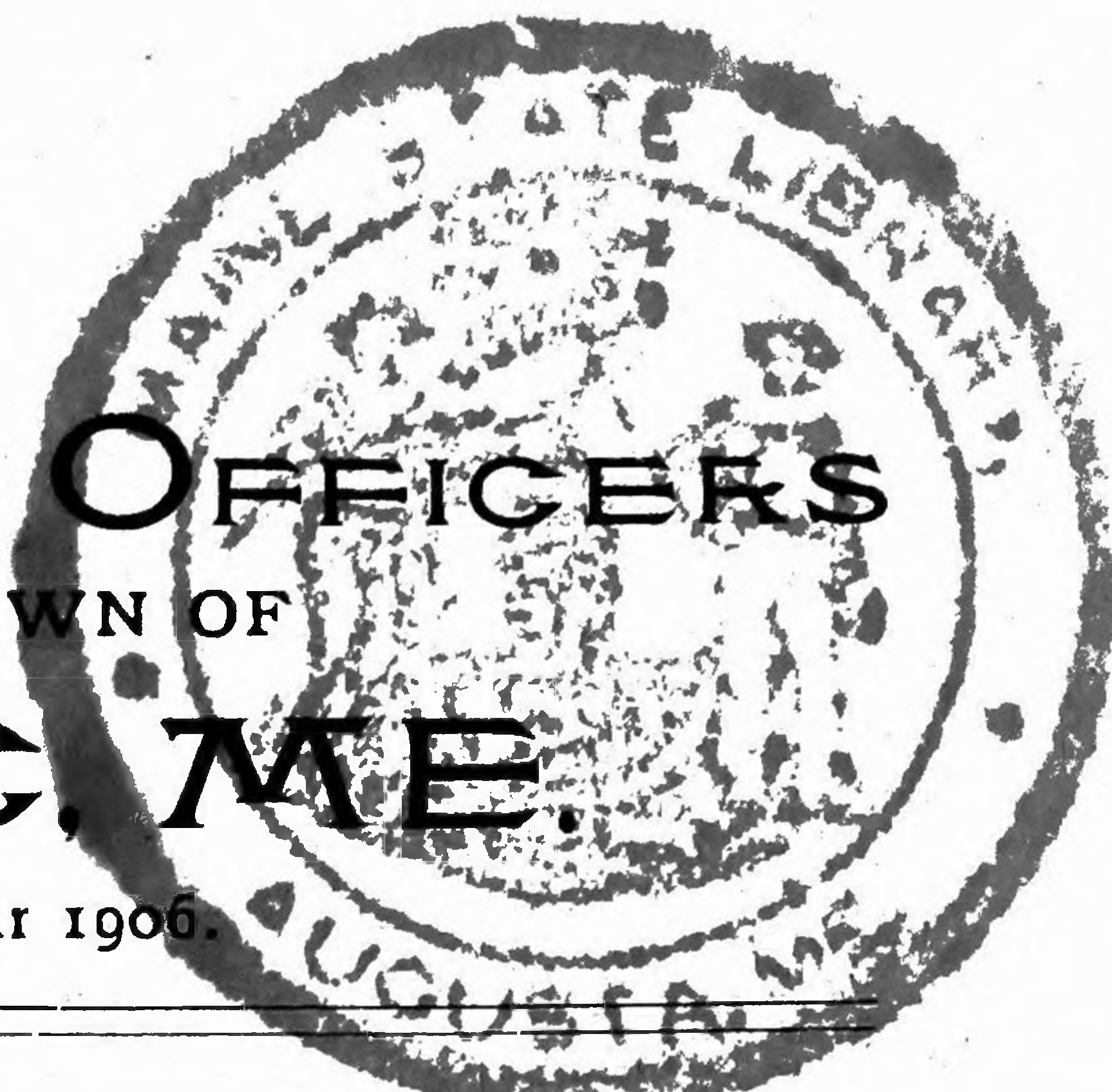

Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the Honorable Chairman and Members of the School Committee of the Town of Lubec,

Gentlemen:—As required by law, I herewith submit to you my second annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

As you are well aware, great difficulty was experienced in securing competent teachers, especially for the rural schools. The vacancies thus existing, however, were filled in a most satisfactory manner, though some of the schools were not opened on the dates set. I believe the town has had the services for the past year, of as able and energetic a corps of teachers as any town in the state.

Discipline is good in all the schools, and the pupils are making good progress.

According to the school census there were in the town of Lubec on April 1, 1906, 1134 persons between the ages of 5 and 21. This is a slight falling off from last year, but in spite of this fact, the school attendance has been larger than ever before. Very little truancy has been reported, and the few cases which have come up, have been quickly settled.

During the year two new schools have been opened, pursuant to the vote of the town last March; one in the Denbow district, so called, the other in the northern half of lower Columbian Hall. Grade IV was taken from the Intermediate school and placed in the new room, thus relieving the crowded condition of the former school. In the new room there has been an average attendance of 44, and in the Denbow district an average of 10.

Grade I, in the southern half of Columbian Hall, is overcrowded. There are seats for 50, and there is a registered attendance of 72, with an average attendance of 51. Early in the year it was found necessary to engage an assistant in this school, in order that the pupils might be properly fitted to enter Grade II next fall. Something should be done to relieve this congestion, as these little ones cannot stand crowding, even as well as the older pupils.

The system of plumbing installed in the High school building is a great improvement, and is working well. Its good effect upon the health of the pupils, as well as its sanitary value, can hardly be overestimated.

The school houses in No. 2 East, No. 5 East and No. 5 West have been thoroughly repaired. While these repairs have considerably overdrawn the appropriation, they were sorely needed, and it has been the policy of the committee to complete the needed repairs in such a manner that very little will need to be done for several years to come. In District No. 2 East, it was found necessary to largely reconstruct the old building, as it was entirely unfit for occupancy.

During the year, music has been taught in the schools of the village, without expense to the town, as the pupils have contributed the necessary funds to pay the teacher, Miss Nellie Allen. The willingness with which these contributions have been made speaks volumes for the interest of both parents and pupils.

School Improvement Leagues have been established in many of the rural schools and it is expected that the spring term will find an active League in every district. In the schools where Leagues are in

existence there has been a marked increase of interest in the school work and in the care of school property. All the leagues are planning to improve the school grounds by setting out trees and plants, building gravel walks, lawns, etc. This spirit is most commendable, and should be encouraged by parents and school officials.

For the ensuing year I would make the following recommendations:

REPAIRS

I would recommend that the buildings at No. 3 South, No. 3 North, No. 4 North, No 6 West and No. 9, South Lubec, be thoroughly repaired during the coming summer. No very extensive repairs are needed, but there are many minor improvements that should be made. When these buildings are attended to all the school buildings in town will be in good condition. I would suggest that a sum sufficient to repair these buildings be raised in addition to the usual amount for repairing and cleaning.

TEXT-BOOKS

The text-books now in use are in fair condition, but the appropriation is not sufficient to put them in first-class condition. I would recommend that the present texts in English and in Physiology be replaced by more teachable books; also that \$600 be raised for books this year. When it is considered that there are nearly 1200 pupils in town, \$600 is not a large sum—only about 50 cents to a pupil.

I would recommend that a course in Mental Arithmetic be introduced for Grades VIII and IX.

A point on which I ask the careful consideration of the voters of Lubec is that if we are to maintain our present efficient service in our schools, it will be necessary to raise \$3700 for common school purposes. It must be remembered that we have two more schools to support—which means two more teachers, besides increased expenditure for fuel, janitors, etc. With the appropriation of \$3200, instead of the \$3500 asked for last spring, we have not been able to meet all the expenses of 34 weeks of school, there being nearly \$200 in outstanding bills. Either there must be more money raised, or the school year cut down. This would be disastrous, as it requires steady application and hard work to properly fit pupils for advancement in 34 weeks.

I would recommend that the School Committee, in future meet once a month, and that all school bills be paid monthly, instead of allowing them to accumulate until the end of the term or year.

In closing, I wish to express my sincere thanks to you, gentlemen of the Committee, for your aid and your hearty, never-failing support; to the people of Lubec for their courteous treatment, and to the teachers for their co-operation.

Your attention is called to the financial statement appended to this report.

It was not at first intended to construct a concrete sidewalk on Main street, but when Mrs. C. J. Staples offered to contribute \$100 in consideration that such a walk should be constructed to Water street, it was felt that the town could ill afford to refuse such a liberal proposition, with the result that we now have a good concrete walk from Tucker's corner to Water street. The number of square yards built was 533, at a cost of a fraction over 68c per square yard. Of the total cost, \$140 was contributed. If others would take the same interest, concrete would soon replace the old plank walks throughout our village—a long stride in the interest of economy.
