

REPORT OF THE

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Cranberry Isles:

I have the honor to submit for your consideration my seventh annual report of the schools of Cranberry Isles.

Common Schools.

The same corps of teachers was employed this year. I believe we were very fortunate in being able to retain these teachers this year. The pupils are progressing in a very satisfactory manner, good attendance, no unnecessary tardy marks and, up to date, not a complaint has been made to the office regarding our schools. I believe this to be a remarkable record.

Everything necessary has been supplied the pupils. The schools have been cleaned, sanitary conditions attended to, and all necessary repairs made.

Following is the number of pupils in each grade:

Grade 1—0 boys, 4 girls.

2-4 boys, 6 girls.

3—5 boys, 3 girls.

4—1 boy, 0 girls.

5—3 boys, 2 girls.

6—6 boys, 3 girls.

7—3 boys, 5 girls.

8—5 boys, 1 girl.

Total, 27 boys and 24 girls, or 51 pupils attending the common schools. The census shows 126 pupils drawing school money.

Our high school tuition is now getting to be quite a

problem. There are now about thirteen students attending some high school at a cost of about \$1,000. You can readily see that it will be necessary to raise more money for high school tuition. The report of the work done by these students is, on the whole, very satisfactory, showing that they must have had good training in the grades.

In closing, I wish to thank the citizens for the courteous treatment accorded me during the year.

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Cranberry Isles, qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet at the town hall, Great Cranberry Island, in said town, on Monday, the second day of March, A. - 10 To choose constables for the ensuing year.
- 11 To choose surveyor of lumber and measurer of wood and bark for the ensuing year.
- 12 To choose by ballot road commissioners for the ensuing year.
- 13 To see what action the town will take on a petition of Samuel C. Sanford, to give him the right of way from his house to the main highway or move his house from the present location to his lot of land near the Preble House (so-called) or act thereon.
- 14 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to cover the overdraw and any additional expense on new fire pump house.

- 15 To see if the town will vote to change the date of holding future annual town meetings and act thereon.
- 16 To see if the town will vote and authorize the assessors to go around and look over taxable property.
- 17 To see if the town will vote to hold the next annual town meeting at Neighborhood House, Little Cranberry Island.
- 18 To see what sum of money shall be raised for necessary town charges.
- 19 To see what sum of money shall be raised for the support of the poor.
- 20 To see what sum of money shall be raised for highways on the different islands.
- 21 To see what sum of money shall be raised for repairs of school property.
- 22 To see what sum of money shall be raised for appliances, apparatus and insurance.
- 23 To see what sum of money shall be raised for free text-books.
- 24 To see what sum of money shall be raised to pay tuition of scholars attending secondary schools out of town.
- 25 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for fuel for its common schools, or act thereon.
- 26 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for janitors for its common schools, or act thereon.
- 27 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the common schools.
- 28 To see if the town will vote to contract with superintending school committee of S. W. Harbor to educate its high school scholars at the S. W. Harbor high school for the sum of \$600 per year irrespective of number.
- 29 To see if the town will pay the tuition of seniors the ensuing year who are attending other schools than S. W. Harbor high school, in view of the passage of article No. 28.
- 30 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$200 for high school tuition.
- 31. To see if the town will vote to pay not more than \$60 per pupil per year for high school tuition.
- 32 To see if the town will vote and authorize the superintending school committee to employ a school physician, according to chapter 73 of the public laws of 1919.

- 33 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to employ a school physician.
- 34 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs and maintenance of public wharf and float, Great Cranberry Island.
- 35 To see if the town will vote to appoint a caretaker of public wharf, and act thereon.
- 36 To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State-aid, as provided in section 20 of chapter 120 of the public laws of 1913.
- 37 To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$533 for the improvement of the State road, the section as outlined in the report of the State highway commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of section 19 of chapter 130 of the public laws of 1913.
- 38 To see if the town will vote to elect a fire warden in accordance with the requirements of chapter 108 of the public laws of 1913.
- 39 To choose by ballot a town auditor for the ensuing year.
- 40 To see if the town will vote and authorize the selectmen to make a temporary loan in anticipation of taxes for the year 1925.
- 41 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$245 for superintendent of schools' wages.
- 42 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
- 43 To vote pay of moderator for his services.

Hereof fail not, and have you there and then this warrant, with your doings thereon.
