South Franklin County Tuberculosis and Health Association

To the citizens of the Town of Carthage, the following report for 1958 is respectfully submitted.

The basic program of the National Tuberculosis Program and its affiliates is Health Education, Prevention and Control of Tuberculosis and Rehabilitation. The South Franklin County Tuberculosis Association has included in its program a generalized Public Health Nursing Service.

We must understand what Public Health is to appreciate what the aims and duties of a Public Health Nurse is. Public Health is, to quote the accepted authority, "an art and a science to prevent illness and disability; prolong life; promote optimum physical, emotional and social well being and is accomplished through community efforts."

The Public Health Nurse is only one member of a team within the community who strives to promote health by anticipatory guidance, nutrition, mental health, pre-natal and infant care, to mention some areas; she strives toward specific prevention, either mass or simple, such as immunizations or chloridation; the nurse may guide toward early diagnosis and treatment; is ready to assist in limiting disability and directs towards rehabilitation.

Thirteen visits were made in Carthage pertaining to adult health supervision; 7 visits concerning maternity; crippled children visits 17; infant and pre-school 30.

As the school health program changes and expands, it demands more interest from those involved. Thirty-nine home visits were made to discuss various school health problems with parents. The school personnel cooperated in all ways and conferences with them were held at intervals. Audiometer hearing tests are scheduled for the near future.

I was fortunate in securing the loan of the latest, most accurate eye screening testing instrument to be used in the school to test the eyes of those students referred by their teacher. Might I explain this is not a test to determine whether or not a child needs glasses but only to advise the parents that if the test is failed, it is advisable to have a more thorough examination by their family eye doctor. Fourteen students were tested by this instrument; nine students failed the test and three were noted worthy of observation in the future.

Head inspection was done at intervals as necessary as was inspection of any skin disorders that the teachers had a question of communicability, when schedule allowed.

Physical examinations of 41 students was accomplished and the results proved that continuing of same should result in a healthier and happier school and home environment.

Immunization Clinics were held in the spring and parents show a great deal of interest. May I stress the importance and that we should not become lackadaisical in their administration. With International travel as it is today, and with many cases of dreaded and yet protectable disease being reported in other countries — who knows! The combined series of Diphtheria, Tetanus and Whooping Cough were given to 66 children; 48 vaccinations (some repeats) and a total of 93, 1st, 2nd and 3rd poliomyelitis vaccines were given.

Twenty eight adults were given the polio vaccine, which was a continuance of the program started last year and probably will be the last offered to the public on a clinic basis.

It is team work and interest that stimulates any program. May your health program continue and may those who have assisted and supported the program accept my thanks and appreciation.
