912.

Eighth—To see if the town will make a special appropriation of six hundred dollars (\$600.00), to be expended on the West road from the house of Sidney Austin to the bridge over the stream at Belgrade Lakes.

Ninth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the support of roads and bridges for the ensuing year.

Tenth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for repairs of schoolhouses.

Eleventh—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the purchase of school books for the ensuing year.

Twelfth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Thirteenth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for support of Free High School for the ensuing year.

Fourteenth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the purchase of Free High School books.

Fifteenth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the observance of Memorial Day.

Sixteenth—To choose one member of the Cemetery Committee.

Seventeenth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for Cemetery purposes.

Eighteenth—To see what action the town will take in regard to establishing a water plant at the Cemetery.

Nineteenth—To see if the town will vote to accept one hundred and twenty dollars (\$120.00) from Mrs. John O. Knox, one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to be held in trust the income to be expended upon the Knox family lot in Pine Grove Cemetery, the remaining twenty dollars (\$20.00) to be used for grading said lot, cleaning head-

stones and doing whatever work is necessary to put the lot in good condition.

Twentieth—To see if the town will vote to accept a bequest of one hundred dollars (\$100.00), from the estate of the late R. R. Stuart to be held in trust, the income of which shall be used by said town in caring for the R. R. Stuart lot in Woodside Cemetery.

Twenty-first—To see if the town will vote to accept the road at Belgrade Lakes from Bridges right of way to the South line of land of Everett A Cummings as laid out by the Selectmen.

Twenty-second—To see if the town will vote to allow the piazza of the Messalonskee Hotel extended out over the street a distance not exceeding eight feet.

Twenty-third—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire money for the use of the town if necessary.

Twenty-fourth—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the school-house near Samuel Frost's also the one on the North side of Bickford Hill.

Twenty-fifth—To see if the town will vote to grant and raise one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for the purchase of a complete set of weights and measures as required by law.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at Grange Hall, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, on the day of said meeting.
