To the Board of Directors, Parsons Memorial Library:

Gentlemen:—The ninth annual report of Parsons Memorial Library, being the report for the year ending March 1, 1913, is presented for your consideration.

Volumes in the library March 1, 1912, 5,609.

We wish to acknowledge the gift of a copy of "The Hamiltons of Waterborough," presented by Samuel K. Hamilton; "The Life of Marcus Alonzo Hanna," from Joseph Parsons, and a fine set of the "National Cyclopaedia of American Biography," presented by William and Charles Parsons, in memory of their father, the late Rev. John Parsons.

We are also very fortunate to receive from Mrs. Willoughby Goodwin, of this town, a bound volume of "The Columbian Star," a newspaper published in Alfred in 1824-1825. It is in a good state of preservation and is an addition of great value to the library.

"The History of Kennebunk," by Daniel Remick, presented by Mrs. Remick, and "Rememiscences of the War of the Rebellion," by Copp, presented by Jonathan Plummer, are valuable additions to our local history and our knowledge of the war.

We have added two new magazines, "The Woman's Home Companion," and "The American" to those already taken, making eighteen in all. All of these, except the latest numbers, are loaned for seven days.

We also continue to receive the "Sanford Tribune," through the courtesy of the editors.

Among the many valuable books added during the year, we would call attention to a few that are of especial interest: "Cary's Manual of Northern Woodmen" gives the exact method of measuring timber and wood, and a general knowledge of surveying; "The Referendum in America," "The Old China and Old Furniture Book," "The Land We Live In," "A Boy's Book of Conservation," "New England," "What It Is and What It Is To Be," and several volumes on Music and Musicians, are all books of valuable information along their various lines.

"The Book of Knowledge," which is a set of twenty volumes, is really a children's encyclopaedia containing information on everything that would be of interest to children, arranged in a very attractive manner, with numerous illustrations and interspersed with stories and poems of well known authors.

There have been no great changes in the work of the library during the past year. The number of books loaned has increased somewhat and the magazines, especially those devoted to scientific matters and topics of the day, have been used more than formerly, while the High School pupils are beginning to value the worth of the library more highly.

When we remember that our book fund is much larger than that of many towns greatly exceeding ours in population and wealth, we appreciate more than ever the generosity of the donors and desire that all the townspeople shall make the greatest possible use of the privileges offered them.

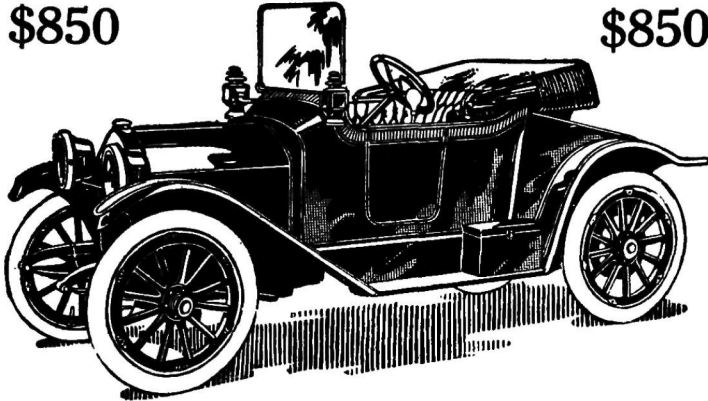

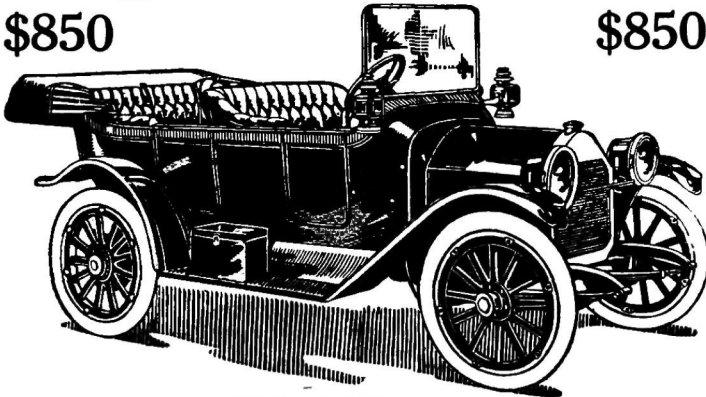
