Mayor's Address

TO THE CITY COUNCIL:

Once more we are assembled and ready to begin another year's work in the interests of our city. During the past year we have been subjected to one of the severest calamities in the form of a conflagration that could come to a community such as ours.

Following this fire, and almost before the smoke cleared, the citizens responded to the call for funds in a manner more generous than has ever been done in a like situation in any other city on this continent; at the same time, from all parts of the city the idea was expressed that now would be the time to make improvements that would be for the future good of the city.

After taking up this matter and discussing it, certain improvements were decided upon by the city council, after consulting the people face to face in mass meetings called and held for this purpose.

Certain of these improvements have already been accomplished in part, and I will recommend to your serious consideration from time to time the prosecution of this work, within the limits of our ability, without adding to the burden of the people in the way of taxation.

MAYOR'S ADDRESS

HIGH SCHOOL

The schools of our city should be, and are, our greatest pride. No other asset of the city's can anywhere near equal that of our schools. Our High School building must be built. I have contended, and now contend, that the only building worth considering, is the building, that when finished, will be complete and sufficient for the full needs of a modern High School. This is essential for our progress; it is essential for our children, and it is better to put two years in building a proper High School than to get one in less time, that will never be what we want.

GRADED SCHOOLS

The standing and scholarship in these schools must be maintained, and the high efficiency of our splendid corp of teachers must be increased rather than diminished, and to this end you should see to it that the very best men possible are placed on the school board, when vacancies occur.

WATER WORKS

No more important department exists within your city than the department of Water Works. At the present time the water from your Municipal plant, according to a recent analysis is as near perfection for drinking as it is possible to get a water from any source. During the past year considerable work has been done, as you will see by reference to a report of the Superintendent, including the setting of two new wheels, which give an increase of 'power. The health of the community depends upon the purity of this water, and it is your duty to see to it that men are elected to fill vacancies on the water board, who will be painstaking, broad minded, and willing to investigate and work.

CITY FARM AND ITS CONNECTIONS

Shortly after my election a year ago, several people came to my office, at different times, to inquire why our City farm could not be made to pay. This question I could not at that time answer, but in going over the matter I find you have right around one hundred twenty-five acres of tillage, hay and pasture land. A capable, intelligent man and woman could go upon a farm of this description, and bring up a family of six or eight children, educate them and live comfortably, but would not be able to do much more than that. Now, when you increase this family up to seventy or seventy-five you can readily understand that the extra number of children is a greater burden than the farm can possibly be made to care for. A remedy for this is to secure at the earliest possible moment more land.

Twenty or thirty years ago in Maine farming was called more or less of a fool proposition, but today the results of farming are just as sure, and the profits just as well defined from year to year, as the profits of any other kind of business. On the subject of farming and its environment I will very soon give you a special communication embodying my idea, and the idea of the superintendent of the farm, as to the practicability and the possibility of increasing your acreage.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Upon the efficiency of this department depends the safety of the property and in a large measure the lives of our people.

MAYOR'S ADDRESS

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That it is more efficient today than it has ever been before, so far as the number of men and equipment can make it efficient, goes without saying. I recommend to the committee on fire and to the city council, the importance of keeping this department in proper shape.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

The police department is, as you all know, a very important department. It is maintained for a purpose, and not for sentiment; consequently, every man in it should be up to the standard physically, and be able to do his stunt to the credit of his department and to the satisfaction of the people. No man should be retained on the Police Force who is physically weak or otherwise inefficient. This is absolutely necessary to my mind, in order to secure proper results in this department.

ELECTRICAL DEPARTMENT

The man who heads this department, as superintendent, should be a man, not only practically skilled, but should also be technically educated. This department is becoming more and more important each year, as we realize that the comfort of the people, as well as their safety depends largely upon the perfection of our lights, and the constancy with which they are mantained.

STREETS AND SEWERS

We are laying out a great deal of money annually, upon our streets and sidewalks, and the impression is, as I hear it expressed, that the street system, as a whole, is not being improved from year to year. This should not be so, as some permanent

work should be accomplished each season. Everything pertaining to our streets should be in the hands of a trained man, and by trained man I mean, a man trained practically, and educated technically, and I recommend to your serious consideration that early steps be taken to put the street department and the sewer department under such a guiding hand, and that the two departments be joined as one.

By this statement I do not mean any reflection upon the present heads of these departments, but the city council, has had in the last year a splendid example of what a practical technical man can do in a department; I refer to the superintendent of the City Farm and Alms House, and I commend to you for your consideration the good that can come to the people by the appointment of proper men, regardless of political affiliations.

THEATRES

The question of amusements has become a very interesting one to the people of all cities and towns in this country. The moving picture show has become so much in evidence, and is such a factor to be reckoned with in developing the minds of our children either for good or for evil, that I recommend to your early consideration a thorough investigation of this subject, and hope to see you pass, at an early date, an ordinance prohibiting the presence of children under fifteen years of age at these theatres, unless attended by parents or guardians.

CITY CHARTER

So many years have passed since your city charter was granted by the legislature, and so many amendments have been made

to it, that it is hard to follow, and in addition to this, conditions have changed so materially, that I deem it to be among your first duties to order the preparation of a new city charter, that can be presented for enactment to the next legislature, in order to make more comprehensive the duties of your city officers.

COMMITTEE WORK

When you have accepted a place in this City Council you have assumed to act as Trustee of a very considerable amount of property. You have a great and serious duty to perform, and upon the committee to which you will belong will devolve a duty, if you attend to it properly, of tireless energy and integrity. A very large percentage of all legislative work is necessarily accomplished in the committee room, and I want to impress upon you, Gentlemen, as much as I am possibly, able, the importance of attending every session of your committee, and looking closely after the business of the people which, as their trustee, you have sworn to do faithfully. No man has a right morally, to accept a place upon a committee and then refuse, or neglect to attend the meetings of that committee and to do his rightful share of the city's work. Amongst the important legislation of the coming year is the settlement to be undertaken between the people and the Bangor Street Railway interests. This has been well started in the report of the Public Utilities Committee of the last City Council recently published and now on file and accessible to you. The importance of the appointment of the Public Utilities committee cannot be overestimated and the men who receive appoinment on that committee should be willing to devote time, patience and serious thought to the problems which will confront them.

PURCHASING AGENT

The city council of 1910 had before it a proposition to create a purchasing agency which, for various reasons, did not meet with approval. I heartily recommend for your consideration an amendment to your by-laws, creating an additional joint standing committee on supplies, whose duty it shall be to carefully investigate the purchases made in all departments. This, I believe to be a step in the right direction, and I think you will see the necessity of such a committee, as clearly as we now all see the value of the committee on Public Utilities.

TAXATION

The committee on taxation should not be a committee in name only. While this committee may possibly not have any legal right to interfere as to the taxable property in the city or the valuation of the same, yet it is clearly within your rights and absolutely the duty of the committee on taxation, representing the city council, to investigate and bring into the public limelight all cases of error as to unjust taxation, represented either by over valuation or under valuation, and in the interests of the people of Bangor it is your duty as a Committee, and privilege as members of this Council to bring to the attention of the assessors any discrimination between prices of property in the city, looking always to a just and right equalization of tax values. Your friendship for any man or your prejudice against any man must not be allowed to stand against absolutely fair and just rendering of your opinion in relation to these matters.

MAYOR'S ADDRESS

BREWER BRIDGE

The work of replacing two large spans of this bridge has finally been accomplished and the result is very satisfactory. The engineers went to the very bottom of the river and put an outer coating of concrete outside of the old piers up to a point above high water mark. Above high water mark the old piers were carefully pointed, all cavities being refilled in the best possible manner, directly under the superintendency of Mr. E. E. Greenwood, C. E., of Skowhegan, Maine, whose well known reputation as an engineer, places the work above criticism, both as to the substructure and the superstructure. Mr. Greenwood's entire time was made necessary in relation to this work, on account of a sudden and severe illness, which overtook Mr. Coombs, our City Engineer.

PUBLIC BUILDINGS

The value of our public buildings makes the work of the committee, in whose charge they are placed, particularly interesting. During the last year a large amount of absolutely necessary work was done in order to prevent your buildings from depreciating in value. To my mind it is very poor economy to let a building go without repairs until it is so far gone that it has to be practically rebuilt. To this end I ask you to study carefully the needs of your buildings, keeping in mind always the fact that we must keep sharply within our capacity.

IN GENERAL

I commend to you and ask you, as members of the City Council, to read carefully the reports of the heads of departments, and make a close study of such reports, to the end that we may be able to work together intelligently, and for the good of the whole people.

Finally, I invite your criticism of any act or acts of mine that may seem to you to be wrong, or any suggestion of mine that may seem to you likely to carry us beyond our financial ability. And I ask your hearty co-operation in all matters and things pertaining to the interests of the city, regardless of politics or politicians, in order that, working together, we may achieve the best result, which makes for your good, and for my good, and the good of all the people.
